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Reorganization Issues

Superintendent announced that a public information meeting was held at Minburn for the Central Dallas District to answer procedural questions and present information. Board consensus favored a similar public information meeting for Adel-DeSoto and the meeting was set for July 27 at the DeSoto building library at 7:30 p.m. Patrons have until August 3 to file objections to reorganization with the AEA; the AEA hearing will be held August 13 in the Adel-DeSoto auditorium. The instructional support levy was discussed.

District Goals The Board reviewed the district goals that represented discussion at the goal-setting session. It was moved by Heefner, seconded by Hjort, to approve the district goals as presented with the deletion of short-range goals #4, 5, 6, and 7, and long-range goal #8, all of which have been completed. Motion carried unanimously.

Resignations and New Contracts

Superintendent recommended the resignation of Carole Schlapkohl, middle school volleyball. It was moved by Hjort, seconded by Saveraid, to approve the resignation as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Superintendent announced the transfer of Carole Schlapkohl from middle school math to district curriculum director, shared with Waukee.

Superintendent recommended new contracts for Lori Boston, middle school math; Lori Boston, middle school volleyball; Stacy Raygor, food services baker/cashier; and Linda Burk, exploratory computer (one period), shared with Central Dallas; and Gilbert Webb, bus driver. It was moved by Heefner, seconded by Nelson, to approve new contracts as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

ITBS Report

Principal Hilton presented the report on the ITBS results for grades 3-5. Discussion followed.

IN THE MATTER OF: THE PROPOSED MERGER AND REORGANIZATION OF THE ADEL-DESOTO AND CENTRAL DALLAS COMMUNITY SCHOOL DISTRICTS

YOU ARE HEREBY NOTIFIED that petitions are now on file in the office of the Administrator of Area Education Agency 11 for the proposed merger of the Adel-DeSoto Community School District and the Central Dallas Community School District into a new school corporation entitled the Adel-DeSoto-Minburn Community School District in Dallas and Madison Counties, Iowa.

The petition proposes that the boundaries of the new school corporation include all the territory in the Adel-DeSoto Community School District and all the territory in the Central Dallas Community School District and no other school district territory. The boundary of the proposed district is described in the petitions which are available at the Area Education Agency 11 administrative offices for your review.

The petition also proposes that the number of directors shall be five (5) initially appointed pursuant to Section 275.41, Code of Iowa (the alternative method of carryover appointments—four (4) initially appointed from the Adel-DeSoto Board and one (1) initially appointed from the Central Dallas Board). The directors shall eventually be elected pursuant to Section 275.12(2)(a) [as the appointment terms end, five (5) directors will be elected at large from the entire district by the electors of the entire district].

It is proposed that the entirety of the assets and liabilities of the two (2) stricts shall become the assets and liabilities of the newly reorganized district, effective July 1, 1993, the proposed effective date of the reorganization, with the exception of existing bonded indebtedness of the Adel-DeSoto Community School District relating to the elementary school bond issue (which shall include any indebtedness for refunding or advanced refunding of such bonds) which shall remain the sole obligation of the taxpayers residing the territory of the historical Adel-DeSoto Community School District.

YOU ARE FURTHER NOTIFIED that written objections to the said petitions in the form of an affidavit must be filed not later than 12:00 noon on Monday, August 3, 1992, in the office of Dr. Wayne Rand, Administrator, Area Education Agency 11, 6500 Corporate Drive, Johnston, Iowa 50131. Objection forms are prescribed by the Department of Education and are available in the office of Dr. Rand and/or the offices of the school superintendent in the Adel-DeSoto and Central Dallas Community School Districts. Objection forms are available for requesting dismissal of the filed petition and/or requesting property to be set out of the proposal. Note that there are separate objection forms depending on whether you request that the petition is dismissed or request that property should be set out. Objections filed requesting that property be removed from the proposed district shall include the correct legal description of the property to be removed.

YOU ARE FURTHER NOTIFIED that a hearing on said petitions and objections thereto shall be held on Thursday, August 13, 1992, at 7:00 p.m. at the auditorium at Adel-DeSoto High School.
