## SCHOOL POLICIES

### ACTIVITY CODE FOR PARTICIPATION IN NORTE VISTA HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES AND ATHLETICS

Any student who wishes to participate in school-sponsored activities or organizations such as sports, dances, ASB, etc., must meet this code. The provisions of the code are:

- A student must maintain a 2.0 GPA or better during the previous grading period and may not receive a failing grade in any of the core subjects (Math, Language Arts, Science, or History).
- A student must demonstrate appropriate behavior and must avoid the following inappropriate behaviors to be eligible to participate in activities: suspension, tardiness, unexcused absence, truancy (class or all day), OCI referral, administrative detention.
- Attend 4 or more classes on the day of an event in order to participate; only a doctor's note or an administrative waiver can allow the student to participate.
- Purchase an ASB card. Any student that does not have a card will not receive any award.
- Turn in a copy of a physical, proof of health insurance, a parent consent form, ASB card, and the signed CIF Code of Ethics.
- Co-curricular activities include, but are not limited to, drama, choir, jazz dance, band, and agriculture.

### ASSOCIATED STUDENT BODY (ASB) CARDS

Although the general costs of operating the school are met with school district funds, student body expenses, such as athletics, awards, various activities, spirit items, dances, and school improvement projects, among others, are financed through student body funding. In order to receive awards, letters, or certificates from activities and/or athletics, students must purchase an ASB card.

The ASB card enables a student to save a considerable amount of money during the school year. The card provides FREE admission to home football games, basketball games, and other athletic events. In addition, other discounts include away athletic events, dances, including Midwinter Ball and Junior/Senior Prom, and a substantial reduction on the price of the yearbook. The cost of an ASB card is \$30.00.

### NORTE VISTA HIGH SCHOOL PICTURE ID CARD AND OFF-CAMPUS LUNCH PASS

**All students are required to wear their Norte Vista High School Picture ID at all times on the Norte Vista lanyard that is provided.** Students are provided with an ID card on a Norte Vista lanyard at the beginning of each school year or at the time of enrollment free of charge. A \$5.00 replacement fee will be charged for any ID card that is lost, stolen, or damaged. All students, when leaving or entering campus for off campus lunch, are required to show their ID card on a daily basis. On occasion, students may be asked to show their ID card to a staff member. Failure to comply is defiance and disciplinary action will be taken.

Only students in grades 11 and 12 may leave the campus during lunch. 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> grade students must remain on campus. A parent must come to the school in person to sign the permission slip allowing his/her student to leave at lunch. "Off-Campus Lunch is a privilege that carries a fee of \$10. The privilege of Off-Campus Lunch may be revoked upon request of the parent or by school administration if the student abuses the privilege (i.e. being tardy to the class following lunch, loitering, or violation of any conduct code). If the Off-Campus Lunch privilege is revoked, and the parent / student would like to reinstate the privilege an additional \$10 fee will be imposed, and a NEW Parent Authorization form must be re-submitted to the ASB Office." Students may exit from the main exit of the student parking lot only. All other exits are off limits.

### STUDENT PARKING

Student On-Campus parking is a privilege at Norte Vista High School. Only students in grades 11 and 12 may park their vehicle on campus. All student vehicles must have a parking placard and must be formally registered with the ASB Office. Upon school authorization, each student will be issued 1 parking placard to be hung on the rear view mirror of their registered vehicle. Students can use the same parking placard for a different car provided it has been registered under the Students' name and has prior parental approval. All students will be required to park in the designated student parking area, and must fully display the parking placard FREE from visual obstruction. Finally, the privilege of On-Campus Parking may be revoked upon request of the parent or by school administration if a student abuses the privilege (i.e. being tardy to the class following lunch, loitering, or violation of any conduct code). If the On-Campus Parking privilege is

revoked, and the parent / student would like to reinstate the privilege, Administrator approval will be required and a NEW Parent Authorization form must be re-submitted to the ASB Office.

Parking registration must include the following information:

- a.) VALID Drivers' License
- b.) VALID Car Insurance(s) for ALL potential cars that will be driven on campus by the driver.
- c.) Year, Make, Model, Color, and License Plate Number of each car that will be potentially driven

Vehicles without parking permits issued by NVHS as well as those vehicles that are improperly parked or parked in the wrong parking lots are subject to Disciplinary action.

Students must possess a valid California Drivers License, current California Vehicle Registration, and proof of insurance when applying for a student parking permit. Only vehicles that are "street legal" and have a valid California registration for operation on the highways may be parked on campus. The parking lot has limited supervision. Parking is done at the student's own risk. Students should keep vehicles locked. Alford Unified School District accepts no responsibility for damage to any vehicle or its contents. Students may not park in staff designated parking areas. **The speed limit in the parking lot is 10 MPH.** Irresponsible or reckless driving on the part of any student or failure to comply with any of the above requirements will result in the suspension of parking and/or off campus privileges and may also result in other corrective action appropriate to the offense. The student parking lot is out-of-bounds to students except during lunch and after school. Administrative approval must be received before going to the parking lot at any other time. Violators will be subject to disciplinary action. Cars are not to be used as lockers! Students may not access cars during class periods or passing periods. Any vehicle entering school parking facilities may be subject to search by school administration, trained dogs, or police officers. Search may include the passenger compartment, engine compartment, trunk, and all containers, locked or unlocked, in or upon the vehicle.

