Part of the power of poetry comes from the poet's use of sound devices. These include rhyme and rhythm, **alliteration** (repetition of consonant sounds at the beginning of words), **repetition** (repeated words or phrases), and **assonance** (repetition of vowel sounds within words that don't rhyme). Look for examples of repeated sounds in the poems. Write them in the chart.
