The Superintendent of Schools shall establish a vacation schedule for full-time certificated and non-certificated employees of the district. All vacations shall be taken during the school vacation periods, except by special arrangement with the Superintendent. Twelve-month employees shall receive one week's vacation after the first year of employment; two weeks from two to nine years; three weeks after ten years; and four weeks after fifteen years or more of service.

RECOMMENDED POLICY ADJUSTMENT

The Superintendent of Schools shall establish a vacation schedule for full-time certificated and non-certificated employees of the district. All vacations shall be taken during the school vacation periods, except by special arrangement with the Superintendent. The amount of vacation time shall be set by individual contracts.

Code No. 408.5 - Vacations

All vacations shall be taken during the school vacation periods, except by special arrangement with the Superintendent. Twelve-month regular non-certificated employees shall receive one week's vacation after the first year of employment; two weeks from two to nine years; three weeks after ten years; and four weeks after fifteen years or more of service.

The Superintendent of Schools shall establish a vacation schedule for all non-certificated employees of the district.

Vacation time may not accrue from one year to the next and employees may not be employed by the district for extra wages during vacation periods without prior approval of the Board.

RECOMMENDED POLICY ADJUSTMENT

All vacations shall be taken during the school vacation periods, except by special arrangement with the Superintendent. Twelve-month regular non-certificated employees, who are paid by the hour, shall receive one week's vacation after the first year of employment; two weeks from two to nine years; three weeks after ten years; and four weeks after fifteen years or more of service. Salaried personnel shall have their vacation set by their individual contract.

The Superintendent of Schools shall establish a vacation schedule for all non-certificated employees of the district.

Vacation time may not accrue from one year to the next and employees may not be employed by the district for extra wages during vacation periods without prior approval of the Board.

Dear Dr. Gladon:

I am the attorney for the Adel-DeSoto Community School District. We recently have built a new high school and are planning on building the usual set of athletic facilities, including football field, baseball diamonds, and softball diamonds in the area.

The Harvey Greenhouse is adjacent to and north of our school complex. The owner of the greenhouse, Don Harvey, has stated that we should not have any type of athletic lights on after 7:00 p.m. from September 1 through December 1 of each year because of possible damage to his poinsettias and some of his other greenhouse stock.

I have been working to some extent with Joe Chamberlain of our architectural firm, Dana, Larson Roubal and Associates of Omaha. Joe tells me that Mr. Harvey is not exactly correct on his dates, but states that a poinsettia probably should have total darkness from 5:00 p.m. through 8:00 a.m. from September 25 through a certain date. Mr. Chamberlain stated that we might have a problem simply from our parking lot lights without considering additional lighting from an athletic field.

I am wondering if you would be able to give us your opinion as to the problems we are facing if the architect can give us the lumins at the Harvey Greenhouse property which would come from our lighting system if our athletic facilities are in use. I would also, of course, like to know what you charge for your services.
