Call to Order Roll Call The meeting was called to order. Roll call was taken. Present were Dick Bruce, Paula James, Pat Steele, and President Darrell Weems. Tom Hopewell was absent. Visitors were present.

Agenda

It was moved by Bruce, seconded by Steele, to adopt the agenda as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Consent Agenda

The minutes of the January 13, 2003, School Board meeting will be considered at the next meeting because they were not available prior to this meeting. It was moved by James, seconded by Steele, to approve the remaining items under the consent agenda as presented. Motion carried unanimously. A resignation was accepted from Jerry Bond, assistant wrestling coach. Pending successful background checks, new contracts were offered to Pat Adams, MS softball coach, and Michelle Ramthun, elementary teacher. Athletic sharing agreements with Van Meter for girls soccer and with Earlham for boys and girls soccer were accepted, provided that the agreements would not cause a change in classification for competition purposes.

Memorial Request

A request from Trent McCollum to place his sister's name, Amanda McCollum, on a memorial plaque for students at the front of the high school was considered. It was noted that the plaque was reserved as a memorial for students who have died while in high school. However, Board policy governing memorials would allow a family of a former student an opportunity to consider a memorial gift with a name insignia attached if the McCollum family so desired. It was moved by Steele, seconded by Bruce, to affirm the current policies that allow for memorials. Motion carried unanimously.

# Continuation of special board meeting held January 27, 2003

Department of Education Five-Year Review Superintendent noted that copies of the Department of Education visitation report had been distributed to Board members.

Administrators will be reviewing the information to analyze results and report to the Board and staff.

Special Education Transition from High School to Work Force Principal Jim DePue, special education teacher Mike Miller, and AEA consultant Greg York reviewed existing options, possibilities, and some vision for the future for special education students that are making the transition from high school to work. Discussion ensued. There may be grant monies for transition programs that could be pursued to allow expanded services.

Vocational Education Program Review Principal Jim DePue presented information about the vocational education program, including offerings, state requirements, current course enrollments, and a listing from Iowa Work Force of projected job openings. Superintendent recommended focusing on offering a vocational education program that meets the needs of ADM students that might cause additions or changes to current offerings and offering a school-to-work program of job shadowing and other work opportunities. Board consensus favored establishing a task force of Board members and staff to form parameters and then involving employers who could speak to skills needed and offer job shadowing and work experiences. Steele, James, and Bruce expressed interest in serving on the task force.

Principal DePue presented a proposal for an alternative program at the high school developed with staff that would meet the needs of students who are unsuccessful in a traditional setting and are at risk of not graduating. It was moved by Bruce, seconded by Steele, to proceed to look at the proposal in depth, to include preparing a financial budget and determining staffing needs. Motion carried unanimously.

Local Option Sales Tax Ten-Year Plan Superintendent reviewed the draft of a ten-year plan in preparation for the LOST vote March 25. Preliminary information from the Facilities and Tax Management Committee study was reviewed. Priorities identified were providing property tax relief, building and furnishing a new addition to the high school to accommodate growth, remodeling and repairing existing buildings to provide continued long-term use, and allowing funds for emergency repairs. Work will continue to provide cost figures and a timeline for review at the February meeting.

28E Sharing Agreement on LOST

Mayors from Adel, DeSoto, and Minburn presented 28E agreements outlining sharing the LOST if the vote is successful, requesting approval of the agreements even though they had yet to be read by the Board. President Weems reminded the Board that a meeting for negotiating a sharing agreement had been set for January 30. A

motion by James to approve the agreements died for lack of a second. A committee appointed by the Board will meet with representatives from the cities January 30 to try to form a recommendation to the Board. Superintendent was directed to have legal counsel review the 28E agreements presented.

# Administrative Reports

Superintendent announced the approval of open enrollment requests for Nicholas Clayton from ADM to Earlham for 2002-03 and for Sara Hantsbarger from ADM to WCV, Sean Riley from Perry to ADM, and Logan Davis from DC-G to ADM, all for 2003-04.

President Weems reviewed the IASB Legislative Conference that he attended and distributed packets of information from the conference to Board members.

Personnel Evaluation (closed session) Personnel Evaluation (closed session) No closed session occurred. Principal Dave Elgin requested a closed session if a personnel evaluation was to occur but he was not present and the Board had no questions pursuant to the personnel contract that was the next agenda item.

