In connection with the proposed issuance of approximately \$3,500,000 School Bonds and approximately \$600,000 Capital Loan Notes, we make you the following proposal:

We will make a detailed survey of your present financial condition and advise you as to the best method of financing the above improvements so that the general debt incurring power of your District shall be least affected.

We will work out for you a schedule of maturities for advantageously marketing the proposed bonds and capital loan notes which will best fit in with the schedule of your now outstanding indebtedness and which will maintain, so far as possible, a constant level of tax levies and best conform with your present and future needs.

If requested, election brochures will be prepared presenting in a concise manner the scope of the entire project, reasons for proceeding, costs to the individual taxpayer, and all other information pertinent to the election. Should the election proposition fail to receive the necessary affirmative margin, our fees for the pre-election services will include only reimbursement for out-of-pocket expenses (election brochure printing); not compensation for our time and will not exceed \$500.00. If election brochures are requested and the proposition passes, the costs of election brochure printing will be added to the base fee as hereinafter set forth.

To the best of our ability, we will advise the Board of the most opportune market time to offer their bonds at public sale, subject to the approval of said Board.

We will prepare for distribution to bond buyers, information brochures which will describe the issue or issues to be sold. This brochure will include adequate information regarding the financial condition of the District and sale details so as to fully advise bond houses and institutions of the issues to be sold and the collateral securing their payment.

If requested, we will also prepare and forward to rating services detailed financial information relative to the District needed to rate the issues being sold. Costs of this rating will be assumed by the District (approximately \$1,500.00/issue).

We will recommend an investment program for that portion of the proceeds from the sale of your issues not needed to pay the contractors so that the District will receive interest income from their funds until they are used to pay the project cost.

We will assist the District in evaluating, economically and practically, the services of prospective firms for Bond Registrar and Paying Agent.

This Contract does not contemplate the furnishing of legal services by the undersigned company nor by any of its officers, agents or employees.

You agree that you will proceed with the preparation of and adoption of all necessary resolutions, forms of notices and other legal proceedings to complete the legal issuance of the securities contemplated herein, as soon as is reasonably practicable, and retain the services of a recognized bond attorney to render their approving opinion of the bonds.

In accordance with the Fair Practice Rules as promulgated by the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board, E. F. Hutton & Company Inc. is specifically authorized by the District to participate in the underwriting of the securities offer pursuant to the provisions of this Agreement.

For and in consideration of the services to be rendered by E. F. Hutton & Company Inc., the District agrees to pay a fee equal to:

One percent (1.00%) of the first \$100,000 bonds issued, and

One-tenth of one percent (1/10 of 1.00%) of the balance of bonds issued (\$4,400.00 for \$3,500,000)

One quarter of one percent (1/4 of 1.00%) of the amount of Notes issued (\$1,500.00 for \$600,000)

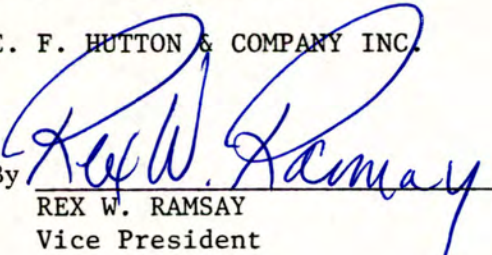

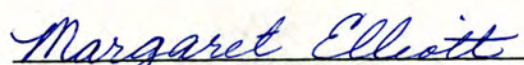

The Board of Directors of the Adel-DeSoto Community School District, in the Counties of Dallas and Madison, State of Iowa, met in open session, in the Library, Jr-Sr High School Building, Adel, Iowa, at 8 o'clock p.M., on the above date. There were present President Dallas Bowman, in the chair, and the following named Board Members:

Douglas Henderson, Janice Daly, Judy Burgus,

and Donald Bruce

Absent: None

The President of the Board called the meeting together and stated that a Petition had been previously filed, purporting to be signed by electors of the District in number equal to 25% of those who voted at the last election of School Officials; said Petition requesting that an election be called on the issuance of bonds in an amount not exceeding \$3,490,000.00, for the purpose of defraying the cost of building and furnishing a new high school building (9th through 12th grades). The President then submitted said Petition to the Board and the Board examined the same and found that the number of electors voting at the last preceding election of school officials was 281; that the number of electors who had signed said Petition was 266. The President further stated that a purpose of this meeting was also to consider calling a special election on a special 67 1/2% schoolhouse tax proposition. Whereupon, Director Judy Burgus introduced the following Resolution and moved its adoption. Director Douglas Henderson seconded the motion to adopt, and on roll call the vote was,