#### **GENERAL RULES FOR SCHOOL ACTIVITIES**

1. ***Students must show a valid Norte Vista High School ID / ASB card to enter a school dance or activity.***
2. Students who choose to leave before the function has ended will not be allowed to return.
3. Students must abide by all school rules, including dress code, unless prior notification of specific dress requirements is given.
4. If a student wishes to bring a guest who does not attend Norte Vista, the student must secure a guest pass from the Activities Office. The guest pass must be completed and validated by the Activities Office **3** days prior to the activity. The guest must have an ID card from his/her respective school. The host / hostess must accompany the guest at all times and the guest must conform to all school rules.

#### **ATHLETIC CODE**

Section 1: Each head varsity coach has the authority to establish individual grooming rules and requirements for attendance and team conduct. All athletes involved in sports programs must adhere to these rules

Section 2: An athlete may leave a sport for any reason during the first ten days of practice. There will be no penalty if the athlete informs the coach of his / her intention to leave that sport and the athlete returns all equipment or gear issued to him / her.

Section 3: An athlete who passes the 10 – day grace period and leaves a sport without the coach's written permission or is removed from the team due to disciplinary reasons will be suspended for the season. If an athlete violates the Norte Vista Athletic Code a second time, the suspension will be for one year.

Section 4: An athlete who, through his / her conduct in the classroom, on campus, or off campus, damages the reputation of Norte Vista High School Athletics may be suspended by the Norte Vista Athletic Council for one calendar year from the date of the infraction.

Section 5: Only awards and insignias authorized by the Athletic Department may be worn on athletic jackets and sweaters. Failure to abide by this rule may result in a suspension of up to one year from the program.

Section 6: A suspended athlete has the right to request a hearing before the Norte Vista Athletic Council. Based on information from the hearing, the student may be granted probation by the Norte Vista Athletic Council. A suspended athlete may be reinstated after one year on the recommendation of the Norte Vista Athletic Council. Athletes must follow the athletic code to be readmitted.

Section 7: The Norte Vista Athletic Council will consist of the head varsity coaches, the Athletic Director, and an administrator.

Section 8: It is the coach's responsibility to report to the Athletic Director any athlete who violates the Norte Vista Athletic Code. In addition to the Norte Vista High Athletic Code, the athlete is required to sign the C.I.F. Athlete's Code of Ethics.

### **DIRECTIONS**

When you are viewing the team's schedules, the away games are in blue. Click on the team we are playing and it will give you directions to that school by using MapQuest.

### **ASSIGNMENTS**

One of the goals of education and of Norte Vista High School is to have students be responsible for their part in the total education program. We feel that all students should take responsibility for completing their assignments on the days assigned by the teachers. Assignments can be obtained prior to, or after, an absence by calling the Main Office, (951) 358-1740, and leaving a message for his/her teacher. The teacher will respond to the message as soon as possible. If a student is to be absent from class due to a study trip, practice, performance, athletic contest or meeting, the assignments due should be turned in BEFORE the missed class period.

### **EMERGENCY CARD INFORMATION**

**Parents / Guardians must notify the school immediately of any change in address, phone number, employment, or emergency information.** It is critical that more than one adult be listed on the card at separate daytime phone numbers. Students will only be released to the adults who are listed on the Emergency Card and who present a picture ID.

### **GRADING POLICY**

Letter grades are to be assigned in all classes. Grades are given 6 times a year; progress reports at **6** weeks and **12** weeks and then a final semester grade. Semester grades are to be cumulative and reflect the student's progress during the entire **18** week semester.

### **HOMEWORK**

The Alvord Unified School District Homework Policy specifies that high school students should have approximately 1½ hours of homework a night, Monday-Thursday. Students are expected to keep a daily record of all homework assignments in their Student Planner. Parents are encouraged to periodically review/discuss the information in the planner with their students. All homework must be turned in on time to receive full credit. Late homework may receive less or no credit.

### **INSURANCE**

The school district does not supply accident insurance for students. It is the responsibility of the parent / guardian to pay for medical care resulting from school injuries. If you are interested in the low-cost insurance made available through the district, use the enrollment forms provided with the registration packet.

### **LIBRARY**

The library at Norte Vista High School is open from 7:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. each day. The library is closed during lunch. Students may use the library before and after school without a pass. During these times students may read newspapers and magazines, copy on the student copier, (\$.10 a page), study, work on one of the computers available for word processing, and check out or return a book. Students may use the facilities to read, do research, study, and use the computers for multimedia projects and desktop publishing. During class time, the students are required to have an official school pass from the teacher in order to enter the library. The pass must state the purpose of the visit and when the student should return to class. Students, upon entering, sign in and leave their passes at the front desk. Books are checked out for a two-week period and lists are sent to English teachers on a regular basis listing those students who have overdue books. No charges are given for late books. If a student has an overdue book, no other book may

be checked out. If a book is overdue at the end of a semester, the student must return it or pay for the book before receiving his or her transcripts or registering for the next school year.

