ADM Families,

As we diligently work to finish the 2024-25 school year strong, we are also deep into planning for the next school year. Spring break is fast approaching, and the busyness that accompanies April and May will be here before we know it. We remain committed and focused on our Wildly Important Goal of decreasing PK-11 grade students identified as "not yet proficient" in reading or ELA on the identified grade level state assessment from 12% to 8% by June 1, 2025. 2025-26 ADM Academic Calendar Approved: The ADM Board of Education approved the 2025-26 academic and staff calendars on Monday night. The approved calendar sets the first day of school on August 25, 2025, the last day of attendance on May 29, 2026, and commencement occurring on the Sunday of Memorial Day weekend.

The development of the 2025-26 academic calendar presented some challenges due to an lowa law that prevents schools from starting before August 23rd. This year, August 23 falls on a Saturday. This results in August 25 being the earliest date allowed by law for lowa schools to start the 2052-26 school year.

There are currently several bills in the statehouse that may amend this law and allow for an earlier start date next school year. It is unclear if any of these bills will be passed and become law. If changes are made to the law to allow for an earlier start date, ADM will revisit the 2025-26 school calendar at that time. We will keep you updated about any changes that may occur to the 2025-26 school calendar.

New High School: Update

Plans and work on the new high school continue to be on schedule. The next step in the process is to receive bids for the construction of the new high school. The district will receive bids for the new high school project on Thursday, February 13 at the District Administration Center. We are so excited to see construction get started this spring!

Safety and Security Updates

Safety and Security: Update

ADM continues to be involved in the Governor's School Safety Program which will ultimately lead to funding for lowa schools to make safety improvements in all buildings. All five attendance centers have completed a formal safety assessment conducted by a vendor provided by the lowa Department of Homeland Security and received reports of findings and action steps from each safety assessment. Several projects are underway to improve safety and security at each school building.

FAST Reading and Math: Winter Screening

The FAST Reading and Math Screening Assessments are administered to students in grades K-8 three times each year (Fall, Winter, Spring). The purpose of each screening assessment is to identify students who are not yet meeting grade level proficiency in the areas of reading and math. Teachers use the data from each screening assessment to identify students who need targeted interventions and support for acquisition of specific skills. Below are ADM's Winter 2025 FAST Reading and Math results for each grade level (K-8).
