Re: Curriculum Revision Updates

As you are aware, ADM currently has four teams working on curriculum revision: PK-12 Writing, Science, Math, and Physical Education. Carole Erickson will provide a detailed update regarding written language.

#### Science

The 6-12 science curriculum team met for a full day on November 8. This meeting was very productive and focused on several key issues. The first was reaching consensus on altering our sequence of science courses in grades 6-9 due to the requirements of the lowa Core Curriculum. Below is our current sequence and the proposed sequence:

2011-12	New Sequence
6th General	Earth and Space
7th Earth and Space	Life
8th Life	Physical
9th Physical	Earth and Space

This change is due to the fact that we currently teach no Earth/Space science at the 9-12 level. This is a requirement of the lowa Core standards. This new sequence is also in line with many other districts and allows us to meet state requirements in some health standards in grade 7.

We would employ a two-year phase in sequence to ensure all middle school students get Life Science. In 2012-13 both 7th and 8th grade students would get Life Science; 9th grade would still be Physical Science. The new sequence would be fully in place in 2013-14.

Another major decision reached was to require chemistry for all ADM graduates. All students in lowa have to complete three years of science. Chemistry has been an elective traditionally and some students elect to not take chemistry and instead take another science course, like Environmental Science or Physiology. Two major issues were identified by our science team. First, students not taking chemistry miss a tremendous amount of the required lowa Core science standards. Secondly, the students not taking chemistry may not be college bound and taking the other electives changes the rigor of Environmental Science and Physiology.

Requiring chemistry for all ADM graduates addresses both these issues. We would offer two levels of chemistry – a general chemistry class for non-college bound students and those not meeting the math requirement and a chemistry course for college-bound students who have had, or are in, Algebra-II.

These changes, along with implementation of Gateway to Technology in the middle school, necessitate an additional science teacher (1.0 FTE). This position would teach the units of GTT to the 7/8 grade students and pick up high school science sections which may include PLTW, physics and/or chemistry.

#### Resources

Our 6-12 teachers also spent time reviewing resources and narrowing our focus. Using a detailed textbook evaluation guide, the teachers identified the top two or three publishers to continue investigating. These resources include Glencoe/McGraw-Hill, SEPUP, and Holt McDougal. Presentations with these publishers are being set up for January. If, following these presentations, we are still considering two resources, we will pilot with students.

Our PK-5 curriculum team spent the afternoon looking at materials from National Geographic. These are outstanding materials and the team is very excited about them. Jodi Banse worked with them to identify the specific materials needed to address our standards and units at each grade level.

Our next meeting will be on January 16 and will be focused on publisher presentations (6-12) and aligning resources to our standards (Pk-5).

#### Biomedical Project Lead The Way

Consensus was to continue forward with plan to implement Biomedical PLTW at ADM. This strand of PLTW, along with GTT (2012-13) and the pre-engineering PLTW (2011-12) would combine with our core science curriculum to form the strongest science program in the state.

I reviewed the actual cost of biomedical PLTW implementation and how those costs could be funded by PPEL with Nancy and Adam.

Working with the available PPEL funds for technology (if passed), approximately \$30,000 would be available in the first five years for the necessary computers (a 1:2 ratio) and other allowable equipment per PPEL. There would be another approximately \$30,000 in costs in order to implement all three courses that are not PPEL eligible or exceed our PPEL revenue allotted to technology.

Bottom Line:

Biomedical PLTW is still a goal for implementation at ADM. A target date is 2013-14.

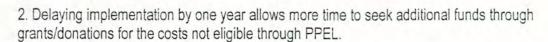

3. Allows more focus for our core science curriculum revision this year.

The administrative team wants to continue to look for ways to implement in 2012-13. I have contacted organizations and biomedical firms inquiring about grants/contributions and will continue this effort leading up to the PPEL vote.

#### Math

The math curriculum team is meeting again on December 6. The 6-12 team will review standards and discuss gaps and areas to address. New courses and sequences will also be a focus. The math team will also review resources for the first time and narrow the search to 2-3. The PK-5 group will be focusing on computation and working towards a unified system of teaching computation.

### Physical Education

The PE department met on November 9 and started the process of identifying student performance outcomes at each grade level in connection to the national PE standards. Our next meeting in December will be focused on identifying changes to our high school PE offerings and identifying standards for those courses. These will influence the standards taught at all grade levels below and may include changes in units.

# ENVIRONMENTALLY PREFERABLE CLEAING PRODUCTS MANDATE OPT-OUT RESOLUTION

Pursuant to Iowa Code 8A.318, the Adel Desoto Minburn Community School District, after an evaluation and assessment of its needs, facilities and finances has made the decision it will not participate in the Environmentally Preferable Cleaning Mandate for the following reasons:

Capital Sanitary Supply conducted a Green Cleaning Audit in the summer of 2011 and found that the District is currently using several "green" products already. Although, Capital Sanitary Supply suggested changes to improve our percentage of "green" product usage, our District does not feel the need to make immediate changes as custodial staff are satisfied with some current products.

The Adel DeSoto Minburn Community School District will use environmentally preferable products when it is feasible for the District to do so.