### **MEDICATION**

Students may not carry medication of any kind on campus. Students taking medication must have an AUSD Medication Form on file. The form may be obtained from the school office and must be completed by a doctor and signed by a parent or guardian. All medication will remain in the office. With a form on file, students may carry an inhaler on their person.

### **NONDISCRIMINATION NOTICE**

The Alvord Unified School District does not discriminate on the basis of ethnic group, sex, classification, ancestry, religion, age, handicap or physical/mental disability. This applies to all students regarding admission and participation in programs and activities in the district's schools. Lack of English language skills shall not prevent participation. Questions or concerns should be directed to the school principal. If you believe you were unfairly treated or discriminated against in any way, a grievance procedure and forms are available.

### **NUTRITION – BREAKFAST, LUNCH & SUPPER**

In the morning, students may purchase food from our school breakfast program. At lunch, food may be purchased from the snack bar, carts, or school lunch program. Supper is offered immediately after school and must be consumed in the cafeteria unless the student is escorted to and from the cafeteria by their teacher. Students are responsible for cleaning up after themselves and disposing of all trash in trash cans after all meals. For those who qualify, applications are available for free or reduced-price breakfasts, lunches & suppers.

### **SCHEDULE CHANGES**

No schedule changes will be made unless approved by the Principal.

### **SCHOOL HEALTH SERVICES**

A full-time nurse is not available. The school administers 'first aid' only. If a student is injured, it is important that he/she notifies the teacher/office immediately. If a student is ill, he/she will not be sent home until a parent, guardian or other person listed on the emergency card is contacted. REMEMBER TO KEEP THIS INFORMATION CURRENT. A school nurse is available at Student Health Services located on Jones and Campbell between 7:30 AM – 8:30 AM each morning.

### **STUDENT NORTE VISTA BINDER, HANDBOOK/PLANNER AND OTHER SUPPLIES**

**A Norte Vista binder, with dividers and a Wednesday Mailbag and Student Handbook/Planner is supplied FREE to every student and is required to be carried daily by the student.** This academic tool is used for information and organization. A student can replace any lost, stolen, or damaged Norte Vista binder, dividers, Wednesday Mailbag and Student Handbook/Planner by going to the library and paying a \$5.00 replacement fee. Every student is also required to carry a plastic pouch for pens, pencils, etc. The Wednesday Mail Bag is a pouch where students will place all correspondence from the school to their parents. Parents need to check this every Wednesday evening for important information from the school.

### **STUDENT USE OF OFFICE PHONE**

Students may use the office telephone in case of **emergency only**. Forgotten homework, school supplies, PE clothes, and arrangements for after-school activities are not considered emergencies.

### **VALUABLES**

Students should not bring large amounts of money or other valuables to school. Any fund-raiser money should always be turned in before school. During P.E. class, students should securely lock any of their personal items in the locker provided. **Students should not leave personal items (i.e. purses, backpacks, jackets, etc.) unattended on campus.** The school cannot be responsible for the searching for or the replacing of valuable items. HELPFUL HINT: If the property is valuable, DO NOT bring it to school – **IF YOU DO BRING IT TO SCHOOL, IT IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY!**

### **VISITORS**

Parents / Guardians of students are always welcome and are encouraged to visit the school. They must, however, check in with the office to pick up a Visitor's Pass before visiting the classroom. The pass must be returned to the office before exiting. We also request a 24-hour notice if the parent/guardian plans on attending classes. This allows for prior arrangements for seating. Student visitors are not permitted (Education Code).



## **PHYSICAL EDUCATION UNIFORMS**

All P.E. students are expected to "dress-out" for P.E. every day. Tennis shoes must be worn at all times during P.E. class. A Norte Vista P.E. Uniform must be purchased from the ASB window. T-Shirt and Short Combo (\$20.00), T-shirt Only (\$15.00), and gym short only (\$15.00).

Every student will be issued a locker and a lock at the beginning of the school year. Students are not to share lockers and each student is responsible for his/her lock. Students will be charged \$5.00 for a lost or damaged lock. All locks not issued by the school will be cut off the locker.

## **REGIONAL OCCUPATIONAL PROGRAM (ROP)**

Riverside County Office of Education provides ROP courses for job training to the residents of Riverside County. Several of these programs are located at the high schools in the Alvord School District. Retail Merchandising is offered at Norte Vista High. ROP students must be **16** years of age or have completed the 10<sup>th</sup> grade. More information may be obtained by contacting the Riverside County Office of Education at (951)788-5097.

## **SCHOOL PUBLICATIONS**

**Serrano Yearbook** is a lasting record of students' high school years. It is distributed in June, but must be purchased in advance. Purchases made in August during registration will receive a discount. Sales are also held in October and December just prior to placing the final order. Students will receive a receipt which facilitates picking up their yearbooks in June. If students wait until June to buy a yearbook, they not only pay a higher price, but there may be no yearbooks left.

## **STUDENT ASSISTANCE PROGRAM – SAP**

The Alvord district supports each school sight with SAP services. Services include, but are not limited to, drug/alcohol/tobacco use intervention and prevention, violence prevention, Asset Development, PAL program, Red Ribbon Week, Friday Night Live, and Youth Service Center programs.

## **STUDENT STORE**

Norte Vista High School maintains a Student Store which is located in room 203. It carries a variety of school supplies, gift items, and snack items.

