Continuation of regular board meeting held April 9, 2001

2001-02 Budget Hearing

Superintendent recommended approval of the 2001-02 budget as published. President Heefner opened the public hearing. No comments were made and no written comments were received. President Heefner closed the public hearing. It was moved by Bruce, seconded by James, to approve the 2001-02 budget as published. Motion carried unanimously.

Amendment of 2000-01 Budget

Superintendent presented the budget amendment form for the current 2000-01 budget. A comparison of this year's published budget, current budgeted expenditures, and percent of budget expended were reviewed. Small increases in three categories due to expenditures carried over from the previous year and unexpected reimbursements were recommended. There will be no impact on taxes or fees; the amendment would authorize the expenditure of existing revenues. It was moved by Purdy, seconded by Bruce, to publish the 2000-01 budget amendment as presented and to set the date for the public hearing for May 14, 2001, at 7:00 pm in the HS Library. Motion carried unanimously.

2000-01 School Calendar

Changing the current school calendar to count two parent-teacher conference evenings as two days of school was discussed. No motion was made, leaving the last day of school on June 8.

Good Conduct Committee Final Recommendation

The committee presented its final draft of a recommendation changing the good conduct code. The Board thanked the committee for its work and accepted the report. It was moved by Weems, seconded by Purdy, to approve the revised good conduct code as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Presentation of 7th/8th Grades Academic Program

Teachers presented a review of seventh and eighth grade outcomes and other aspects of the middle school program. Discussion ensued.

Food Service Prices

Superintendent recommended a 10 cent increase in food service prices for 2001-02 to cover food costs and wages. Student lunch will be \$1.70 and breakfast will be \$.95. No increase in milk prices was recommended. It was moved by Purdy, seconded by Bruce, to approve food service prices for 2001-02 as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

2001-02 Staffing Needs

Superintendent recommended staffing needs for 2001-02. A special education self-contained room is needed at the MS; an elem. guidance counselor position will be reduced on a temporary basis in the PreK-5 program; a coach for MS football is needed for increased student participation; and an assistant coach position for HS golf needs to be restored since student participation is back up. It was moved by Purdy, seconded by Weems, to approve staffing needs for 2001-02 as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Continuation of regular board meeting held April 9, 2001

Contract Ratification-ADMEA/Classified Wage Scale/Union-Contracts/ Administrative Contracts

The negotiating team recommended a 3.435% package settlement with the ADMEA for 2001-02. It was moved by Bruce, seconded by Purdy, to approve the settlement as presented. Motion exempt carried unanimously.

The negotiating team recommended a classified wage scale that included marketplace increases to bring wages to average with other schools in the comparability group. It was moved by Bruce, seconded by Weems, to approve the classified wage scale as presented. Motion carried 4-1 (Purdy-abstain).

The negotiating team recommended union-exempt contracts that included marketplace increases to bring wages to average with other schools in the comparability group. It was moved by Bruce, seconded by Purdy, to approve union-exempt contracts as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

The negotiating team recommended a 3.2% increase for administrative contracts. It was moved by Purdy, seconded by Weems, to approve administrative contracts as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Building Rental

Superintendent reported that the AEA has expressed some interest in renting space in the Minburn Elementary School. Board consensus favored entering into negotiations to determine whether an arrangement is feasible.

Administrative Reports Superintendent announced approval of open enrollment requests from Jennifer Bailey, Nichol Bailey-Bergman, and Tiffany Bailey from DC-Grimes to ADM and Dalton Hawbaker from ADM to DC-Grimes, all for 2000-01, and from Bryce Banks from ADM to Van Meter for 2001-02.

> Superintendent reviewed the five-year PPEL plan as modified. Additional changes will be made to prioritize projects.

Superintendent announced that bids had been received for a new driver's ed car.

Principal Jim DePue reviewed the provisions for a federal grant through the City of Adel for a School Resource Officer in the school district. More information will be sought for a May 11 application date.

Superintendent presented information about a proposed Technology Literacy Challenge Fund Grant through the Department of Education at the MS that requires a district match. Board consensus favored pursuing the grant.

Superintendent requested possible meeting dates for the Board's goalsetting. A tentative date of June 26 was set.
