#### Continuation of regular board meeting held March 9, 1998

#### Personnel Contracts

Superintendent recommended resignations from Lori Belgarde, bus driver; Shirley Hopewell, high school principal secretary; Marilyn Smith, teacher; Carol Stroud, Title I reading; Jean Winterboer, library associate; and Joy Knight, teacher associate. It was moved by Hemphill, seconded by Flater, to accept resignations as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Superintendent announced the transfers of Jerry Olson from custodian to copier operator, Teresa Wichtendahl from hot lunch to library associate, and Cindy Baldon from 7th grade reading to 5th grade.

Open Enrollment Policies Superintendent recommended closing open enrollment for grades 9-12 (except for those students who have a sibling attending ADM) for the 1998-99 school year due to the projected enrollment increases during the next two years. Discussion ensued. Board consensus favored continuing current practice.

Open Enrollment Requests Superintendent recommended open enrollment requests for Benjamin Carlson from Woodward-Granger to ADM: Sara and Lucas Ostring from Perry to ADM; Lauryl, Jaymes, and Alycia Gazaway from Winterset to ADM; and Luke LeClere from ADM to West Des Moines, all for 1997-98. Superintendent recommended open enrollment requests for Brianne Benjamin from Dexfield to ADM and Trevor and Tyler Reiste from Panorama to ADM, all for 1998-99. It was moved by Flater, seconded by Hemphill, to approve open enrollment requests as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

1998-99 Calendar Superintendent recommended the 1998-99 school district calendar be approved. It was moved by Flater, seconded by Hemphill, to approve the 1998-99 calendar as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

High School Space Utilization Superintendent recommended several options to meet the need for increased space at the high school. Board consensus favored obtaining cost estimates for remodeling the display case area into an additional office and allowing the conversion of the Board room into a classroom.

Composition of Tax Management Committee The board suggested areas of expertise from which to recruit people to serve on the tax management committee to research future building needs and to try to hold tax levies steady. Names will be suggested at the next regular Board meeting.

#### Continuation of regular board meeting held March 9, 1998

#### Appoint School Auditor

Business Manager recommended the appointment of the audit firm Burton E. Tracy & Co. to perform the district's audits for the next three years based on bids from the RFP. It was moved by Hemphill, seconded by Flater, to approve the appointment of Burton E. Tracy & Co. to perform the audits as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

#### Technology Bids

As part of the 5-year Technology Plan, the Board previously approved networking the district's building and providing Internet access. The district is applying for discounts under the federal Universal Services Fund (E-Rate) to complete those projects this summer. Board consensus favored reaffirming its commitment to these expenditures, which may total \$40,000, under the scope of the plan. The funding will come from state technology monies.

#### Board Policy Review Series 400 Final Reading Series 500 First Reading

Superintendent recommended the second and final reading of Board policies, Series 400 as amended and presented with the addition of administrative regulation 403.6R1 "Harrassment Investigation Procedures" and the deletion of "Military Service Leave" policies 409.9 and 414.7. It was moved by Hemphill, seconded by Flater, to approve Series 400 as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Superintendent recommended first reading approval of policies Series 500. It was moved by Hemphill, seconded by Flater, to approve the first reading of Series 500 as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

#### Administrative Reports

Superintendent reported that there will be some reduction in staffing for Title I for 1998-99 because some services will be assumed by other programs.

High School Principal discussed a study team recommendation for open campus privileges.

Superintendent reviewed the bus company's attempts to rebuild the lift bus for delivery this year.

Superintendent announced the 8:00 p.m. starting time for the April Board meeting.
