Supt. recommended issuing continuing contracts as presented. to issue certified contracts for 1984-85 as presented by the Superintendent and approve an administrative salary package increase of 3.8% with a total package cost of 4.1% was made by Bruce, seconded by Henderson. Bruce-aye; Henderson-aye; Daly-aye; Burgus-aye; and Bowman-aye. Carried.

Non-certified salary increase

Supt. discussed non-certified salary increases. Stated he would work within schedule unless out of line with other schools. He recommended an increase of 4.56-5% with authority to adjust individual contracts as deemed appropriate. Concensus of the Board was that the Supt. could go up to 5% with classified personnel(non-certified).

Salary for temp. kdg. aide

Discussed salary for temporary kindergarten aide. Motion to pay kindergarten aide \$4.25/hour was made by Bruce, seconded by Burgus. Bruce-aye; Burgus-aye; Daly-aye; Henderson-aye; and Bowman-aye. Carried.

Insurance premium

Supt. stated that there would not be an increase in the current insurance coverage except for the amount the building evaluation goes up which is not available at this time.

Administrative reports:

New proposed Jr Hi schedule Bill Kimber presented a new schedule with 8 periods instead of 7 for the Junior High. Primary purpose of this new schedule is to add reading in the Junior High. It would also add a semester of health, explore foreign language, and explore computer courses. Would need one extra teacher for reading.

Kimber stated that he felt it would increase good work habits due to work having to be handed in at the end of the class period. While it would not totally eliminate homework, it would be reduced due to students not having a study hall. Each teacher would allow some time at the end of the period. This would eliminate lost papers. This has been done on a trial basis in one classroom and appears to be working well. New schedule would create different class passing time for the junior high from the high school except for the start, last period, and the end of the day.

Supt. will bring the proposed new schedule back to the Board in April for approval.

Awareness Workshop/Amana

Supt. mentioned Awareness Workshop to be held in Amana on March 27. is a workshop designed to increase school-community cooperation. Community response was good. Supt. and several area residents plan to attend this workshop.

Supt. has received several compliments back from the community for sharing material, equipment, and free building use. Starting to open doors to cooperation.

Principals IDEA Conf.

Congratulations to Jim Nelsen and Stan Norenberg for their nominations to attend the IDEA Conference at Stevens College, Columbia, Mo. in July.

Tim: I am sending Andy a copy of this because there is little doubt that he will be involved in testifying in regard to the contract and the modifications thereof.

- 8. Plaintiff denies that it is obligated in any manner to retain or compensate Defendant for services to be rendered with respect to any contemplated future construction.
- 9. A genuine justiciable controversy exists as to whether any additional compensation is due from Plaintiff to Defendant, or Defendant's predecessor in interest, and as to whether Plaintiff is in any manner obligated to retain or compensate Defendant, or Defendant's predecessor in interest, for professional architectural services to be rendered with respect to any future contemplated contruction projects.

WHEREFORE, Plaintiff prays for an adjudication and declaration of the relative rights of the parties, and prays for the Court to enter an Order declaring that Plaintiff has paid all compensation to which Defendant, or Defendant's predecessor in interest, is entitled from Plaintiff, and further declaring that Plaintiff is not obligated in any manner to retain or compensate Defendant, or Defendant's predecessor in interest, for any architectural services to be rendered by Defendant, or Defendant's predecessor in interest, for any future construction projects.

Plaintiff prays for such other additional and ancillary relief as may be equitable in the premises.
