### **Attendance Reminder**

Reminder to parents - students should be called in before 9:00 a.m. so we have accurate information as to where students are. We have made this easier, by adding an email address that you can use to report an absence:

It is important that we know your student is absent. We want to first insure their safety and secondly we want to be sure they are engaging the the educational opportunities for their future. If we do not receive a call or email from the parent, the student is given an "unexcused absence". Unexcused absences result in detention or Saturday School depending on how long the student was out of school without a parent or guardian notifying us.

It is also very important for your student to sign in and out. This helps us keep your students' attendance accurate. If a student leaves for an appointment during the day he/she is recorded as "checking out of school" and until that student signs back in.

#### DANCE INFORMATION

Each ADM junior or senior student may bring one date (freshmen and sophomores are not allowed to attend

unless they are the date of a junior or senior). If a student is bringing a date from another high school or a student who has graduated from either ADM or another high school, a form must be filled out and signed by parents and administrators of the school if applicable. More information about this form will be sent to students early in April.

Tickets will go on sale in mid-April. They are \$25 each. Each attendee (student and date) needs their own ticket. Only juniors and seniors may purchase tickets.

#### OTHER INFORMATION


#### WHAT IS INDIVIDUAL SPEECH?

#### ADM STUDENT FINALISTS IN IOWA STATE BAR ASSOCIATION COMPETITION

Adam Bryte, Lillian Carey, Ellah Townsley, and Alayna Whitson of ADM High School's Advanced Place American History class were recognized as finalists in The Iowa State Bar Association's Young Lawyers Division "Know Your Constitution" Project. Eighty-six finalists were selected from the more than 500 students across the State of Iowa who participated in the "Know Your Constitution" Project. These finalists were honored at an Awards Luncheon in Des Moines on January 20, 2023.

The "Know Your Constitution" Project is designed to enrich students' understanding and appreciation of the Constitution. The students participating in the project were required to familiarize themselves with Constitution related issues. A quiz was completed by each participating student. An essay question accompanied the quiz. This year's essay topic involved Constitutional questions concerning student free speech off campus and subsequent school suspension. The question is modeled after recent cases before the United State Supreme Court.

The Know Your Constitution program is sponsored by The Iowa State Bar Association, with additional funding from the Iowa State Bar Foundation and IOLTA.

What's the Four Year Plan and why is it important:

The four year plan is a roadmap to your students' post secondary goals. It lays out the courses your student will be taking in high school. By planning out all four years, it ensures that your student is meeting both graduation requirements and college entrance requirements.


### **Academic Decathlon**
