EyeMed: Costco FAQ's

1. Do I need a membership to get glasses or contacts at Costco?

Yes, a membership is required.

2. Do I need a membership to have an exam with the Costco Independent Provider?

No, a Costco membership is not required for vision exam.

Please verify that the Costco Independent Optometrists accepts your eye exam benefits from EyeMed.

3. Do I need my EyeMed ID card to access care?

No, you only need to provide your name and birthdate.

4. How do I locate a Costco Independent Provider for an Exam?

Sign in to your EyeMed.com account and search for a Doctor-Enter "Costco" and Zip Code for the nearest location.

Call the Store Phone number - Select Option "5", Select Option "1" and then Option "1" to schedule an exam. Please identify yourself as an EyeMed Insurance member when making an exam appointment.

5. What if the Costco Independent Provider does not accept EyeMed Insurance?

- a) Sign in to your EyeMed.com account and search for the nearest In-Network provider.
- b) Please contact your Benefits Team and EyeMed will be notified to recruit this provider to join the EyeMed network.

6. What if the Costco Vision Center tells me they do not accept EyeMed CA Insight Network?

- a) Identify yourself as former MES member who is now with EyeMed CA Insight Network and request they pull an authorization.
- b) Request to speak with a supervisor who will assist you.

7. If Costco Vision Center is unable to pull an authorization and I choose to pay for my services how can I get reimbursed.

- a) To Submit a Claim online visit EyeMed.com. "Submit a Claim" complete the claim form, upload your receipts.
- b) To Mail your claim form visit EyeMed.com "Submit a Claim" Print the claim form Complete and sign the claim form. Return the completed form and your itemized paid receipts to:

First American Administrators, Inc. Attn: OON Claims, PO Box 8504, Mason, OH 45040-7111 Please note: when submitting a claim, out of network allowances will be reimbursed.