## **TUTORING**

After school tutoring is available on specific days in most subject areas. Students should see their teacher or counselor for information on subject area after school tutoring schedules. We encourage all students who need assistance to take advantage of these opportunities.

## **STUDENT CONDUCT**

### **ATTENDANCE**

Norte Vista will no longer be accepting phone calls to clear absences or tardies, whether they are full day or period absences. The automated phone calling system will be the **ONLY** notification you will receive. We will NOT be making "reminder" phone calls.

- A written note must be provided within five (5) days from the date of the absence or tardy, or the student will be marked "truant."
- Notes must include:

First name, last name, middle initial, date of absence, reason for absence, current phone number, authorized signature.

An **authorized signature** is required and will be checked for validity. **An authorized signature is that of the parent/guardian/caregiver ONLY.**

- Should a note contain a forged signature, the student will receive an immediate consequence and the parent/guardian/caregiver will be contacted by an administrator.
- A student coming to school late **MUST** provide a written note with an authorized signature and a current phone number or they will be sent directly to OCI for the period.
- Period absences will not be excused and will be considered "truant."

**Please note** that if a student is found off campus during a truancy sweep, the parent/guardian/caregiver may be responsible for a large fine issued by the City of Riverside.

**Please note** a student is considered to have excessive absences when he/she has missed 10 or more days in a school year. Students with excessive absences are referred to the School Attendance Review Board (SARB.)

## **BICYCLES – SKATEBOARDS – SCOOTERS – MOTORIZED VEHICLES**

Due to insurance liability, skateboards, scooters, and bikes are not to be used on campus at any time. Bicycles should be properly locked and not ridden on campus. V.V. 21212 requires all persons under the age of 18 to wear a helmet when operating a bicycle. No motorized vehicles, motorcycles, or motorbikes may be brought on campus except to be parked in designated student parking areas. **Students who bring their bicycles, skateboards, or scooters to school do so at their own risk!** The school will not be held responsible for theft, vandalism or any personal loss.

## **SUSPENSION/EXPULSION**

A pupil may be suspended or expelled for the following acts which occur: 1) while the student is on the school grounds; 2) while the student is going to or coming from school; 3) during the lunch period, whether the student is on or off the campus; 4) during, while going to, or coming from a school sponsored activity.

**The following are excerpts of Education Code 48900 and violation will result in disciplinary action.**

- a.** 1. Caused, attempted to cause, or threatened to cause physical injury to another person.  
2. Willfully used force or violence upon the person of another, except in self-defense.
- b.** Possessed, sold, or otherwise furnished any firearm, knife, explosive, or other dangerous object.
- c.** Possessed, used, sold, or otherwise furnished, or been under the influence of, any controlled substance, alcoholic beverage, or an intoxicant of any kind.
- d.** Offered, arranged, or negotiated to sell any controlled substance, alcoholic beverage, or intoxicant of any kind, and then either sold, delivered, or otherwise furnished to any person another substance and represented that substance as a controlled substance, alcoholic beverage, or intoxicant (look alike).
- e.** Committed or attempted to commit robbery or extortion.
- f.** Caused or attempted to cause damage to school property or private property.
- g.** Stolen or attempted to steal school property or private property.
- h.** Possessed or used tobacco, or any product containing tobacco or nicotine products, including clove cigarettes, snuff and betel.
- i.** Committed an obscene act or engaged in habitual profanity or vulgarity.
- j.** Possessed, offered, arranged, or negotiated to sell any drug paraphernalia.
- k.** Disrupted school activities or otherwise willfully defied the valid authority of a school official.
- l.** Knowingly received stolen property.
- m.** Possessed an imitation firearm.
- n.** Committed or attempted to commit a sexual assault as defined in Sec. 261, 266c, 286, 288, 288a, or 289 of the Penal Code or committed a sexual battery as defined in Section 243.4 of the Penal Code.
- o.** Harassed, threatened, or intimidated a pupil who is a complaining witness or witness in a school disciplinary proceeding for the purpose of either preventing the pupil from being a witness or retaliating against that pupil for being a witness, or both.
- p.** Unlawfully offered, arranged to sell, negotiated to sell, or sold the prescription drug Soma.
- q.** Engaged or attempted to engage in hazing.
- r.** Engaged in the act of bullying.
  - 1. Committed sexual harassment.
  - 2. Caused, attempted to cause, or participated in an act of hate violence.
  - 3. Created an intimidating or hostile educational environment by intentionally engaging in harassment, threats, or intimidation against a pupil or group of pupils.
  - 4. Terrorist threats against school officials, school property, or both.
- s.** Backpacks, binders, school supplies with "tagging" and/or graffiti are not allowed at school. Items of this nature will be confiscated and further violations will result in consequences.

The prevailing philosophy at Norte Vista High School is that students who are courteous and conduct themselves according to the rules of decency and common sense need few stated rules to guide this conduct. The entire staff is responsible for facilitating an environment that is conducive to proper individual and group behavior. The Norte Vista community views the teaching of self discipline as an essential part of the educational process.