AYES: Burgus, Henderson, Daly, Bruce

and Bowman

NAYS: None

Whereupon, the President declared the Resolution adopted as follows:

#### RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, there has been filed with the President of this Board a Petition of Electors of this District asking that an election be called at which shall be submitted the question of issuing bonds of the District in an amount not exceeding \$3,490,000.00, for the purpose of defraying the cost of building and furnishing a new high school building (9th through 12th grades); and

WHEREAS, this Board has examined said Petition and finds that the same is signed by electors of the District equal in number to 25% of those voting at the last election of School Officials; and

WHEREAS, this Board has also determined to submit at said election the proposition of authorizing the Board of Directors to levy annually a special 67 1/2% schoolhouse tax; and



WHEREAS, neither the proposal for the issuance of bonds, hereinafter set forth, nor any other proposal incorporating any portion of it has or will have been submitted to the electors of such School District for a period of more than six months prior to the date of election hereinafter provided; and

WHEREAS, the provisions of Iowa Code Section 297.7(3) relating to review of the proposal and consideration of alternatives, have been fully met; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE ADEL-DE SOTO COMMUNITY SCHOOL DISTRICT, IN THE COUNTIES OF DALLAS AND MADISON, STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. That there is hereby called a special election of the qualified electors of the Adel-DeSoto Community School District, in the Counties of Dallas and Madison, State of Iowa, on Tuesday, June 26, 1984, at which election there shall be submitted to the qualified electors of the District the following questions, to-wit:

PROPOSITION NO. ONE

"Shall the Adel-DeSoto Community School District, in the Counties of Dallas and Madison, State of Iowa, be authorized to contract indebtedness and issue general obligation bonds in an amount of not to exceed \$3,490,000.00, to provide funds to defray the cost of building and furnishing a new high school building (9th through 12th grades)?"

PROPOSITION NO. TWO

"Shall the Board of Directors of the Adel-Desoto Community School District, in the Counties of Dallas and Madison, State of Iowa, be authorized to levy an annual schoolhouse tax upon all of the taxable property in the School District for a period of ten (10) years, not to exceed 67 1/2¢ per thousand dollars of assessed value of the taxable property, commencing with the levy to be made for collection in the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1985, pursuant to Section 278.1(7) of the Code of Iowa, as amended, for the purchase of grounds, for construction of schoolhouses or buildings, for the payment of debts contracted for the erection or construction of schoolhouses



or buildings, not including interest on bonds, for procuring or acquisition of libraries, for opening roads to schoolhouses or buildings, for the purchase of buildings or equipment for buildings or schoolhouses, for the purpose of repairing, remodeling, reconstructing, improving or expanding the schoolhouses or buildings for the School District, for the purpose of landscaping, paving, or improving the schoolhouse or building grounds, or for the rental of facilities pursuant to Chapter Twenty-eight E (28E) of the Code of Iowa?"

Section 2. That the precincts and voting places for said election and the hours the polls shall be opened and closed shall be as set out in the "Notice of Election" to be prepared and approved by the County Commissioner of Elections.

Section 3. That the form of ballot to be used at said election shall be as follows: (a) paper ballots shall be printed of some color other than white, pursuant to the provisions of Section 49.43 of the Code of Iowa; substantially in the form set forth in the Notice of Election, and (b) voting machine ballots, if any, shall be printed in black ink on clear, white material, of such size as will fit the ballot frame, and in as plain, clear type as the space will reasonably permit, pursuant to the provisions of Section 52.10 of the Code of Iowa, substantially in the form set forth in the Notice of Election. That, if more than one public measure shall be submitted to the electors at the time of the said election, all such measures shall be printed upon one ballot.

Section 4. That the Election Board for the voting precinct or precincts shall be appointed by the County Commissioner of Elections, not less than 15 days before the date of said election, a certified copy of which appointment shall be officially placed on file in the office of the Secretary.

Section 5. Dallas County, Iowa, being the control county of this School District (by reason of having the greatest amount of assessed taxable valuations of the District located therein), this election shall be conducted by the Auditor of said County as Commissioner of Elections.

Section 6. The Commissioner of Elections is requested and directed to make publication of the Notice of Election at least once, not less than four clear days nor more than twenty



days prior to the date of said election, in a legal newspaper, printed wholly in the English language, as defined by Section 618.3 of the Code of Iowa.

