With Phase III funds, kindergarten screening was conducted outside regular school days. Since Phase III funds have been eliminated by the state, administrators and teachers have proposed conducting the screening on two regular days of school near the end of the year to preserve a valuable process to assess new students. Board consensus favored the proposal.

Superintendent suggested a sales tax oversight committee of three to five people with one of those individuals serving on a county wide oversight committee. The committee will review expenditures from the sales tax and verify to the public that the funds were spent within the guidelines of state law and the district's own ten-year plan. Board consensus favored a gender-balanced committee with representatives from each of the three cities and two additional representatives from the rural area of the district. The committee will meet once in late September or early October each year.

Superintendent discussed progress in pursuit of property the school district may want to purchase. An appraisal may be in order at some point to aid in negotiations.

A special Board meeting will be held on December 17 from 5:00 to 6:00 p.m. to review and to approve the next stage of the conceptual drawing for an 8-9 building.

President Weems, the Board's legislative delegate, provided an update of the resolutions adopted at the recent IASB Conference.

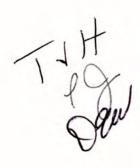

It was moved by Bruce, seconded by James, to adopt the agenda as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Resolution Directing the Sale of \$3,400,000 General Obligation School Bonds

The bids were previously received and opened by the Superintendent of Schools, Secretary of the Board, and the Financial Consultant at a meeting held in the office of the Secretary of the Board of Directors, Adel-DeSoto-Minburn Community School District, Adel, lowa, at 2:00 p.m. on December 1, 2003. The bid for the Bonds to be the best and most favorable bid received was determined by the Superintendent, Secretary of the Board, and Financial Consultant. It was moved by James, seconded by Steele, to award Bonds, based on the following bid: Harris Trust and Savings Bank, Chicago, IL for a purchase price of \$3,367,820.90, a net interest cost of \$1,765,091.81, and a true interest cost of 4.126536%. The official statement and form of contract for the sale of the Bonds were approved and the President and Secretary were authorized to execute the contract for sale of the Bonds on behalf of the School District. The notice of the sale of the Bonds and all acts of the Superintendent, Secretary, and Financial Consultant done in furtherance of the sale of the Bonds were ratified and approved. Motion carried unanimously.

Increase Depository Maximum to Accommodate Bond Sale and Sales Tax Superintendent recommended increasing the depository limitation from \$3,500,000 to \$7,200,000 to accommodate the bond proceeds and sales tax revenue that will be received. It was moved by Steele, seconded by Bruce, to increase the depository limitation to \$7,200,000 as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Request for Additional Soccer Coach

Superintendent recommended a second assistant boys soccer coach based on comparisons with other schools for the number of participants. It was moved by Bruce, seconded by Hopewell, to approve the position of a second assistant boys soccer coach. Motion carried unanimously.

Request for Additional Cheerleading Coach

Superintendent recommended a new position of assistant cheerleading coach, during the winter sports season, based on comparisons with other schools for the the number of participants and events. It was moved by James, seconded by Steele, to add the position of assistant cheerleading coach for the winter sports season, beginning with the 2004-05 school year, conditional upon the successful negotiation for salary with the ADMEA for this new position. Motion carried unanimously.

Review Physical Education Program Last month the physical education teachers presented their view of a quality physical education program and some activities in their program. This month the official philosophy of physical education and the benchmarks or curriculum goals within the program were presented. Discussion ensued. The physical education curriculum committee is active this year and will work on activities relating to benchmarks and how to assess those benchmarks. The committee will also report back to the Board with ideas for consideration for resources, facilities, staffing, grants, and intramural sports.

Review Vocational Education Program

A summary of meetings of the vocational education study committee to review program requirements, vocational opportunities, employer input, and course offerings from areas schools was presented. Discussion ensued. The findings will be reviewed by staff to make a recommendation to the Board at a later date to complete the Board's district goal of conducting a review of the vocational education program.

School Improvement Report Maureen Taylor, Director of Curriculum and Assessment, presented an update on efforts to comply with the No Child Left Behind legislation and efforts to improve the instructional program. The process in conducting the statistical analysis of student assessments and the process to match those assessments with both the curriculum goals and daily instruction were discussed. Staff development efforts to improve reading comprehension at the secondary level were reviewed. Middle School teacher Beth Shields presented a new instructional strategy she uses to increase student comprehension of materials students read. Discussion ensued.

Pending successful background checks, new contracts were offered to John Begley, assistant HS softball coach; Sylvia Cohenour, teacher associate; Angie Gilliland, .5 winter weight room supervisor; James Landis, custodial associate; Scott Schroeder, .5 winter weight room supervisor; John Wesselmann, MS baseball coach; Valerie Williams, teacher associate; and Sarah Witzke, MS girls basketball coach. A contract modification for Melissa Nystrom from assistant speech coach to head speech coach was announced. Kyle Cunningham will be the assistant HS wrestling coach for David Zwank. A transfer for Noel White from day care associate to teacher associate was announced. The lowa bus bid from Thomas Bus Sales for \$65,659 was accepted. A resolution to "Move to consider participation in the Instructional Support program for a period of one year to levy an instructional support property tax not to exceed seven percent of the regular program district cost for the budget year ending June 30, 2005, by

resolution and to set the public hearing for December 8, 2003, at 7:00 p.m. in the high school media center" was accepted. The following Board policies received the second and final reading: 203 "Board of Directors' Conflict of Interest", 210.1 "Annual Meeting", 403.1 "General Personnel Physical Examinations", 403.7E1 "Employee Drug Info Sheet", 403.8 "Drug and Alcohol Testing Program", 501.14 "Open Enrollment Transfers-Procedures as a Sending District", 501.15 "Open Enrollment Transfers-Procedures as a Receiving District", 801.3 "Educational Specifications for Building Sites", and 704.3 "Investments". The low survey bid from Boundaryline Surveys for \$7,075 was accepted. Application will be made for the Iowa Demonstration Construction Grant Program and for the Iowa Demonstration Fire (Life) Safety Grant Program.