## **ALTERCATION/FIGHTING**

Altercations, either physical or verbal, are disruptive to the educational process. All students involved are subject to disciplinary action and up to a five day suspension. A second fight or altercation may result in recommendation for expulsion. **Students involved in physical altercations will be suspended from school and a juvenile citation could be issued.**

## **BULLYING**

1. "Bullying" means any severe or pervasive physical or verbal act or conduct, including communications made in writing or by means of an electronic act, and including one or more acts committed by a pupil or group of pupils as defined in Section 48900.2, 48900.3, or 48900.4, directed toward one or more pupils that has or can be reasonably predicted to have the effect of one or more of the following:
  - a) Placing a reasonable pupil or pupils in fear of harm to that pupil's or those pupils' person or property.
  - b) Causing a reasonable pupil to experience a substantially detrimental effect on his or her physical or mental health.
  - c) Causing a reasonable pupil to experience substantial interference with his or her academic performance.
  - d) Causing a reasonable pupil to experience substantial interference with his or her ability to participate in or benefit from the services, activities, or privileges provided by a school.
2. "Electronic act" means the transmission of a communication, including, but not limited to, a message, text, sound, or image, or a post on a social network Internet Web site, by means of an electronic device, including, but not limited to, a telephone, wireless telephone or other wireless communication device, computer, or pager.
3. "Reasonable pupil" means a pupil, including, but not limited to, an exceptional needs pupil, who exercises average care, skill, and judgment in conduct for a person of his or her age, or for a person of his or her age with his or her exceptional needs.

## **CARE OF SCHOOL PROPERTY AND TAGGING/GRAFFITI**

Students are responsible for the proper care of all books, supplies and furniture supplied by the school. Students who destroy or vandalize school property will be required to pay for the damage. Students who attempt/commit tagging or graffiti on school property will be subject to suspension and/or expulsion from the Alford Unified School District and police may be contacted. Markers, white-out pens, etching tools, spray paint, laser pens, and slap tags are not allowed at school and will be confiscated and reported to the Riverside Police Department. Anyone who witnesses, or has information regarding tagging/graffiti, is encouraged to call 1-866-TAG-FREE or 787-7911 or go to the No Graffiti.com website.

## **COMPUTER USE**

COMPUTER USE IS A PRIVILEGE, NOT A RIGHT! Students must have an Electronic Information Agreement on file before being allowed onto the internet. The following rules must be obeyed: 1) Do only what you have been told to do; 2) Vandalism, making changes to the computer desktop, attempting to or accessing someone else's files, putting anything in the trash that isn't yours, removing the mouse, etc., will not be tolerated; 3) Loading of unauthorized software on a computer is a violation of licensing laws and is forbidden; 4) Report any suspected vandalism which you observe to your teacher "immediately"; 5) Students are to get permission from their teacher before going onto the internet; 6) Downloading any file without teacher approval is prohibited. The teacher may have additional rules in the classroom.

## **EMERGENCY DRILLS**

Drills are required by law and are an important safety precaution. Students are expected to give their immediate attention to the staff in charge and follow all of their directions.

## **DISTRIBUTION OF NON-SCHOOL MATERIALS**

No flyers, pamphlets, or any other materials will be passed out on any Alford School District site without the prior approval of the Superintendent of Schools.

## **GAMBLING**

Gambling is illegal in public schools throughout the State of California, therefore, it is not allowed on our campus. Violators are subject to disciplinary action. Playing cards, dice, or any gambling item, or game of chance, will be confiscated.

## **TRUANCY LAW / DAYTIME LOITERING**

Truancy is defined as an avoidable absence without the knowledge and consent of the student's Parent / Guardian / Teacher. The Riverside Police Department and Alford Unified run periodic truancy sweeps. It is important that parents/guardians and students understand that any student caught in a truancy sweep can be ticketed. The fine for a first time truancy is \$178.00 and \$267.00 for a second truancy with the possibility of probation for contempt of court.

It is unlawful for any minor under the age of 18 years, who is subject to compulsory education, to loiter, idle, wander, or be in, or upon, the public streets, roads, highways, alleys, parks, and playgrounds, or other public grounds, vacant buildings, or any unsupervised place during the operating school hours of the juvenile offender's school on days when the juvenile offender's school is in session. This law also applies to

minors that are suspended or expelled. **If a student does not have a class scheduled for 6<sup>th</sup> period, he/she is required to leave campus immediately following 5<sup>th</sup> period or they may be required to wait for their transportation in OCI.**

### **TEXTBOOKS**

Textbooks are issued without charge to students. Books must be returned at the end of the class (semester or year) or when the student withdraws from school. Responsibility for textbooks rests solely with the student to whom the books have been issued. It is not appropriate to leave your books and/or possessions with other students or unattended during lunch. Students will be charged for textbooks that are lost, stolen, or damaged beyond reasonable wear and tear. A student will not be issued another textbook until payment has begun on the book originally assigned to the student. School records may be withheld until all responsibilities are met. Payments for lost/damaged books will be made to the school.

### **OUT-OF-BOUNDS AREAS**

The service roads on the north side of campus and the football, baseball, and soccer fields are out-of-bounds to students during lunch. Out-of-bound areas are defined by a painted red line. The parking lots are out-of-bounds to students during the school day except for those students leaving campus for lunch.