Section 7. The "Dallas County News", a legal newspaper as defined above, is published within the District and is hereby designated to make the publication of the Notice of Election.

Section 8. That the County Commissioner of Elections shall cause to be prepared all such ballots and election registers and other supplies as may be necessary for the proper and legal conduct of said election and the Secretary of said Board is hereby authorized and directed to cooperate with said Commissioner of Elections and to do and prepare all of the necessary proceedings in order to make said election legal and valid.

Section 9. That the Secretary is hereby directed to file a certified copy of this resolution in the Office of the County Commissioner of Elections, which filing shall also constitute the "written notice" to the County Commissioner of Elections of the election date, required to be given by the governing body under the provisions of Chapter 47 of the Code of Iowa.

#### RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, this Board has determined to submit at a election the proposition of authorizing the Board of Directors to levy annually a tax exceeding two dollars and seventy cents per thousand dollars, but not exceeding four dollars and five cents per thousand dollars of the assessed value of the taxable property within said school corporation to pay the principal of and interest on bonded indebtedness of said school corporation, it being understood that the approval of this proposition shall not limit the source of payment of the bonds and interest, but shall only operate to restrict the amount of bonds which may be issued; and

WHEREAS, the proposal for the increase in the special bond tax has not or will not have been submitted to the electors of such School District for a period of more than six months prior to the date of election hereinafter provided:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE ADEL-DE SOTO COMMUNITY SCHOOL DISTRICT, IN THE COUNTIES OF DALLAS AND MADISON, STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. That there is hereby called a special election of the qualified electors of the Adel-DeSoto Community School District, in the Counties of Dallas and Madison, State of Iowa, on Tuesday, June 26, 1984, at which election there shall be submitted to the qualified electors of the District the following question, to-wit:



PROPOSITION NO. THREE

"Shall the Board of Directors of the Adel-DeSoto Community School District, in the Counties of Dallas and Madison, State of Iowa, be authorized to levy annually a tax exceeding two dollars and seventy cents per thousand dollars, but not exceeding four dollars and five cents per thousand dollars on the assessed value of the taxable property within said school corporation to pay the principal of and interest on bonded indebtedness of said school corporation, it being understood that the approval of this proposition shall not limit the source of payment of the bonds and interest, but shall only operate to restrict the amount of bonds which may be issued?"

Section 2. That the precincts and voting places for said election and the hours the polls shall be opened and closed shall be as set out in the "Notice of Election" to be prepared and approved by the County Commissioner of Elections.

Section 3. That the form of ballot to be used at said election shall be as follows: (a) paper ballots shall be printed of some color other than white, pursuant to the provisions of Section 49.43 of the Code of Iowa; substantially in the form set forth in the Notice of Election, and (b) voting machine ballots, if any, shall be printed in black ink on clear, white material, of such size as will fit the ballot frame, and in as plain, clear type as the space will reasonably permit, pursuant to the provisions of Section 52.10 of the Code of Iowa, substantially in the form set forth in the Notice of Election. That, if more than one public measure shall be submitted to the electors at the time of the said election, all such measures shall be printed upon one ballot.

Section 4. That the Election Board for the voting precinct or precincts shall be appointed by the County Commissioner of Elections, not less than 15 days before the date of said election, a certified copy of which appointment shall be officially placed on file in the office of the Secretary.

Section 5. Dallas County, Iowa, being the control county of this School District (by reason of having the greatest amount of assessed taxable valuations of the District located therein), this election shall be conducted by the Auditor of said County as Commissioner of Elections.

Section 6. The Commissioner of Elections is requested and directed to make publication of the Notice of Election at least once, not less than four clear days nor more than twenty



days prior to the date of said election, in a legal newspaper, printed wholly in the English language, as defined by Section 618.3 of the Code of Iowa.

Section 7. The "Dallas County News", a legal newspaper as defined above, is published within the District and is hereby designated to make the publication of the Notice of Election.

Section 8. That the County Commissioner of Elections shall cause to be prepared all such ballots and election registers and other supplies as may be necessary for the proper and legal conduct of said election and the Secretary of said Board is hereby authorized and directed to cooperate with said Commissioner of Elections and to do and prepare all of the necessary proceedings in order to make said election legal and valid.

Section 9. That the Secretary is hereby directed to file a certified copy of this resolution in the Office of the County Commissioner of Elections, which filing shall also constitute the "written notice" to the County Commissioner of Elections of the election date, required to be given by the governing body under the provisions of Chapter 47 of the Code of Iowa.
