Our district's state approved safe return to school plan includes outdoor lunch time and open windows for ventilation. Social distancing requires students to use multiple entry and exit points to access the school building at arrival, dismissal and after lunch. While these measures keep students and staff safe from covid, it compromises the security we have worked so hard to obtain. We are in need of an outdoor camera system to allow us to ensure our student safety is monitored from every angle. Our security now needs to take into consideration safety from covid and safety from intruders. Our camera system will allow the main office staff to monitor all areas of the building. We currently monitor all hallways and common areas but have no way of monitoring the exterior. With more and more outdoor classes and outdoor lunch, our exterior space is being used as instructional space and common space and we need a way to monitor the outdoor grounds of the building.

By June 2023, the district aims to increase ELA and Math student achievement by 10% in all student subgroups as measured by common, locally developed assessments (K-8). Benchmark assessments administered in Spring 2022 and Fall 2022 revealed deficits particularly in the area of math problem solving. We will support students over the summer to prevent summer slide. Our support programs service all children, grades K-8.

An outdoor camera system will address safety needs caused by an increase of outside instruction and lunch as dictated by our state approved safe return plan.
