Speakers from the public and then from the Board were heard. President concluded the budget hearing.

President Hemphill welcomed visitors and invited public comments during Open Forum. Joe Nanfito and Bill Huey presented progress reports on construction at the elementary and intermediate schools.

Teacher Lori Anderson and two students presented a request for approval of an overnight trip of art students to Chicago May 11-12. The itinerary has been planned and costs will be borne by students. It was moved by Heefner, seconded by Hjort, to approve the student trip as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Counselor Dave Leonard presented results of the Iowa Tests of Educational Development given to freshmen and juniors. While students scored above average in almost all areas, scores were difficult to interpret based on past years. The Board discussed some other options to ITED testing.

Superintendent recommended a new contract for Mike Steele, assistant girls' track for 1990, and the acceptance of resignations from Mike Steele, assistant girls' track after 1990, and from Carole Peterson, third grade teacher. It was moved by Hjort, seconded by Schlueter, to approve new contracts and resignations as recommended. Motion carried unanimously. Other resignations will be accepted when suitable replacement is found. Superintendent recommended the termination of one teacher's continuing contract; a hearing date has been set for March 29.

Superintendent recommended approval of teaching staff continuing contracts for 1990-91 as presented. It was moved by Nelson, seconded by Hjort, to approve continuing contracts for teaching staff as recommended. Motion carried unanimously.

The current sharing agreement for activities with Van Meter was reviewed. It appears that our sharing agreement with Van Meter may remain in force while the district whole-grade shares with Central Dallas.

It was moved by Hjort, seconded by Nelson, to approve the first reading of Board Policy 412.4 Equal Employment Opportunity and Affirmative Action and Board Policy 412.5 Sexual Harassment. Motion carried unanimously.

Board Secretary reported that past due registration fees have been processed through small claims court.

This Agreement, entered into this 12th day of February , 1989, by and between the IOWA SCHOOL CASH ANTICIPATION PROGRAM (the "Program"), and the Adel-DeSoto (the "School Corporation"), in the County(ies) of Dallas & Madison , State of Iowa, with its principal offices at Adel , Iowa, a school corporation organized under the laws of the State of Iowa, is for the purpose of providing a means by which the School Corporation may jointly and cooperatively proceed under the provisions of Iowa Code Chapter 28E to participate in the IOWA SCHOOL CASH ANTICIPATION PROGRAM, operating through an Iowa nonprofit corporation, the Iowa School Cash Anticipation Program, to issue anticipatory warrants and invest the funds on behalf of participating school corporations during periods of General Fund cash deficits.

By participating in the Iowa School Cash Anticipation Program, the School Corporation and the other school corporations participating in the Iowa School Cash Anticipation Program, may exercise powers, privileges, or authority, and make use of benefits jointly to which each of the participants separately is entitled under state and federal legislative acts.

This Agreement shall be effective upon its execution and filing with the Secretary of State of the State of Iowa and recording in the office of the County Recorders of Polk County and county(ies) in which the School Corporation is located.

The School Corporation agrees to be bound by the terms and conditions of the Agreement to Establish an Iowa School Cash Anticipation Program, the Articles of Incorporation, which are attached hereto and made a part hereof, and the Bylaws of the Iowa School Cash Anticipation Program, and such other rules and regulations as may from time to time be adopted by the board of directors of the Iowa School Cash Anticipation Program.

# TO ESTABLISH AN IONA BUBOOL CASE ANTICIPATION PROGRAM

This Agreement between the lows Association of School Boards, Inc., ... he Vinton Community School District, and the Fells Community School District, is an agreement to permit the school districts, jointly, to make efficient use of their powers by anabling them to cooperate to form an Iowa School Cash Anticipation Program.

