A Note from the Green Team

Here at East, teaching our students about the benefits of sustainable living is very important to us. We do this in many different ways from recycling in the classroom to gardening out back. Each year our school's Green Team has the opportunity to pick a new project that can benefit our school and our community. This year our project is to reduce waste within our school and community. As part of this project, our students participated in a waste audit in order to learn just how much waste we as a school are producing. We are very excited to use this information to help initiate some exciting changes at East.

We received a grant to install water bottle refill stations in our school. This will help to reduce the amount of waste that water bottles create. Additionally, we will make attempts to reduce waste during our three lunch periods by introducing a composting program that is partnered with a community sponsor. As a team we will work closely with the James Killion Beautification Enhancement Committee to paint trash barrels as our community project. Our school will also continue their efforts to recycle plastic bags, soda tabs, and gently used shoes. We are hopeful that all of these efforts will make East and even better place to be.

Box Top Contest

Grade levels are having a box top contest! On Tuesday and Thursday mornings students can purchase items using box tops in the gym lobby. Each item will cost three box tops. The grade level with the most box tops turned in by February 15th will win an extra recess with freeze pops.

Alton District #11 Truancy Guidelines

In an effort to provide your child with the greatest opportunity for success, please find a reminder of our Truancy Guidelines below and the importance of school attendance.

- 1. Regular attendance is CRUCIAL to every student's success.
- 2. It is important that your student be at school on time. This does not mean dropping your child off right at the time school starts or after. Being late means your child is missing important instructional time.
- 3. Please be proactive in calling your student's school to report an absence. Schools request a phone call before 9:00 a.m. on the day of absence.
- 4. please refer to your Alton School District calendar (pages 3 & 4) for guidelines concerning excused and unexcused absences. A calendar copy is also available at altonschools.org.

IF YOU TAKE YOUR STUDENT TO THE CLINIC, DOCTOR OR EMERGENCY ROOM, PLEASE ASK FOR A SIGNED EXCUSE. THE EXCUSED SLIP SHOULD BE SENT TO SCHOOL WITH YOUR STUDENT ON THE DAY HE/SHE RETURNS. MEDICAL OFFICES CAN ALSO FAX IT TO (618) 463-2121.

Winter Weather

Please remember that the students will go outside for recess if weather permits. Dressing your child(ren) in layers with a hat and gloves will ensure that he/she is comfortable this time of year with the temperature changes throughout the day.

General Information and Reminders

<u>Student Absences</u>- We want to ensure that our students are safe at all times. If your child is going to be absent for any reason, please notify the school (463-2130). If we have not received a call, you will be contacted to confirm the absence.

<u>Visiting the Building</u>-Building doors remain locked at all times for the safety and protection of our students and staff. All visitors must be buzzed in through the front doors and report to the office to sign in and receive a visitor pass. To preserve the learning environment within the classrooms, we require an appointment to be made 3 days in advance for all observations within the classroom. Please see someone in the office to make an appointment and fill out the appropriate paperwork.

 $\underline{\text{Office Hours}}\text{--} \text{Office hours are 7:15am to 3:15pm. If you call after 3:15pm, you will be asked to leave a message.}$

<u>Morning Procedures</u>- Students should not be dropped off before 7:15am. If you would like your child to eat breakfast at school, they need to arrive by 7:50am. This will allow them to eat as well as make it to class on time. Breakfast will not be served after 8am. If students arrive to school after 8am, they will not receive breakfast. If students are dropped off after 8:00, please make sure that you walk them into the office. Please do not drop them off at the front doors. Students need to be signed in by an adult.

<u>Transportation Changes</u>- Anytime you need to make a change in transportation, please contact the main office at 463-2130. If at all possible, we would like to have all changes before 2:00pm. This allows us time to notify the teacher and your child of the change. In order to make sure all children arrive home safely, we must have a written note or a phone call to change a child's transportation.

<u>Parent Drop-Off</u>- Students should not be dropped off before 7:15am. There is no supervision available before this time. If you would like your child to eat breakfast at school, please make sure they arrive by 7:50am. This will ensure they can eat and make it to class on time. When dropping off students in the circle drive please make sure to unload in the area between the light poles in front of the gym lobby doors. Vehicles need to stay in a single file line for the safety of the students. Please do not pass other cars. Please be courteous of the time it takes to unload your students. Thank you for your cooperation.

Parent Pick-Up- Parents picking up students by car will receive a hang tag that is numbered and corresponds with name(s) of child(ren) being picked up. After school, parents and guardians will need to pull around to the back of the building for parent pick-up. Please remain in your car and pull up to the door, which is located toward the building side of the second parking lot. Please wait in line until your child(ren) are escorted to your vehicle by the supervisor on duty. Additional hang tags can be requested if you would like to give permission to someone to pick up your child up from school. If you forget your hang tag, you will need to park and come through the gym lobby doors to sign your child out of school. If you lose your hang tag, you will need to come into the office and request another one. Parents that enter the building to pick-up students will enter through the gym lobby doors. The gym lobby doors will not be unlocked until 2:15 pm. Parents may wait in the gym lobby until dismissal at 2:25 pm.

District Procedures for Winter Weather Conditions

Weather conditions can change rapidly in the winter months. When weather is potentially threatening, Alton administrators constantly monitor forecasts and the condition of roads, parking lots and sidewalks. With this in mind, we would like to provide parents with information on district procedures in the event of school closures or early dismissals due to inclement weather. In the event that local weather conditions deteriorate rapidly during the school day, the District may be forced to dismiss early in the best interest of the safety of our children.

EARLY DISMISSAL SCHEDULE

East Elementary 12:25 p.m. release time

Early dismissal notification procedures are as follows:

- *Parents receive phone call from the automatic dialer.
- *Email notifications are also sent
- *Notification will be posted on the district website (altonschools.org)

DELAYED START SCHEDULE

East Elementary 10:00 a.m. – 2:25 p.m.

EMERGENCY SCHOOL CLOSING

In the event that the Alton School District elects to close schools for the day due to poor weather, information will be provided through the following means: phone call from automatic dialer, district website, Facebook posting, parent email, and through local media including WBGZ Radio – 1570 AM, KMOX Radio – 1120 AM, KMOV Channel 4, KSDK Channel 5 and Fox2now.
