

FEATURED IDEA OF THE MONTH Scratch-and-Sniff Painting



Scratch-and-sniff painting appeals to kids' visual, tactile, and olfactory (smell) senses. Choose a few flavors of Jell-O based on your

child's color and smell preferences. Use a different plastic cup for each color. Mix 1 tablespoon of white glue, 1 tablespoon of water and 1 teaspoon of Jell-O powder in each cup. (The glue helps the gelatin granules stick.) t.ly/GBE9r

6 Low-Cost Ways to Create a Sensory-Friendly Chair




