Instructional Support Levy Resolution It was moved by James, seconded by Roby, to adopt the resolution to participate in the Instructional Support Program for a period of one year to levy an instructional support property tax not to exceed 10% of the regular program district cost for the budget year ending June 30, 2007. Motion carried unanimously.

Physical Education/Health Program Review Director of School Improvement Maureen Taylor led the physical education/health program review. PE teachers Nick Pitcher, Deb Kahler, Mitch Krumwiede, and Mike Whisner presented curriculum maps completed for the year thus far that illustrated changes being made from a games approach to a wellness and fitness emphasis. Recommendations include grading PE classes at the HS, eliminating student athlete exemptions from PE at the HS, and adding a required wellness/health class at 9th grade. While initial reaction was positive, the impact on the schedule of classes at the HS and the cost of the additional resources will need to be researched. Requests for equipment and supplies to support an increased focus on quality fitness assessment data and for an additional PE teacher were detailed. With little budget growth projected for next year, the Board may receive more such requests and will need to weigh whether other programs will be affected or whether more revenue will be sought.

Technology Support for Staff and Web Page Superintendent asked for support to hire current staff members after hours as needed to provide additional tech support during the summer to set up technology for new staff, to provide hardware and software tech support during the school year for teachers, and to upgrade and update the district's web pages. Current staff are no longer able to provide enough tech support during the day to cover all the needs of the students and staff. Board consensus favored paying staff members to provide tech support as needed at the same rate of \$24/hour as currently paid for committee work.

Hiring Criteria and Procedure for Administrative Positions Since it appears that the district will be hiring a high school principal for next year, Superintendent reviewed the procedure for filling the position. Some qualities and skills to be included in the criteria to select a candidate were discussed and will be revisited at the next board meeting.

Administrative Reports

Superintendent announced approval of open enrollment requests for Dallas Brickman from WDM to ADM, and Katherine Johnson from Waukee to ADM, both for 2005-06, and for Kade Killmer from Perry to ADM, Danielle Selover from WCV to ADM, and Dylan Steelman from ADM to VM, all for 2006-07.

Superintendent continued discussion regarding facilities' usage, reviewing information from legal counsel. It appears that public use of the track and gym without supervision may be allowed but tighter control over the weight room should be exercised.

Superintendent continued discussion regarding an auditorium manager/fine arts AD. Auditorium assistance has been covered by training staff members for technical work in setting up and operating sounds and lights at a cost of \$24/hour and to supervise community use of the auditorium for \$15/hour. For fine arts support, the change in

position to a 7-12 AD for next year may be able to fill this need; the fine arts staff will be surveyed to determine needs and then consideration will be given to how best to meet those needs.

Superintendent drew the Board's attention to a report from SAI on top legislative issues to compare them to legislative issues to be formulated this week at the IASB Convention.

Registration was completed for those attending the IASB Convention November 16-18 in Des Moines.

Superintendent reviewed the Ten Year Facility Plan. Board consensus favored including razing the old primary building in the plan for 2005-06. Preliminary estimates of constructing new bleachers at the football stadium for visitors are approaching \$160,000. Discussion will continue to update the plan.

Adjournment

It was moved by James, seconded by Roby, to adjourn. The motion carried unanimously and the meeting was adjourned by President Weems at 8:45 p.m.

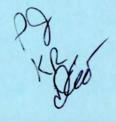
