Call to Order Roll Call

The meeting was called to order. Roll call was taken. Present were Dick Bruce, Tom Hopewell, Paula James, Darrell Weems, and President Dan Heefner. Visitors were present.

Agenda

It was moved by Bruce, seconded by James, to adopt the agenda as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Consent Agenda

It was moved by Bruce, seconded by James, to approve the items under the consent agenda as presented. Motion carried unanimously. Resignations were accepted from Ashley Jordan, teacher associate; Kristy Roberts, business manager secretary; and Deb Owen, school nurse. The contract of Sue Mauermann was modified from .55 time Title I reading teacher for 2001-2002 to .5 time Title I reading teacher/.5 time elementary teacher for 2002-03. Pending successful background checks, new contracts were offered to Trisha Calvin, elementary teacher; Karla Courtney, elementary teacher: Rachelle Geriets, MS special education teacher; Mary Hardy, HS speech teacher and speech coach; Rhys South, early bird residential construction; Mike Steele, .8 time early bird physical education; and returning classified employees as presented. The district technology plan/Internet policy was reviewed and accepted. The district special education plan was reviewed and accepted. The AE Staff Handbook, DS Intermediate Teacher/Staff Handbook, and the AE/ME/DE Parent/Student Handbook were reviewed and accepted. The list of graduating seniors was reviewed and accepted, pending successful completion of all required courses and credits.

Welcome of Visitors/ Open Forum President Heefner welcomed visitors and invited public comments during Open Forum. Superintendent celebrated Iowa School Board Recognition Week by presenting certificates of appreciation to School Board members and thanking them for their service.

2001-02 Budget Amendment Hearing President Heefner opened the 2001-02 budget amendment hearing. No written or oral comments were received. President Heefner closed the budget amendment hearing.

2001-02 Budget Amendment Determination Superintendent recommended approval of the amendment to the 2001-02 budget as published. It was moved by Weems, seconded by James, to approve the 2001-02 budget amendment as published. Motion carried unanimously.

Wheelchair Lift at the MS

Superintendent presented two bids for a wheelchair lift to be installed at the Middle School this summer. Superintendent recommended accepting the bid of Access Elevator Inc. Access Elevator Inc. has been in business for decades and their product has been viewed at other schools and then recommended by those schools. It was moved by James, seconded by Hopewell, to accept the bid by Access Elevator Inc. for installation of a wheelchair lift at the MS this summer for \$17,850. Motion carried unanimously. Written approval from the Fire Marshall and EMC Insurance Co. for the installation will be sought.

Contract Ratification - ADMEA

Superintendent recommended approval of a total package settlement of 3.73% and several language adjustments with the ADMEA. It was moved by Bruce, seconded by Weems, to ratify the contract for 2002-03 with the ADMEA as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Classified Employee Wage Schedule

Superintendent recommended approval of the classified employee wage schedule, representing a 5.68% package settlement. The new schedule will make entry and top wages comparable with neighboring schools. It was moved by Bruce, seconded by James, to approve the classified employee wage schedule as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Board Policy 414.1 Classified Personal Leave Superintendent presented changes to the "personal leave" section of Board policy 414.1 "Classified Personnel Vacation - Holiday - Personal Leave" as requested by the Board. It was moved by James, seconded by Hopewell, to approve the first reading of Board policy 414.1 as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Legislative Priorities

Superintendent presented legislative priorities from last year and new priorities to be considered for preliminary discussion. They will be discussed again in June to be finalized at the July meeting for a due date of August 1.

Continuation of regular board meeting held May 13, 2002

Review District Goals

Superintendent presented copies of the district's short and longrange goals. At the special goal setting meeting, Friday, June 21, the Board will consider current goals, changes, and possible new goals. In addition, a brief report on student achievement data and reports of accomplishments of building goals will be presented. Finally, time permitting, other topics of interest may be discussed.

