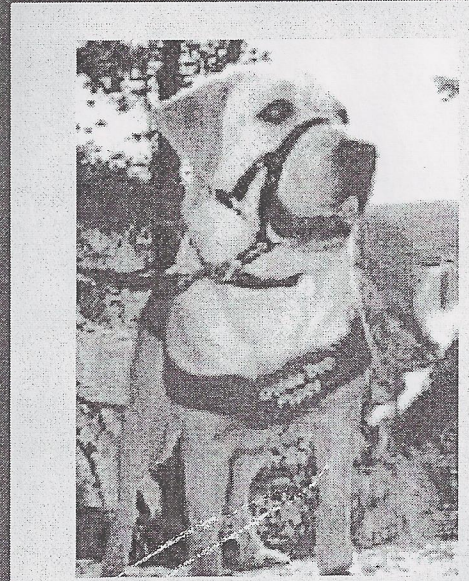
One kind of guide dog is a Seeing Eye Dog. Seeing Eye Dogs help people who are blind or have impaired vision. They help guide the blind person. It is illegal to deny a blind person access to any public space including stores, restaurants, banks, and anywhere else that dogs might be prohibited.

Guide dogs also help people in wheelchairs or have a disability.

These dogs help those people by assisting that person in getting something they cannot easily get to. This type of guide dog also helps guide their master places. They too, cannot be denied any access to public space.

Another type of guide dog is one that helps people with missing or deformed limbs. The dogs also help their master get to things that they cannot get to. The dogs also help with rehabilitation after the decapitation of any limbs.