Welcome of Visitors/ Open Forum President Weems welcomed visitors and invited public comments during Open Forum. Becky Button encouraged the use of community input in the design phase of the new building projects and she was assured that community input will be sought.

Transportation Report

Transportation Director Deb Kahler presented an overview of the transportation program. Discussion ensued.

State Aid Reduction

The state's 2.5% reduction of state aid revenue will cause a shortfall of \$133,000 to ADM. Superintendent recommended making reductions in the current budget where the savings are significant and that would cause the least disruption to the students' education program in addition to using some cash reserves and considering replenishing some or all of the reserves next year. This combination of options should cause minimal disruption and will not seriously damage the district's financial position. Discussion ensued.

Request for 7th Grade Baseball Program Mike Mensen and others presented a request for the addition of a 7th grade baseball program for Summer, 2004. Following discussion, it was moved by Hopewell, seconded by James, to table the request until the December 1 special meeting to seek more information about scheduling, field availability, number of coaches needed, and annual costs. Motion carried unanimously.

Resolution to Advertise for Sale of Construction Bonds

Financial Consultant Rex Ramsey presented information concerning a partial sale of construction bonds in 2003. It was moved by James, seconded by Steele, to approve the resolution to direct the advertisement for sale of \$3,400,000 General Obligation School Bonds on December 1, 2003. Motion carried unanimously.

It was moved by Bruce, seconded by James, to approve the resolution to approve electronic bidding procedures. Motion carried unanimously. Even though Rex Ramsey is an employee of Piper Jaffray, he is independent of the bond division; therefore, there is no conflict of interest in allowing U.S. Bancorp Piper Jaffray MN to be among the bidders. It was moved by Steele, seconded by Bruce, to allow U.S. Bancorp Piper Jaffray MN to bid. Motion carried unanimously.

Resolution to Approve 8-9 Building, Air-Condition All Buildings, and Authorize Rambo Associates to Proceed In order to officially recognize the results of the bond election vote and to authorize Rambo Associates to proceed, it was moved by James, seconded by Bruce, to approve the educational program and preliminary design concepts as illustrated in facilities option E2a for the 8-9 and school/community activities additions at the existing high school site including related remodeling and provision for central district facilities and other site improvements, as approved by the voters of the ADM District, and to authorize Rambo Associates Inc. as its Owner Representative/Project Manager to proceed through the schematic design phase for the overall facilities program with the assistance of our staff, administrative and community representative committee input. Motion carried unanimously.

Resolution to Authorize Superintendent and Board President to Make Construction Decisions In order to keep the construction project flowing when quick decisions need to be made regarding change orders and other construction related issues that have some cost and to minimize the number of special Board meetings needed, a procedure may be adopted to authorize the Superintendent and Board President to make decisions on those issues under a certain dollar level. Superintendent recommended such a process with a dollar limit of \$10,000. It was moved by Bruce, seconded by Steele, to approve procedures for minor expenditures and changes through the development and the implementation of the facilities and tax management plan that would include district approval by both the Superintendent and the Board President or other Board representative as may be appointed by the President as well as approval and recommendation by the district's Owner Representative/Project Manager, Rambo Associates, Inc., for individual items and expenditures not to exceed \$10,000, with the intent that larger expenditures or major items would be routinely approved at meetings of the Board. Motion carried unanimously.

Administrative Reports

Superintendent announced approval of open enrollment requests for Matthew Westfall from Waukee to ADM and for Andrew and Stacie Ross from ADM to VM, all for 2003-04.

AD Stephanie DeVos relayed requests from head coaches for an additional assistant boys soccer coach and an assistant cheerleading coach. Both positions will be considered for approval at a future Board meeting.

Principal Carole Reindl reported that several elementary students have been able to discontinue supplementary Title I reading services, a mark of success for the district's reading program.

Superintendent, Principals, and Curriculum and Assessment Director presented a curriculum and program update for the 8-9 building. Much research is being done on the needs of adolescent learners and the types of instructional strategies that are most effective in raising student achievement.

The Board will send thank you notes to the four co-chairs and treasurer of the building committee for their work on the successful bond election.

Superintendent has been meeting with youth softball league officials to develop a specific plan to relocate two youth softball fields that will be displaced by construction. Board consensus favored allowing the use of some sales tax revenue in a joint project to relocate the two fields in which the city, the softball league, and the school all participate financially.

A special board meeting will be held December 1 at 5:00 p.m. to approve the sale of construction bonds and to hear follow-up reports on district goals of reviewing Character Counts, physical education, and vocational education.

Tom Hopewell spoke to some issues regarding school board election campaigns on district property. Following discussion, President Weems asked Hopewell to draft an information sheet to help candidates.

IASB state meetings (November 20-21) and Delegate Assembly (November 19) on legislative issues will be held in Des Moines. Bruce, Steele, and Weems will attend some sessions.

Real Estate Discussion (Closed Session)

It was moved by Bruce, seconded by Hopewell, to move into closed session pursuant to Section 21.5 "to discuss the purchase of particular real estate only where premature disclosure could be reasonably expected to increase the price the governmental body would have to pay for that property." Motion carried unanimously and the tape recorder was turned on at 10:25 p.m.

It was moved by James, seconded by Bruce, to move out of closed session. Motion carried unanimously and the tape recorder was turned off at 10:35 p.m.

Adjournment

It was moved by James, seconded by Bruce, to adjourn. Motion carried unanimously and the meeting was adjourned by President Weems at 10:35 p.m.
