# **Approved 2022-23 Academic Calendar**

The 2022-23 ADM Academic School Calendar was reviewed and approved by the ADM Board of Education on Monday, January 10, 2022.

All elements of the approved calendar remain the same as what was shared with families and staff, with the exception of the following change made based on feedback received.

- Change: Winter Break Extended By One Day
  - Winter break has been extended one additional day from the originally proposed calendar, beginning with an early dismissal on Wednesday, December 21, 2022, rather than an early dismissal on Thursday, December 22, 2022.
  - This change provides students and staff with a winter break that is the same length as was experienced in this school year's school calendar.
- Impact of Change: Last Day of School, Seniors' Last Day
  - The last day of school for students has changed from Thursday, May, 25, 2023 to Friday, May 26, 2023.
  - The seniors' last day of school has changed from Thursday, May 18, 2023, to Friday, May 19, 2023.

All other elements of the calendar remain as proposed. See below to review important information about the approved calendar.

# A Focus on Learning and Results

As shared with ADM families earlier this fall, ADM is in the midst of what we are calling a "Radical Reset" related to how we use data, make instructional decisions, and focus on results. To support this work, ADM has identified the following "Wildly Important Goal".

# **ADM's Wildly Important Goal**

Decrease PK-11 grade students identified as "not yet proficient" in reading on the identified grade level state assessment from 24.6% to 15% by June 1, 2022.

Throughout the fall, teachers in all buildings have been relentlessly focusing on the implementation of universal instructional changes (instruction that impacts all students) and changes to instruction provided during intervention (instruction received only by students who indicate a specific need in reading). While there has been more work occurring than could possibly be captured in this short description, the information below captures a few of the key changes to universal instruction that have occurred so far during the 2021-22 school year.

#### Grades PK-2:

• <u>Key Universal Instruction Change:</u> All students in grades PK-2 now receive daily phonemic awareness and/or phonics instruction to support students in the development of foundational skills that lead to strong decoding and fluent reading.

#### Grades 3-6:

Key Universal Instruction Change: All students in grades 3-6 now receive daily phonics or advanced morphology instruction
to support students in the further development of skills that lead to strong decoding, fluent reading, understanding of
vocabulary and deeper comprehension.

### Grades 7-8:

• <u>Key Universal Instruction Change:</u> All students in grades 7-8 now receive daily instruction and practice related to reading fluency to support reading comprehension and vocabulary instruction with an emphasis on morphology. Students also receive reading instruction in other core classes weekly.

## Grades 9-12

• <u>Key Universal Instruction Change:</u> Teachers have been learning about literacy and the importance of disciplinary literacy instruction in all classrooms at ADM High School. Teachers have been completing a book study and are implementing specific instructional changes to ensure literacy instruction occurs in all classrooms.
