4. **Ward 6 Update:** Councilman Jim Perry provided the following update on recent activities and accomplishments in Ward 6:

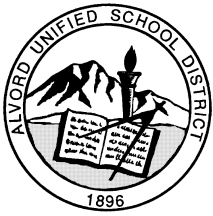

Board/Superintendent Comments:

Carolyn M. Wilson ~ Mrs. Wilson thanked Mike Kolonics for his suggestions and stated that the highlight of her Board ship is being on campuses and hearing presentations such as the one given earlier today by Traci Vaughn on the AVID Program. It is amazing to go out and see the positive, productive things going on at the schools. Read Across America as a wonderful experience today along with observing a School Site Council Meeting at Lake Hills Elementary School. It was a very interesting meeting with a large number of participants and it was good to see how they reviewed and passed their plan for the year. Mrs. Wilson met with Susana Lopez today and learned a lot. Mrs. Wilson has school site visits scheduled this month and is looking forward to those visits. Mrs. Wilson stated that there are two wonderful women in the audience, Debbi Mitchell and Donna Webster who contacted her with their concerns about the homeless and hungry students. A meeting was held this week with Sandy Fielding, a student from her site, Dr. Salazar and Eric Holliday. We're going to start feeding and taking care of our homeless and hungry population, and a presentation and resolution will be coming to the Board in April.

Julie A. Moreno ~ Mrs. Moreno attended the Reach Higher Event at Hillcrest High School and she was not prepared for the eye opening experiences shared by the students. Mrs. Moreno stated that the students showed a lot of courage sharing their stories. Mrs. Moreno left there feeling that there is so much work that has to be done for our students. Mrs. Moreno appreciates being a part of the District, because there are great things going on and a lot of work that still needs to be done. Mrs. Moreno participated in Read Across America and enjoyed the smart TK students. Mrs. Moreno enjoyed today's AVID presentation and thanked Traci Vaughn for the information. The LCAP meeting was informative but we need to get the word out about the meetings.

Robert Schwandt ~ Mr. Schwandt recognized Terrace PTA for donating funds to Terrace Elementary School for student study trips. Mr. Schwandt was impressed by the AVID presentation and stated that it is a very good program and he was amazed at the higher percentage of college-going students. Mr. Schwandt referred to the questions related to the Bond funds and stated he would like to get an answer for the group. Mr. Schwandt attended the LCAP meeting and was disappointed that there were not a lot of people there. These meetings are a great opportunity for the community to provide input. Mr. Schwandt encouraged staff to get the word out to staff and students. Mr. Schwandt stated that the Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) made a presentation to the Board last month and the Board expressed their concerns. The DTSC is still conducting tests and we were given assurances the PCBs concerns were not falling on deaf ears. Mr. Schwandt had a great day and Stokoe Elementary School and he thanked them for his hat.

Art Kaspereen, Jr. ~ Mr. Kaspereen thanked Katie Chapman for doing a great job at the District's Science Fair and Angelica Hurtado for coordinating and conducting the LCAP Meeting.

Joseph Barragan ~ Mr. Barragan stated in four days he has visited 11 school sites and saw a lot of great things going on. The Kids' Market was great and a unique opportunity for student to go home with produce for their families. Mr. Barragan visited Valley View Elementary School for Read Across America and stated the parent engagement was amazing, with parents reading to students. Terrace Elementary School is always an amazing school to visit, his brother attends Terrace and he has a wonderful teachers. Their Dual Immersion Language program is a great program. There were kinder students who were not Hispanic that know more Spanish than Mr. Barragan. Mr. Barragan was impressed by the Alvord Alternative Continuation High School and Jason Marquez, the students attending that school do not have disciplinary problems, they are there to get back on track. Mr. Barragan stated that Valley View Elementary School opened in 1989 and several bonds have been passed with promises to eliminate portables; however, Valley View is built completely with portables. The promises that were made, are empty promises and that is sad. Many schools still have portables and other schools received preference. It is sad that students are still in portables and not in modern classrooms. Mr. Barragan thanked Arlanza and Terrace elementary schools and Sheri Lazzrini at La Sierra High School, who arranged for him to read during Read Across America. Mr. Barragan stated that his heart is at Norte Vista High School and he is concerned about the state of disrepair the school is in. Norte Vista needs to be made a priority and the District needs to fulfill the promises made when the community was asked to vote for the bonds. The District also needs to put more money into maintenance. Mr. Barragan stated that he is glad to see more people are attending the Board meetings; however, he feels they are attending for the wrong reasons. Mr. Barragan does not see the union protecting their teachers they are working in classrooms with mold. Site administrators need more classroom space. This District Office building tells us it is not a priority. Mr. Barragan asked where the union president was when two schools were identified as having possible toxic soil. Mr. Barragan stated that the Department of Toxic Substances Control has lied multiple times and Alvord students have been exposed to toxic chemicals since 2003. Mr. Barragan stated that this District should take the lead and talk to the State Senator.

Dr. Salazar ~ Dr. Salazar shared a slide show of his classroom visits today where he read to students during Read Across America. Dr. Salazar commended all administrators, teachers and support staff who continue to promote equity and literacy.
