Dear Mr. Hoffman:

At your request, an on-site inspection was made on May 21, 1984 to determine if an area in the lower level of your building could be used for a dark room. The area can be used if provided with proper solid core wood door installed on the corridor side and ceiling repaired. The exit to the south is no longer a required exit.

Also noted was a storage area that has been installed under the main stairs. This must meet a one-hour construction requirement as per Section 5.665(4).

Item 2 of the December 6, 1982 Inspection has been complied with for correction of the interior fnish. Noted is a pulling away from the walls of floors, some buckling and general weakness also. Doors and jambs are out of plumb along with some exterior wall deterioration at the upper level outside on the 1923 Section.

It would be advisable to have a structural engineer evaluate this section before any measureable renovations are undertaken or considered.