Administrative Reports

Superintendent announced the approval of open enrollment requests from Chelsea and Preston Atkins and Natasha Love from WCV to ADM and from Stephanie and Tiffany Aukes from ADM to Waukee, all for 2001-02, and from Donna and Sarah Johnston from Van Meter to ADM; Brittany and Tiffany Laws and Jayson Pruitt from W-G to ADM; Emily Wachendorf from DCG to ADM; Candace and Chrystal Belz and Janine Cibert from ADM to VM; and Tommy Belz from ADM to Waukee, all for 2002-03.

Superintendent presented a list of area school tax rates for 2002-03 as requested last month by the Board. Even with ADM's tax rate increase for next year, ADM moved from 10th to 11th of area school tax rates.

Superintendent discussed reimbursement for out-of-pocket costs for baseball/softball restrooms. More information will be sought.

Superintendent discussed the need for additional high school special education classroom space.

Superintendent reviewed the need for a new high school special education program in two years as students move to the high school from the middle school in the self contained program. A portable classroom may be necessary.

Superintendent reported that the Adel Child Care Center has raised fees for before/after school care May 1. To remain non-competitive, ADM would need to raise its fees for 2002-03. Board consensus favored increasing rates.

Superintendent reviewed interest in a public survey on the income tax vs. property tax issue to fund the Instructional Support Levy in future years. More information will be gathered.

Superintendent reviewed the parameters of student behavior at graduation. Unfortunately, inappropriate behaviors could cause the termination of the ceremony and a distribution of diplomas at a later date.

The June Board meeting will be held at 8:00 p.m.

Continuation of regular board meeting held May 13, 2002

After reviewing potential enrollment for kindergarten for next year, Board consensus favored hiring another teacher to keep class size low.

Superintendent drew the Board's attention to the next IASB Able class and encouraged attendance as a group to learn more about accountability for student learning.

Adjournment

It was moved by James, seconded by Weems, to adjourn. Motion carried unanimously and the meeting was adjourned by President Heefner at 9:15 pm.

CLASSIFIED PERSONNEL VACATIONS - HOLIDAYS - PERSONAL LEAVE

The board shall determine the amount of vacation, holidays and personal leave that will be allowed on an annual basis for classified personnel.

Classified personnel who have worked one (1) year, unless the employee's contract indicates otherwise, will receive five (5) days of vacation each year. Classified personnel who have worked two (2) to nine (9) years will receive ten (10) days of vacation each year. Classified personnel who have worked ten (10) to fourteen (14) years will receive fifteen (15) days of vacation each year. Classified personnel who have worked fifteen (15) continuous years will receive twenty (20) days of vacation each year. Classified employees who leave prior to the end of their contract will receive their prorata share of vacation for the year. Only employees who work twelve (12) months qualify for paid vacation.

All vacations shall be taken during the school vacation periods except by special arrangement with the superintendent. The employee must submit a vacation request to the superintendent.

Classified personnel may be allowed a maximum of three (3) days of personal leave to accomplish personal business that cannot be conducted outside the workday. The employee must, when ever possible, submit a personal leave request stating the reason for the leave two (2) days prior to the leave day. Except in cases of scrious emergency, this leave may be denied if it falls on the day before or the day after a holiday or vacation, it falls on a special day when services would be necessary, it would cause undue interruption to the educational program or to a program demanding the employee's services to the department, or other reasons deemed relevant by the superintendent. It shall be within the discretion of the superintendent to grant personal leave.

- Personal leave is limited to the following situations:

- 1. Personal legal business, e.g., settling an estate.
- 2. A son or daughter's graduation from college.
- -3. Departure of a family member for military service.
- 4. Funerals of friends and relatives not covered by bereavement leave.
- 5. Doctor or dental appointments impossible to obtain other than during school—hours.—
- 6. Time needed to discharge civic or church responsibilities in an official capacity.
- -7. Adoption procedures.

Classified personnel who work at least thirty (30) hours per week will be allowed five (5) paid holidays. Employees who work twelve (12) months and at least thirty (30) hours per week will be granted eight (8) paid holidays. The holidays shall be determined by the superintendent.

Classified personnel will be paid only for the hours they would have been scheduled for the day. Vacation shall not be accrued from year-to-year without a prior arrangement with the superintendent.