Personnel Contract The Board reviewed the agreement-and-release between Dave Elgin and the ADM School Board that Principal Elgin requested, placing him on administrative leave for the rest of the 2002-03 school year so he could pursue other interests. Even though it will be a hardship for the district, the request was initiated by Principal Elgin, there will be no additional cost to the district because the rest of the administrative team will assume his duties, and it will allow the district to begin the process of finding a replacement. Weighing those considerations, it was moved by Steele, seconded by Bruce, to accept the resignation of Dave Elgin pursuant to the terms of the agreement-and-release as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Adjournment

It was moved by James, seconded by Bruce, to adjourn. Motion carried unanimously and the meeting was adjourned by President Weems at 11:40 p.m.

### AGREEMENT AND RELEASE

This Agreement and Release is entered into by and between Dave Elgin (hereafter "Elgin"), and the Adel-DeSoto-Minburn Community School District, an Iowa public school corporation, with administrative offices in Adel, Dallas County, Iowa, including all of its present and former employees, agents, representatives, successors, officers and directors, individually and in their official capacities (hereafter collectively "the District").

Elgin and the District in consideration of the payments and mutual promises agree as follows:

- 1. **RESIGNATION.** Elgin and the District acknowledge that Elgin has a continuing contract as an administrator with the District for the 2002-2003 contract year, and that he has been serving as a school principal. However, both the District and Elgin agree it is in the best interests of the District and of Elgin if Elgin resigns from the District at the end of the contract term, and that he not be required to, nor shall he attempt, to perform duties for the District after January 27, 2003. Therefore, Elgin resigns his contract with the District effective the end of the 2002-2003 contract year (as of June 30, 2003). The District accepts Elgin's resignation. Elgin shall be on paid leave of absence from January 28, 2003, through the end of the 2002-2003 contract year. He shall be entitled to all salary and insurance benefits through that period of time as provided by his contract and Board policy. Elgin shall receive his contracted salary payments at normal payroll times through July, 2003, and shall receive District contributions towards insurance benefits through July, 2003. If the state of Iowa pays for Elgin's attendance at the Evaluator Approval Class, he shall receive that stipend.
- 2. **NO ADDITIONAL PAYMENTS.** The salary payments and benefits set forth in paragraph 1 constitute the entire sum that Elgin will receive. No promise for additional or further monetary consideration has been made by any one subject to this Agreement and Release. Elgin shall have no further claim against the District for any sums for vacation time, other paid leaves of absence, extra duty pay, retirement or severance payments from the District or any other payment or benefit of like or different kind.
- 3. **RELEASE OF LIABILITY.** Elgin, on behalf of himself and any issue, heirs, administrators, representatives, successors or assigns, hereby covenants not to sue, and releases, acquits and forever discharges the District (as defined above to also include individuals) from any and all other liability, claims, demands and causes of action, at law or in equity, or arising from any contract, which Elgin may have or ever claim to have against the District, including, without limitation, any claims, demands or causes of action arising out of Elgin's employment or separation from employment with the District including, without any limitation, any claims, demands or causes of action arising under or based upon Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, 42 U.S.C. §§ 2000e et seq.; the Iowa Civil Rights Act, Iowa Code Ch. 216; the Americans With Disabilities Act, 42 U.S.C. §12,100 et seq., the Age Discrimination in Employment Act, 29 U.S.C. §621 et seq.; his individual employment contract; common law claims of wrongful

discharge, including, but not limited to, common law claims of intentional infliction of emotional distress; claims for emotional or mental distress, mental anguish, pain and suffering, personal injury or other injuries; claims for economic damages; claims for any kind of compensatory, special or consequential damages, punitive or liquidated damages, attorney fees, costs, disbursements, or expenses of any kind whatsoever; or any other claim against the District pursuant to state or federal statutory or common law. Further, Elgin warrants that he has not assigned, pledged, hypothecated or otherwise transferred or divested herself of or encumbered all or any part of any claim hereby released.

