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On Monday, August 10, 2020, the Alvord Unified School District begins the 2020-21 school year with fully remote instruction.

As a result of local public health conditions related to COVID-19, AUSD will begin the school year with no in-person instruction. Riverside County remains on the State's "Watch-List" and all school districts in the County are planning distance learning.

Students in AUSD chose between two models: Hybrid and Virtual (Full Distance).

Hybrid - a blend of in-person and distance learning with no more than 50% of students present on campus at any given time. When school reopens for the physical return of students, those who chose this model will attend school, in-person, twice a week. Approximately 13,000 students chose this model.

Virtual (Full Distance) - No in-person instruction. Fully remote. Students who chose this model will receive all instruction remotely from certificated AUSD teachers for at least the first semester. Approximately 4,600 students chose this model.
