Focusing On The Wildly Important

We remain committed to the principles of <u>The Four Disciplines of Execution</u>. After unprecedented annual improvement in literary proficiency scores at ADM during the 2021-22 school year, the following district and building Wildly Important Goals (WIGS) have been identified for the 2022-23 school year. These goals serve as the focus of our school improvement efforts:

ADM's Wildly Important Goal 2022-23

District WIG: Decrease PK-11 grade students identified as "not yet proficient" in reading on the identified grade level state assessment from 18% to 10% by June 1, 2023.

Adel Elementary	Decrease PK-1 grade students identified as "not yet proficient" in reading on the FAST assessment from 23% to 12% by June 1, 2023.	
Meadow View Elementary	Decrease 2-4 grade students identified as "not yet proficient" in reading on the FAST aReading assessment from 25% to 14% by June 1, 2023.	
DeSoto Intermediate	Decrease 5-6 grade students identified as "not yet proficient" in ELA on the ISASP from 15.8% to 10.3% by June 1, 2023.	
ADM Middle School	DM Middle School Decrease 7-8 grade students identified as "not yet proficient" in ELA on the ISASP from 16.2% to 10% by June 1, 2023.	
ADM High School	Decrease 9-11 grade students identified as "not yet proficient" in ELA on the ISASP from 11.4% to 5.7% by June 1, 2023.

Teacher Leadership and Compensation Program



The Teacher Leadership and Compensation (TLC) system is a statewide program developed by the Iowa Department of Education, with the goal that districts would develop and implement local TLC programs that "reward effective teachers with leadership opportunities and higher pay, attract promising new teachers with competitive starting salaries and more support, and fosters greater collaboration for all teachers to learn from each other." The Iowa Department of Education reports that every school district in Iowa has implemented a TLC plan,

with nearly 10,000 teachers serving in leadership roles across the state.

ADM implemented a TLC program in 2015, with minor changes to the program being made in 2018. ADM's TLC program currently provides leadership opportunities and stipends for teachers to serve as instructional coaches (11 teachers), professional learning community leaders (29 teachers), model teachers (10 teachers), and mentor teachers (20 teachers). With ADM being in the 7th year of implementation, the district is currently in the process of developing plans for a full review of the program. The review process will include a committee with representation of teachers not currently serving in TLC roles, teachers currently serving in TLC roles, and administrators. The committee will complete a review process and develop recommendations for changes to ADM's TLC program.

In planning for this review, all teachers and current TLC participants were asked to complete a feedback survey about ADM's TLC program at the end of the 2021-22 school year. 
Focus On Learning Board Reports





A Focus on Learning and Results

The FAST Reading and Math Screening Assessments are administered to students in grades K-8 three times each year (Fall, Winter, Spring). The purpose of each screening assessment is to identify students who are not yet meeting grade level proficiency in the areas of reading and math. Teachers use the data from each screening assessment to identify students who need targeted interventions and support for acquisition of specific skills.

Below are ADM's fall 2022 FAST results for each grade level (K-8). Fall scores from the past two years have also been provided for context of how ADM's system is performing over multiple years.