- 4. **RELIANCE.** Elgin is freely and voluntarily executing this Agreement and Release solely on reliance upon his own knowledge, belief and judgment, and not upon any representations made by any other party. Elgin acknowledges and certifies that he has read the terms of this Agreement and Release prior to entering into and executing this Agreement and Release.
- STATEMENTS TO THIRD PARTIES. Elgin and Superintendent Tim Hoffman have agreed to a written statement to possible future employers of Elgin, dated as of January 27, 2003. If any possible future employer of Elgin asks for a reference from the District, this shall be the statement released to the employer unless Elgin agrees that further statements may be made. Elgin also agrees to make no negative written or oral statements about any past or present employee, director, or official of the District to any present employee, future candidate for employment, resident, parent, student, media representative, or to any other person regarding the professional behavior of such person or regarding his or her treatment of Elgin. In the event either the District or Elgin breaches this paragraph of this Agreement and Release, then the other party shall not be bound to the provisions of this paragraph, and this paragraph shall become null and void. However, this paragraph shall not prevent either Elgin or the District from supplying information to defend itself, himself, or herself in any judicial or quasi-judicial proceeding. The remedy for breach of this paragraph set forth in this paragraph shall be the sole remedy for breach of this paragraph, except pursuant to common law claims for defamation.
- 6. **ENTIRE AGREEMENT.** This three (3) page Agreement and Release and the document specifically referenced herein constitute the entire agreement between the parties pertaining to the subject matter of this Agreement and Release, and supersedes all negotiations and all prior or contemporaneous discussions and understandings of the parties in connection with the subject matter of this Agreement and Release. No agreements, discussions or understandings not expressed in this Agreement and Release shall be binding upon the parties or shall affect this Agreement and Release in any way.
- 7. **SEVERABILITY.** If any term or provision of this Agreement and Release is held invalid or unenforceable to any extent, the remaining terms and provisions of this Agreement and Release shall not be affected thereby, but each term and provision of this Agreement and Release shall be valid and enforced to the fullest extent permitted by law. This Agreement and Release shall be construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Iowa. This

Agreement and Release shall be deemed to have been entered into and performed in Dallas County, Iowa.

The meeting was called to order. Roll call was taken. Present were Dick Bruce, Paula James, Pat Steele, and President Darrell Weems. Tom Hopewell was absent. Visitors were present.

Agenda

It was moved by Bruce, seconded by Steele, to adopt the agenda as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Consent Agenda

It was moved by Bruce, seconded by Steele, to approve the items under the consent agenda as presented. Motion carried unanimously. Resignations were accepted from Scott Belger, head baseball coach, and Claudia Mestdagh, GATE teacher. The financial audit for FY02 was reviewed and accepted. The legal description of the boundary between ADM and WCV, correcting the definition, was accepted. ADM will share boys soccer with Van Meter for the 2002-03 school year.

Welcome of Visitors/ Open Forum President Weems welcomed visitors and invited public comments during Open Forum. Cornelia Hoy posed some questions regarding the local option sales tax that were addressed by Superintendent Hoffman. Trent McCollum inquired about the process for memorializing his sister; present options were explained.

Administrative Transfers and Assignments for 2003-04 It was moved by Bruce, seconded by Steele, to transfer Dave Elgin to the position of Minburn Elementary Principal, Curriculum Director, Assessment Director and to transfer Carole Schlapkohl to the position of Middle School Principal for 2002-03. Motion carried 3-0 (Jamesabstain). Both administrators were willing to make the change and it is believed that the adjustment in administrative assignments will best match individual strengths with district needs to make additional school improvement efforts for students.

# Transition for Assignment Changes

Since the administrative transfer was for the remainder of 2002-03, Superintendent reported that the transition will begin immediately at the beginning of the second semester in order to make the transfer as smooth as possible for students and staff. Building next year's class schedules in each school should begin as soon as the principals become familiar with this year's schedules because the schedules may affect hiring decisions and staff reassignments that will need to be addressed soon.

Report from Facility Expansion/ Tax Management Committee

Superintendent reviewed the progress of the Facility Expansion/Tax Management Committee. At their second meeting January 9, the committee studied conditions and needs of existing facilities, building options for future growth, and ways to finance the needs. The next meeting will be January 23.

School Infrastructure Local Option Sales and Services Tax Superintendent recommended a resolution that makes a very minor change in the code citation passed at the last Board meeting regarding the Local Option Sales Tax. The change adds "any other purposes authorized by Iowa Code Chapter 422E, including the sharing of such tax revenues with cities or the County" to allow sharing if a school district so desires. It was moved by James, seconded by Bruce, to approve the resolution as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Local Option Sales Tax Ten-Year Spendng Plan Discussion centered around the major categories of property tax relief, paying down bond debt, building repairs/remodeling, financing a building addition, and sharing with cities. Priorities focused on an expansion of facilities that are now crowded in order to house students appropriately, repairing higher-rated buildings to prolong the life of existing facilities, and providing property tax relief should the vote be successful and funds would be available. Superintendent will prepare a proposal to be reviewed at a special Board meeting January 27 under the parameters discussed with preliminary timelines.

Hazardous Chemical Management Annual Report Business Manager reviewed the district's program to help employees deal safely with chemicals in the workplace.

Co-Curricular Program Review AD Steph DeVos continued discussion with the Board toward developing a philosophy for our activity programs, determining how we measure success, and developing an implementation plan.

