
NEW CLUB ALERT

Students in Mrs. Garcia's Medical Interventions class designed their own cartoons of viruses that serve as vectors for gene therapy. The characteristics of their vector designs match the ability of different viruses to insert functional genes that can treat genetic disorders.

Senior Alert - Comparing Financial Aid Packages

Colleges have started sending out letters outlining the grants, scholarships, and loan options available to you to cover your college costs for next year. If you haven't received one yet, watch your mailbox or email, and check any online school accounts you've set up at the schools you've applied to. If you haven't received them yet they will be coming soon.

So what do you do next?

Financial aid packages outline the costs for one year and the financial aid you've been offered to help cover those costs. If you've applied to multiple schools, you'll need to compare and determine which offers the best option for a successful experience.

ICAN is offering a free online seminar Wednesday, March 8 at 5:30 pm that will go over the comparison process. You can register and stream this live event from any device!



Heart of Iowa Community Services is a state-funded agency not affiliated with the Department of Human Services or Juvenile Court Services whose purpose is to help the residents of Dallas, Guthrie, and Audubon counties obtain mental health and disability services, as well as fund services for those who do not have Medicaid or private insurance. These services include therapy, BHIS, community supports, and transportation just to name a few.

Some more about services they provide:

- 1. Help families and schools find mental health and disability service providers as well as make contact to start services.
- 2. Help provide funding for mental health services and connected costs (i.e. transportation).
- 3. Help provide family resources and referrals for other support such as combatting food insecurity or homelessness.
 - 4. Wrap around services for families including parents and children.
