Open Enrollment Requests

Resignations, Modifications, and New Contracts Superintendent recommended open enrollment requests for Joanna Winston from Van Meter to ADM for 1995-96 and for Joel Kramersmeier from ADM to Earlham for 1995-96. It was moved by Saveraid, seconded by Heefner, to approve open enrollment requests as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Superintendent recommended resignations from Jennie Ryman, elementary special ed; Mary Pulscher, elementary guidance; Jackie Landon, middle school guidance; and Amy Caldwell, teacher associate. Superintendent recommended contract modifications for Amy Caldwell from .5 elementary special ed to .75 elementary special ed, and for Nancy Boston, teacher associate, from 3 hours per day to 6 hours per day.

Superintendent recommended new contracts for Kristi AuenSmith, high school language arts and assistant speech; Nancy Schroeder, elementary special ed; Ann Norton, elementary special ed; Eric Heitz, assistant high school football; Jeanette Erwin, high school library associate; Vicki Harrington, parttime middle school secretary; Jerry Slater, head high school girls' basketball; Nick Dawes, assistant high school girls' basketball; Donovan Filkins, assistant high school boys' basketball; Leisa Hasty, assistant high school girls' basketball; Eric Heikes, middle school boys' basketball; Brett Glenn, assistant high school football; Darla Johnson, head high school volleyball; Leisa Hasty, assistant high school volleyball; and Patti Merical, assistant high school volleyball. 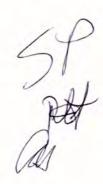