### **SEARCHES AND USE OF TRAINED DOGS**

All persons entering this facility, or at any time while on school grounds, may be subject to search by school administrators using metal detectors. School administrators may conduct random searches in a classroom at any time. PE lockers and personal items such as backpacks, purses, and cars are subject to search by a school administrator. In an effort to keep the school free of drugs and firearms, the district may use specially trained, non-aggressive dogs to sniff out and alert staff to the presence of substances prohibited by law or district policy.

### **SELLING NON-SCHOOL ITEMS**

Students may not sell ANY items (e.g. candy) at school unless they are participating in a school-approved fundraiser. Violators will be subject to disciplinary action.

### **SEXUAL HARASSMENT**

The sexual harassment of any student by any other student or any district employee shall not be tolerated. Sexual harassment is a suspendable offense. Sexual harassment is defined as unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors, and other verbal, visual, or physical conduct of a sexual nature when this conduct meets specific criteria. The conduct must be considered by a reasonable person of the same gender as the victim to be sufficiently severe such that it has a negative impact upon the student's academic performance or to create an intimidating, hostile, or offensive educational environment. Any student or employee who is found guilty of sexual harassment shall be subject to disciplinary action. Students or staff are encouraged to report incidents of sexual harassment to the principal or assistant principals.

### **DRESS CODE**

The following Standard of Dress for Norte Vista High School has been developed with input from staff and parents. The **purpose of the Dress Code** is to insure personal safety, to create a positive learning environment, and to discourage classroom disruptions or distractions. Learning is a serious endeavor that must be undertaken without undue distractions. Outward appearances that are radical, unusual and draw specific attention to an individual are disruptive to the learning process and present a disruptive influence to the social interaction between students. Hair styles and clothing that depict recognition of specific groups or activities that represent an affiliation with anti-authoritarian, racial, ethnic or religious groups and other inappropriate behaviors **will not be allowed** on campus or during any Norte Vista High School activity. Modesty should be maintained by both genders at all times. In order to assist with the achievement of the goals for student success, the following is the suggested appropriate attire for Norte Vista High School:

### **SUGGESTED ATTIRE FOR GIRLS:**

A plain shirt, blouse, sweater with a collar and sleeves. The garment must cover the midriff when arms are raised and must have an appropriate neckline.

- ‡ A skirt, pair of pants or shorts of sufficient length to maintain modesty for sitting and bending.
- ‡ Shoes with an enclosed toe and heel. Roller skate shoes are not permitted.

### **SUGGESTED ATTIRE FOR BOYS:**

- ‡ A plain shirt or sweater with a collar and sleeves of appropriate size. Excessively baggy shirts are not appropriate.
- ‡ A pair of pants or shorts of appropriate waist size worn at the waist.
- ‡ Shoes with an enclosed toe and heel. Roller skate shoes are not permitted.

## REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL STUDENTS:

- Students are expected to be neat and clean. Modesty must be maintained at all times.
- Clothing, jewelry, and personal items (backpacks, notebooks, gym bags, water bottles, etc.) shall be free of writing, pictures or any other insignia which are crude, vulgar, profane or sexually suggestive, which bear drug, alcohol or tobacco company advertising, promotions and likenesses, or which advocate racial, ethnic or religious prejudice.
- Clothes shall be sufficient to conceal undergarments at all times. Skirts and shorts shorter than mid-thigh are prohibited. Baggy fitting and low-slung pants or shorts will not be allowed. Pants must be worn at the waist.
- Tank tops, aerobic style clothing, bare midriffs, halter tops, tube tops, net tops, see through clothing, spaghetti straps, and low cut necklines are not permitted.
- Students may not wear excessive make-up, hairdos, emblems or jewelry. Applying make-up or grooming in class is not allowed. Jewelry which creates a health and safety hazard is not permitted.
- Pajamas and slippers are not allowed to be worn at school.
- Gloves are not allowed to be worn at school unless the weather permits.
- Trendy hairdos draw undue attention to the individual and disrupt the teaching/learning process. Trendy hairdos, including unusual styles, bleaches, or dyes significantly different than the student's natural color, radical tints, and spiked hairstyles, including mini-spikes, are not allowed. Students with violations will be asked to correct them. Violations will be handled on campus when possible.
- Clothing and other personal possessions containing emblems, lettering, or pictures promoting gangs (including belt buckles with initials), tagging, drugs, alcohol, tobacco, sex, death, mutilation, violence, and messages with double meanings are not permitted.
- Clothing which has been altered in an inappropriate manner (torn, written on, or personalized) will not be allowed. No military/hunting camouflage is allowed.
- **Sunglasses, all hats of any kind including Beanies, stocking caps, hairnets, and bandannas are not allowed at school except with written permission from the administration.**
- Chains, including wallet chains, are not allowed.
- Facial piercing is unacceptable. Tattoos need to be covered.
- Gym/PE clothes may **not** be worn in classes other than in PE.

The administration and faculty of Norte Vista High School have the responsibility to administer the dress code and may make additional changes to the above items at any time during the school year. Dress code violations will result in disciplinary action.

### GUM

Norte Vista High School is a **gum free school**. Students who repeatedly demonstrate defiance by violating this policy will be referred to administration.