THE PARTIES AGREE as follows

- 1. The parties to this agreement are as follows:
- A. The IOMA ASSOCIATION OF SCHOOL BOARDS, INC., an Iowa not-for-profit corporation organized under the provisions of Chapter 504A. The principal office of the Iowa Association of School Boards, Inc., is 707 Midland Financial Building, 206 6th Avenue, Des Moines, Iowa 50309.
- B. The VINTON COMMUNITY SCHOOL DISTRICT, an Iowa school corporation organised and existing under provisions of Chapter 274, Code of Iowa. The Vinton Community School District is located in the counties of Benton. Black Hawk and Suchanan, State of Iowa, with its principal office at 503 Third Avenue, Viston, Iowa 52349.
- C. The PELLA COMMUNITY SCHOOL DISTRICT, an Jowa school corporation organized and existing under provisions of Chapter 274, Code of lows. The Pella Community School District is located in the counties of Marion, Mahaska and Jasper, State of Jowa, with its principal office at East 210 University Street, Pella, Jowa 50219.
- 2. PURPOSE. The purpose of this agreement is to provide a means by which the parties may jointly and cooperatively proceed under the provisions of Chapter BE. Code of Iowe, to establish the Iows School Cash Anticipation Program, operating through an Iows homprofit corporation to be formed by the parties to this agreement to issue anticipatory warrants and invest the funds on behalf of participating school districts to make funds available to participating school districts during periods of General Fund cash deficits. In establishing the Iows School Cash Anticipation Program, these parties, and any other school corporation in the State of Iows which becomes party to this Agreement by application. May exercise powers, privileges or authority, and make use of benefits jointly to which each of the parties separately is entitled under state and federal legislative acts: provided, however, that nothing herein shall prevent any of the parties hereto, or participants, from separately applying for any such benefits to which they may be entitled.
- BLAKE. The name under which the joint and cooperative activity he carried out is the 1000 SCHOOL CASH ANTICIPATION PROGRAM.
- 4. ORGANIZATION. The parties agree to form and participate in an lows somprofit corporation, established under Chapter \$04A, to be known

as the IOMA SCHOOL CASE ANTICIPATION PROGRAM, more particularly described in the Articles of Incorporation stached hereto as Exhibit A. The lows School Cash Anticipation Program shall have the powers, privileges and authority set forth in the Articles of Incorporation but shall have only such powers, privileges and authority of the school corporations who are parties hareto as may from time to time be specifically authorized by the school corporations. The IOMA SCHOOL CASH ANTICIPATION PROGRAM corporation shall adopt bylaws which contain provisions setting out the method of calling and holding meetings of the board of directors, defining the classes of membership, and such other provisions for the regulation and management of the IOMA SCHOOL CASH ANTICIPATION PROGRAM not inconsistent with law, this Agreement, or the Articles of Incorporation.

- 5. DURATION. This Agreement shall become effective upon execution by the parties hereto and filing with the Secretary of State of Iowa and recording with the Recorders of Polk, Benton, Black Hawk, Buchanan. Harion, Mahaska and Jasper Counties, and shall continue in effect in-definitely until it is terminated as herein provided.
- 6. POWERS. Bubject to Section a of this Agreement, the Board of Directors of the IONA BCHOOL CARR ANTICIPATION PROGRAM shall have all powers, privileges and authority necessary and incidental to manage the affairs of the Iows School Cash Anticipation Program and to carry out the intent and purpose of this Agreement, not inconsistent with law, this Agreement, or the Articles of Incorporation.

Each member shall pay for contracted services and shall make payments for

contracted services as provided in the contract.

To the extent that a participating school corporation by contract authorizes the issuance of anticipatory warrants on its behalf, the school corporation shall be obligated to make such payments and repayments as may be required by the contract and shall pledge and dedicate all or part of the receipts in the General Fund for the payment of the anticipatory warrants and the interest thereon.

- 9. AGREDIENT WITH OTHER SCHOOL CORPORATIONS. Any school corporation organized under the laws of the State of lows whose directors are members in good standing of the Iowa Association of School Boards. Inc., may join in this Agreement by making application to the IOWA SCHOOL CASH ANTICIPATION PROGRAM. The secretary of the Iowa School Cash Anticipation Program is authorized to approve the application and agreement upon a determination that the requirements of participation have been met. Upon approval and filing with the Secretary of State and recording by the County Recorder(s), the school corporation shall be smeaber under this Agreement and shall be bound by the terms and conditions of this Agreement and shall be bound by the terms and conditions of this

Any member may withdraw from this Agreement for any subsequent fiscal year upon giving written notice prior to June 1 in the current fiscal year. Members may withdraw from the lows School Cash Anticipation Program in accordance with the Articles of Incorporation attached hereto as Exhibit A, and such Bylaws as may be adopted by the lows School Cash Anticipation Program. Withdrawal by a member shall not constitute termination of the Agreement nor void any contract for services for the then-current fiscal year. A party so withdrawing shall have no claim on the assets of the lows School Cash Anticipation Program.