# Administrative Reports

Superintendent announced the approval of open enrollment requests for Luke Hawkins from DCG to ADM, Derek Roberts from Waukee to ADM, Katlyn Frame from ADM to Waukee, and Heather Spencer from ADM to DCG, all for 2002-03, and requests from Sydney Klise from Perry to ADM, Christopher Wilson from WCV to ADM, Colton Gibbons from ADM to DCG, and Hunter Pauley from ADM to VM, all for 2003-04.

Superintendent reviewed the proposed 2003-04 school year calendar. Board consensus favored allowing a staff vote on options for the length of Christmas break.

RESOLUTION OF INTENT IN CONSULTATION WITH THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS AND THE COUNTY COMMISSIONER OF ELECTIONS WITH RESPECT TO A SPECIAL ELECTION ON SCHOOL INFRASTRUCTURE LOCAL OPTION SALES AND SERVICES TAX AND APPROVING FORM OF BALLOT AND DATE OF ELECTION

WHEREAS, on <u>December 9</u>, 2002, this Board adopted a resolution requesting a special election on the imposition of a one percent local option sales and services tax pursuant to Iowa Code chapter 422E; and

WHEREAS, on January 2, 2003, this Board filed said resolution with the Dallas County Board of Supervisors pursuant to Iowa Code section 422E.2, the Board of Supervisors submitted the motions to the County Commissioner of Elections, and the County Commissioner of Elections has consulted with this Board, acting through its Superintendent and legal counsel, regarding the date of the election and the form of ballot; and

WHEREAS, this Board, in consultation with the Board of Supervisors and the County Commissioner of Elections, wishes to state its intent that the proposed ballot language previously submitted to the County includes as part of the purposes for which money received from the tax may be spent for school infrastructure projects, any other purposes authorized by Iowa Code chapter 422E, including the sharing of such tax revenues with cities or the County, and to approve the inclusion in the form of ballot special language proposed by the Perry Community School District, and the proposed date of election;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE ADEL-DESOTO-MINBURN COMMUNITY SCHOOL DISTRICT:

Section 1. That the following proposition be submitted to the voters of Dallas County:

SHALL THE FOLLOWING PUBLIC MEASURE BE ADOPTED: Yes \_\_\_\_\_\_\_
No \_\_\_\_\_

A local sales and services tax for school infrastructure projects shall be imposed in the County of Dallas at the rate of one percent (1%). The tax will begin on January 1, 2004. The tax will be in effect for a period of ten (10) years until December 31, 2013.

The money received from the tax shall be spent for school infrastructure as defined by Iowa Code Section 422E.1, or for any other purpose authorized by Iowa Code chapter 422E. Of money received from the tax by the Perry

Community School District, up to \$8,310,000 shall be spent for the payment or retirement of outstanding bonds of the Perry Community School District issued for school infrastructure purposes. "School infrastructure" is defined by law to include purchasing, building, furnishing, reconstructing, repairing, improving or remodeling of a schoolhouse or schoolhouses and additions thereto, gymnasium, stadium, field house, or school bus garage, and procuring a site or sites therefor or purchasing land to add to a site already owned, or procuring and improving a site for an athletic field, or improving a site already owned for an athletic field, the payment or retirement of bonds issued under Iowa Code Section 422E.4, or for any one or more of such purposes.

Section 2. The proposed date of election, March 25, 2003 is approved.

Section 3. That the Board Secretary is hereby directed to file a certified copy of this resolution with the Dallas County Board of Supervisors and the Dallas County Commissioner of Elections.

Summary: To authorize imposition of a one percent (1%) local sales and services tax for school infrastructure in the County of Dallas for ten (10) years from January 1, 2004 to December 31, 2013.

A local sales and services tax for school infrastructure projects shall be imposed in the County of Dallas at the rate of one percent (1%). The tax will begin on January 1, 2004. The tax will be in effect for a period of ten (10) years until December 31, 2013.

The money received from the tax shall be spent for school infrastructure as defined by Iowa Code Section 422E.1, or for any other purpose authorized by Iowa Code chapter 422E. Of money received from the tax by the Perry Community School District, up to \$8,310,000 shall be spent for the payment or retirement of outstanding bonds of the Perry Community School District issued for school infrastructure purposes. "School infrastructure" is defined by law to include purchasing, building, furnishing, reconstructing, repairing, improving or remodeling of a schoolhouse or schoolhouses and additions thereto, gymnasium, stadium, field house, or school bus garage, and procuring a site or sites therefor or purchasing land to add to a site already owned, or procuring and improving a site for an athletic field, or improving a site already owned for an athletic field, the payment or retirement of bonds issued under Iowa Code Section 422E.4, or for any one or more of such purposes.