### ITEMS PROHIBITED IN SCHOOL

Problems arise each year because students bring items which interfere with school procedures. Items such as pagers, permanent markers, laser pointers, water pistols, balloons, photo albums, stuffed animals, toys, cameras, MP3 Players, IPODS, GameBoys, DS and PSP players, CD players, and tape recorders are not allowed at school and will be confiscated and can only be picked up by the student's parent/guardian.

**HELPFUL HINT: If it is not needed for your class, do not bring it to school.** Cell phones may be used only on campus before school, passing periods, lunch time and after school and in the case of a school emergency. Cell phones must be turned off and out of view during instructional time.

### PERMISSION TO LEAVE CLASS

During the time classes are in session, ***NO STUDENTS SHOULD BE OUT OF CLASS WITHOUT WEARING A GREEN SAFETY VEST CHECKED OUT FROM THE TEACHER OF THE CLASS THEY ARE IN FOR THAT PERIOD.*** Students who are found out of class, without wearing the vest will be considered truant and will receive consequences.

# NORTE VISTA HIGH SCHOOL'S BEHAVIORAL INTERVENTIONS

## **DETENTION**

Students with undesirable patterns of conduct or attendance will be assigned detention. Detentions may be assigned by any staff member. Failure to serve assigned detentions will automatically result in the student being placed on the Exclusion List. The student will remain on the Exclusion List until the detention responsibility is served by the student. Students who are assigned after school detentions are responsible for their own transportation home.

## **ON CAMPUS INTERVENTION (OCI) PROGRAM**

The purpose of OCI is to remove students from the classroom when their behavior is continually defiant and/or disruptive to the educational process. Students who have gone through each step of a TEAM'S/TEACHER'S DISCIPLINE PLAN or whose behavior is such that it warrants immediate removal from the classroom will be sent to OCI with a referral. A consequence will occur each time a student receives an OCI referral. The severity, or seriousness, of the offense will determine the consequence received by the student. Each time a student is referred to OCI, a parent/guardian will be contacted by both the classroom referring teacher and the OCI teacher. Students who repeatedly misbehave and disrupt learning may ultimately be referred to an alternate educational placement.

## **SCHOOL ATTENDANCE REVIEW BOARD (SARB)**

The purpose of SARB is to divert students with attendance problems from the Juvenile Justice System by providing guidance and coordinated community services. SARB attempts to help the student and the family to solve problems by using community resources. If SARB is unable to solve problems at its level, the student and parent/guardian may be issued a citation and will be required to appear in court.

## **SPECIAL PROGRAMS AND ACTIVITIES**

### **ACADEMIC HONORS**

Special activities will be held during the year to reward and recognize those Norte Vista High School students who demonstrate outstanding academic achievement. Students receive progress reports every 6 weeks.

### **PERFECT ATTENDANCE INCENTIVE PROGRAM**

Students who have perfect attendance will be recognized and eligible to win various prizes and attend special activities throughout the school year. To qualify for perfect attendance, a student must demonstrate the following: no absences, no tardiness, and no early dismissals.

### **STUDENT COUNCIL (ASB)**

This branch appropriates and administers student body funds. It approves dates, plans for activities and schedules them on the master calendar. Other responsibilities include chartering clubs and organizations, organizing Homecoming and Spirit Week, directing all activities of the student body and legislating rules for students, clubs, and organizations.

### **ADVANCEMENT VIA INDIVIDUAL DETERMINATION (AVID)**

AVID is a program designed to support students using a variety of strategies to complete the necessary high school courses to meet 4-year college/university entrance requirements.

### **CONFLICT MEDIATION**

Peer counselors are trained to provide conflict mediation for students who are having difficulty solving problems. Students learn to resolve issues and agree to positive resolutions.

### **FORMAL DANCES**

There are two formal dances each year. The **Winter Formal** is open to ALL students, and ALL students are highly encouraged to participate. Winter Formal will be held on Friday, January 19, 2018, from 7pm – 11pm at Eagle Glen Golf Club located at 1800 Eagle Glen Pkwy, Corona, CA 92883. The attire is evening wear and must be deemed appropriate by the school administration or admittance to the dance may be refused. This event is hosted/sponsored by A.S.B. The second formal dance is the **Junior/Senior Prom**. It is open to Juniors and Seniors and their dates. The PROM will be held on Friday, April 13, 2018 from 8pm to 12am at the House of Blues in Anaheim, CA. Guests must be cleared through the Activities Office in advance. No guest **22** years of age or older will be approved. No guests younger than **14** or having less than 9<sup>th</sup> grade status will be approved. **Proper Student ID is required at all dances. All guest passes must be turned in one week prior to the event.**

## **GLOBAL CITIZENS**

Norte Vista's Global Citizens class provides a GLOBAL perspective and understanding for students and connects them with other students and events throughout Riverside and the Globe. This course is an A-G approved course, and provides students with an experience that is BOTH unique and informative.

## **INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE**

The International Baccalaureate (IB) offers high quality programs of international education to a worldwide community of schools. The program helps to develop the intellectual, personal, emotional and social skills required to live, learn and work in a rapidly globalizing world.

