However, the TAT program operates only in the K-3 elementary building and works with all types of behavior problems. The program has been very successful this year in helping a number of children, parents, and teachers. It has been recognized as a model program and will serve as an example to other school districts. President Daly thanked the team for its fine work and the Board commended the team for its outstanding contribution to the district.

Curriculum Review

Teachers Connie Hefner, Sandy Hagemeier, and Myrittis Yontz presented a review of the fourth grade curriculum improved by the addition of a fifth section of fourth grade this year. President Daly thanked the teachers for their report and noted the positive effects of the additional section.

#### AUTHORITITY FOR AMENDING A BUDGET DURING THE FISCAL YEAR COVERED BY SUCH BUDGET

SECTION 24.9, Code of lowa. FILING ESTIMATES — NOTICE OF HEARING. Each municipality shall file with the secretary or clerk thereof the estimate required to be made in Sections 24.3 to 24.8, inclusive, at least twenty days before the date fixed by law for certifying the same to the levying board and shall forthwith fix a date for a hearing thereon, and shall publish such estimates and any annual levies previously authorized as provided in Section 76.2, with a notice of the time when and the place where such hearing shall be held at least ten days before the hearing.

For a county, such publication shall be in the official newspapers thereof.

For any other municipality such publication shall be in a newspaper published therein, if any, if not, then in a newspaper of general circulation therein.

Budget estimates adopted and certified in accordance with this chapter may be amended and increased as the need arises to permit appropriation and expenditure during the fiscal year covered by the budget of unexpended cash balances on hand at the close of the preceding fiscal year and which cash balances had not been estimated and appropriated for expenditure during the fiscal year of the budget sought to be amended, and also to permit appropriation and expenditure during the fiscal year covered by the budget of amounts of cash anticipated to be available during the year from sources other than taxation and which had not been estimated and appropriated for expenditure during the fiscal year of the budget sought to be amended. Such amendments to budget estimates may be considered and adopted at any time during the fiscal year covered by the budget sought to be amended, by filing the amendments and upon publishing them and giving notice of the public hearing in the manner required by this section. Within ten days of the decision or order of the certifying or levying board, the proposed amendment of the budget is subject to protest, hearing on the protest, appeal to the state appeal board and review by that body, all in accordance with Sections 24.27 to 24.32, so far as applicable. A local budget shall be amendment of a budget after May 31 which is properly appealed but without adequate time for hearing and decision before June 30 is void. Amendments to budget estimates accepted or issued under this section are not within Section 24.14.
