



## The top ten priority standards in the areas of reading, writing, and math.

## Reading 10 Things

- 1. Recognize letters and corresponding sounds (consonants and vowels)
- 2. Onsets and rimes, identify initial sounds, blend 2-3 phonemes (CVC CVCC)
- 3. Concepts of print
- 4. Decode in isolation and within context.
- 5. High frequency words
- 6. Manipulate phonemes (Nip -> nap, him -> ham)
- 7. Who? What? Where? When? Why? How?
- 8. Retelling fiction and nonfiction texts.
- 9. TDQ's: ask and answer questions about unknown words and details.
- 10. Compare and contrast: characters, settings, themes, details, and ideas.

## Writing 10 Things

- 1. Use drawing, dictation, and writing to express opinions, narrative, and informational texts.
- 2. Shared writing
- 3. Simple sentences
- 4. Sequencing

## Math 10 Things

- 1. Count to 100 by 1's and 10's.
- 2. Count forward from any number.
- 3. Write numbers 0-20.
- 4. One to one correspondence, quantity in a set of objects, know 0 equals no objects.
- 5. Understand the concept of <, >, and =
- 6. Decompose numbers within 19.
- 7. Solve addition and subtraction word problems.
- 8. Identify, classify, describe, and compare objects by attributes, including shapes.
- 9. Analyze, compare, create, and compose shapes.