## **LEADERSHIP COUNCIL**

Leadership Council is comprised of ASB, Global Citizens, Link Crew, P.A.L.S. / P.L.U.S. and Renaissance. These **5** student leadership groups oversee the academic and social activities held at Norte Vista High School. All **5** groups meet daily during 4<sup>th</sup> period, and collaborate as an entire Leadership Council periodically throughout the year during ASB Senate and other meetings.

## **LINK CREW**

Link Crew Leaders exist at Norte Vista to help freshmen students make the transition from middle school to high school. They want new students to feel welcome. Leaders will be in classrooms throughout the year facilitating activities that send positive messages to freshmen. They'll also be coordinating fun events during and after school.

## **PADRES UNIDOS (UNITED PARENTS)**

Padres Unidos is an organization formed in 1974 at Norte Vista High School. Padres Unidos is the only organization of Spanish speaking parents which has remained active in the Alvord Unified School District for 31 years. The group is dedicated to better communication among the Hispanic parents of Norte Vista High School students. They are a key factor in fulfilling the needs of the students, school, and community. They maintain open communication lines between parents and school administration. The group also participates in raising funds on campus and at community events for scholarships to benefit Hispanic students.

## **PEER ASSISTANCE LEADERSHIP (PAL'S)**

Peer Assistance Leadership training is a powerful resource that promotes the well being of peer helpers, the school and community as a whole. Students are trained in effective communication skills, (i.e.) attention, empathy, summarizing, questioning, genuineness, and problem solving. Trained students then offer support and assist adolescents who seek assistance in dealing with personal issues. PAL's are trained in conflict mediation techniques. They also organize unity forums.

## **RENAISSANCE**

The Renaissance Program is designed to celebrate and recognize Staffulty and Student Achievement BOTH in Academics and Attendance. In order to achieve their primary goal, Renaissance provides a variety of programs throughout the year that emphasizes the importance of maintaining high academic and attendance achievement, which all culminates with the End of the Year Academic Rally & Pool Party. All students recognized during the End of the Year Academic Rally are invited to participate in the End of the Year Pool Party which occurs from Lunch through 6<sup>th</sup> Period.

## **CAREER & COLLEGE READY THURSDAYS**

As we continue to focus on having All of our students Career and College ready, we are designating EVERY Thursday as Career and College Ready Thursday. Students are encouraged to dress professionally, as they would for a job or college interview or as a professional in a career. This would include dress slacks, a collared shirt and tie, jacket, blazer, skirt, blouse, professional dress, etc.

## **CAREER TECHNICAL EDUCATION**

The Riverside County Office of Education/Career Technical Education Department offers CTE/ROP college and career preparation training to high school and adult students who are residents of Riverside County. Several programs are offered in Alvord Unified School District high schools. The programs that are available at Norte Vista High School are: Computer Information Systems/CIS Tools - 1 & 2, Green Construction Technology, and Retail Sales & Marketing.

## **GUIDANCE AND COUNSELING SERVICES**

The Norte Vista High School Guidance Office is open from 7:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. The counselors are equipped to help students with conflict resolution, crisis counseling, referral services, financial aid, scholarships, and career and college planning. Students can see their counselors before and after school and at lunch without an appointment. To see a counselor at any other time, a student must make an appointment.

### **ALTERNATIVE MEANS OF EARNING CREDIT**

Credit may be earned outside the regular classroom in a number of ways. These include Work Experience, the Regional Occupational Program (ROP), Community Service, Nova Net, and others. See your counselor for a complete explanation of opportunities and restrictions.

### **CAREER CENTER / WORK EXPERIENCE**

The Norte Vista Career Center / Work Experience Office is located adjacent to the Guidance Office and contains a wealth of information. There are videos, audio cassettes, folders, and booklets on jobs, careers, schools, training and much more. Work Experience education is an elective program the purpose of which is to help students select and prepare for a career. The job site is the class setting and the supervisor is the teacher. Credit is awarded for learning on the job, not just for having the job. Additional job related information is presented to students in a weekly Work Experience class which deals with the essential skills of getting a job, keeping a job, leaving a job and economic awareness. If you have questions about the world of work, the Career Center/Work Experience Office is the place for you.

### **GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS**

Norte Vista High School graduation requirements, in conjunction with the Alvord Unified School District, are designed to be completed within a four-year (or less) period of time. Students are classified according to credits earned: Freshman (grade 9) 0-54; sophomore (grade 10) 55-109; junior (grade 11) 110-164 and senior (grade 12) 165-220. Students not meeting all graduation requirements in this time, or reaching the age of 18 without graduating, should seek alternatives to meeting their educational goals through the Graduate Equivalent Diploma (GED) or adult school diploma program. A student must earn a minimum of 220 credits in grades nine through twelve to graduate from Norte Vista High School.

### **IN ADDITION:**

All students must take an English class each semester.

All freshmen must enroll in PE and pass the State Physical Education Test.

- Complete your planner / calendar DAILY for EACH class. This should include homework assignments, future quizzes / tests, long term projects and extracurricular activities.

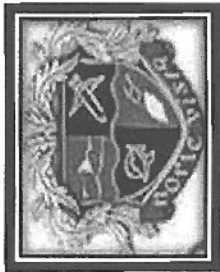
#### **3.) Course Dividers** (write the name of each of your classes on the divider tab)