Call to Order/Roll Call: President Tim Canney called the meeting to order. Roll call was taken. Present were Rod Collins, Bart Banwart, Vice President Kim Roby, Kelli Book and President Tim Canney.

**Agenda:** It was moved by Roby, seconded by Book, to adopt the agenda as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

**Honoring Excellence:** Teacher Jacque Seidl was introduced by Charity Miller, who wrote the nomination letter that detailed Jacque's service for going above and beyond expectations in her profession. Jacque accepted a paperweight with the inscription "ADM Honoring Excellence" noting her honor and spoke a few words.

Consent Agenda: It was moved by Banwart, seconded by Roby, to approve the items under the consent agenda as presented. Motion carried unanimously. Minutes, bills and claims, and financial reports were reviewed and accepted. Resignations were accepted from Sharon Blanchard, payroll specialist and Sheila Moreno, bus driver. Pending successful background checks, new contracts were offered to Richard Beechum, sub van driver and Marilyn Keltner, associate. The district will apply for allowable growth for new open enrolled-out students for 2011-12, allowable growth for the 2010-11 special education deficit (\$63,341.17) and allowable growth for increased enrollment for 2011-12.

Welcome of Visitors/Open Forum: President Canney welcomed visitors and invited public comments during Open Forum. Jodi Baier, high school Spanish teacher and students Keegan Mumma and Lucas Thompson reported on community service events they participated in earlier this year, Meals from the Heartland and Hope Ministries.

Comprehensive School Improvement Plan: Superintendent presented the Comprehensive School Improvement Plan (CSIP) submitted to the lowa Department of Education and pointed out some of the more significant changes made. It was moved by Collins, seconded by Banwart to approve the 2010-11 Comprehensive School Improvement Plan. Motion carried unanimously.

Early Retirement Incentive 2011-12: It was moved by Roby, seconded by Book to approve the 2011-12 Early Retirement Incentive Plan. Motion carried unanimously.

Superintendent Professional Development Goals: Superintendent presented his 2011-12 professional development goals, which focused on three areas, curriculum revision, technology/voted PPEL, and fiscal planning. It was moved by Book, seconded by Banwart to approve the Superintendent Professional Development Goals for 2011-12. Motion carried unanimously.

**School Improvement Advisory Committee:** It was moved by Book, seconded by Banwart to appoint Rod Collins and Kim Roby as Board representatives to the School Improvement Advisory Committee. Motion carried unanimously.

#### Administrative Reports:

Technology Plan/Voted PPEL: Technology Director Adam Kurth presented a possible timeline for purchases and installation for technology purchased with a voted PPEL based on a successful February vote. The Board reviewed the information brought forth from last months' meeting regarding needs for the District and discussed the two spending options further. One of those options is to borrow money so that technology upgrades can benefit more students now. Travis Squires, from Piper Jaffray was present to provide information on the impact of obtaining a loan to purchase technology with voter PPEL funding. Superintendent reminded the Board that the Voter Approved PPEL will not increase the overall tax levy, as the cash reserve levy will be lowered to offset the PPEL levy. The Board consensus was to put the PPEL to vote in February and to consider borrowing so that students can benefit immediately.

Refinancing GO Bonds: Travis Squires, from Piper Jaffray provided information and estimated savings should the Board decide to refinance the GO Bonds. The potential savings due to low interest rates could be substantial. However, since the call date on the bonds isn't until 2014, the District could save much more if the refinancing is done closer to the call date and the interest rate stays low. The Board consensus was to wait while monitoring the interest rates for the next 3-6 months.

<u>Enrollment Update</u>: Superintendent provided an overview of the 2011 official enrollment. Preliminary findings show an increase in resident students of 28.

<u>PreK-12 written language PD Report</u>: Principal Carole Erickson presented information on her work with the PK-12 teachers on written language curriculum, instruction and assessment. A professional development schedule includes meeting with the PK-5

Leadership Team, the 6-12 English staff, and the full PK-5 staff over the course of the year.

<u>Curriculum Revision Process and Update:</u> Superintendent reviewed the curriculum revision process, including the cycle for revision and tasks included in this process. Superintendent updated the Board on the work done by the science, math, and physical education teams.

"One Unshakable Vision": Superintendent provided Governor Terry Branstad's blueprint to improve education in Iowa.

Open Enrollment for 2011-12: Superintendent announced approval of open enrollment requests from Blake Rutz from WCV to ADM; Blake Sheehy from Waukee to ADM; Michael Lynde from ADM to Van Meter, Logan Roll from ADM to Woodward Granger; and Paige Roll from ADM to Woodward Granger.

Open Enrollment for 2012-13: Superintendent announced approval of open enrollment requests from Madison Wicks from WCV to ADM.

Superintendent called the Board's attention to several important calendar dates, including the end of the first quarter on October 21, no school – work day on October 24, and the parent/teacher conferences on October 25/27.

### Adjournment:

It was moved by Roby, seconded by Book, to adjourn. The motion carried unanimously. President Canney adjourned the meeting at 8:00 p.m.
