Update from School Facilities Study Committee

Administrative Reports It was moved by Hjort, seconded by Crannell, to approve the second and final reading of Board Policy 605.4, Graduation Requirements. Motion carried unanimously.

It was moved by Schlueter, seconded by Hjort, to approve the contract with Iowa State University covering student teachers placed in our school district. Motion carried unanimously.

The Resolution stating the Board's position concerning prayer at graduation was reviewed. Board consensus reaffirmed the Resolution.

Superintendent presented information from the School Facilities Study Committee. The committee is recommending additions to both elementary buildings to accommodate the district's growth. The cost would be approximately 66¢ per thousand dollar assessed valuation to taxpayers with additional monies raised through re-financing the current debt at a lower interest rate.

Curriculum Director Ernie Doeringsfeld apprised the Board of the curriculum development process currently employed by the district. The Board asked several questions about the process which includes development, purchase of materials, implementation, revision, and monitoring.

Principal Norenberg presented information about the "Youth-At-Risk" Consortium that offers alternative programs to keep students in school. This program, as well as the TAT program, Crisis Intervention program, and tutoring program, will be integrated to become a K-12 program for children at risk.

Superintendent presented an update about Outcome Based Education. Outcome Based Education focuses and organizes all of the school's programs and instructional efforts around the clearly defined outcomes we want all students to demonstrate when they leave school. Steady progress is being made on the OBE model.

The National School Board Convention is April 1-4, 1989.

Poinsettias were placed in each building's staff room from the Board and administrative staff.

Superintendent and Board President attended a town meeting tele-conference concerning school finance and presented information concerning the efficient use of funds by the district.

#### GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

The Superintendent of Schools, assisted by the professional staff, shall establish graduation requirements for the School District.

The Student Handbook shall outline and explain in detail the graduation requirements of the school system.

In all instances these graduation requirements shall meet the standards established by state statute and/or State Department of Education.

#### Current Requirements for Graduation

Thirty-six credits are required for graduation from high school, of which:

Students must pass physical each semester they are enrolled.

#### Requirements for Issuance of Adel-DeSoto High School Diploma

- A. Student must complete regular high school program, earning at least 36 credits in required and elective courses. In lieu of taking all 36 credits at Adel-DeSoto, the following options exist:
- B. A student who has dropped out of the Adel-DeSoto High School or who has failed to earn any credits for one or more semesters or who is attempting to graduate early may earn up to six credits (required and elective) through correspondence courses from the University of Nebraska or through the Adult High School Diploma Program of Des Moines Area Community College, or
- C. A student who has failed one or more required courses may earn credit for the failed course(s) through correspondence courses from the University of Nebraska or through the Adult High School Diploma Program of Des Moines Area Community College.
