President Bowman welcomed visitors and asked for concerns during Open Forum. Don Flater asked about people having to pay \$2.00 per child to get into last Saturday's Tiger Wrestling Invitational. Asked if this was the regular fee or a special fee for the event. Superintendent will look into.

From the October Staff Bulletin:

Credit for lane movement

a. Credit for Lane Movement: The BA+15 requirement allows up to 6 hours of undergraduate credits to apply. Participation in several Heartland AEA courses has been encouraged by the District. For these courses, recertification credits may count within the 6 hour limit of undergraduate credit. Undergraduate and re-certification credits should be approved prior to enrollment to be sure they will qualify.

Staff Reduction Procedure change b. Staff Reduction Procedure: Rather than assign point value to the evaluation areas, the entire evaluation instrument will be considered including written comments and past performance. If the evaluations are relatively equal, the decision would be based on seniority.

From the November Staff Bulletin:

Temporary Leave

Temporary Leave: Teachers may use time (2 hours or less with Principal's approval) before or after school or during free time. When necessary, the Principal or other teachers may be able to cover. If a substitute is needed, the leave would be considered as personal business.

Inclement Weather Procedures

New Inclement Weather Procedures for 1983-84: Activities will be governed by the following guidelines:

Early Dismissal: All after-school activities and practice are cancelled unless approved by the Principal.

Cancellation: Activity Directors may hold practice when the weather clears, but NO student shall be required to attend.
