Guidebook for the Reopening of ASA Thrive 2020-2021 School Year





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Letter from Dr. Cognetta

Dear Allegiance Families:

The responsibility of Allegiance STEAM Academy (ASA) is to provide a high-quality learning environment for our students. To meet this responsibility, ASA must also provide for the health and safety of students and staff. Developing a reopening plan requires a balancing of educational needs against health and safety concerns, all within the context of ongoing health and economic uncertainty. Providing live and on-site instruction is our preference and priority and will be done in a way that mitigates risk to students, staff, and the community. This guide is designed to create and communicate a system for ensuring the best health and safety standards are met to keep students on campus as much as possible as well as to prepare for the possibility of future school closures.

Within this document we provide you not only our safety precautions and reopening plans, but also an outline of our possible educational models, including traditional instruction, hybrid, distance learning, as well as the home-based learning option. It is our hope the information provided will give you information needed to make the best selection for your children. ASA will reopen and, throughout the 2020-2021 school year, offer the educational model that corresponds to the Governor's Resilience Roadmap. Any of the school-based protocols, procedures, or precautions included in this guidebook apply to all of the educational models described herein.

In developing our reopening plans, we are relying on the most current information and guidance from the Center for Disease Control (CDC), the California Department of Public Health (CDPH), the California Department of Education (CDE), the San Bernardino County Department of Public Health (SBCDPH), and the Chino Valley Unified School District (CVUSD). Additionally, this guidebook and our reopening plans are in compliance with Senate Bill 98 which was signed into law by Governor Newsom on June 29, 2020. The safety procedures within this guidebook are aimed to mitigate, not eliminate risk. No set of actions will completely eliminate the risk of COVID-19 transmission, but implementation of several coordinated and common sense efforts can greatly reduce risk.

Covid-19 is still an evolving situation, and changes in public policy as a response to increases or decreases in cases, responsiveness, or fatalities are to be expected. ASA has a responsibility to follow all protocols and guidelines released by state and county agencies. As updates in guidelines reach ASA, we will continue to update you as earliest as possible.

Returning to School- What Can You Expect?

When the 2020-2021 school year begins, regardless of educational model, on-campus school will look much different than the past due to new health and safety measures.

At Home

We strongly encourage families to **take temperatures daily** before coming to school. Students with fevers of 100.3° or higher should not come to school.

We strongly encourage you to **screen for respiratory symptoms** such as cough and shortness of breath each day. Students experiencing those symptoms should not attend school.



Personal illness, quarantine, and COVID-19 illness or symptom-related absences will be excused.

At School

Students and staff members will be required to wear **face coverings.***

Temperature checks will be conducted upon arrival to campus.

Visitors will have **limited access to campus**, including no access to classrooms.

ASA will designate **routes for entry and exit** from campus to limit direct contact.

Signage throughout campus will remind everyone about distancing and hand-washing.

Additional **health and safety equipment** is being secured, including but not limited to hand-washing stations and no-touch thermometers, as supply chains allow.

Face Coverings



In accordance with CDPH Guidance for Face Coverings and the Governor's June 29, 2020 revised Executive Order, students and staff must utilize face coverings while on campus (except when eating or while outdoors at recess or PE when maintaining a physical distance of 6 feet from others).

The following individuals are exempt from wearing a face covering:

- Persons with a medical condition, mental health condition, or disability that prevents wearing a face covering. This includes persons with a medical condition for whom wearing a face covering could obstruct breathing or who are unconscious, incapacitated, or otherwise unable to remove a face covering without assistance.
- Persons who are hearing impaired, or communicating with a person who is hearing impaired, where the ability to see the mouth is essential for communication.
- Persons for whom wearing a face covering would create a risk to the person related to their work, as determined by local, state, or federal regulators or workplace safety guidelines.
- Persons who are obtaining a service involving the nose or face for which temporary removal of the face covering is necessary to perform the service.

Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)

Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) will be provided to staff and students. Identified staff members will receive a reusable face shield. Gloves are not recommended for use by students or staff, with the exception of those conducting cleaning, food service, or first aid. School issued PPE is exclusively for school use and must be returned or discarded (with staff approval) daily.

PPE is provided by the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (CalOES), CVUSD, and ASA.

Other Safety Considerations

- All staff will complete mandated COVID-19 online training in addition to other required training as conditions of their employment.
- ASA will follow CVUSD, CDPH, and CDC guidelines for cleaning, disinfection, and ventilation of campus.
- Common touch surfaces will be cleaned regularly.
- Physical plexi-glass barriers will be installed in front office areas where face-to-face interaction with the public occurs.
- Everyone on campus will be expected to wash their hands regularly.
- Every classroom will be provided hand sanitizer to use.
- Sharing of school supplies will be limited to the extent possible and students will be encouraged to take home personal items daily for cleaning.
- Students are encouraged to bring refillable water bottles.
- Playground equipment will be regularly inspected and cleaned.



Physical Distancing



ASA will adhere to the following strategies to maintain physical distancing as much as possible:

- Visitors and volunteers will have restricted access to campus and will not be allowed in classrooms.
- Campus is not open to outside groups.
- Group activities will be limited wherever practicable (i.e.: assemblies, award ceremonies, athletics).
- Classroom space will be arranged to remove non-essential furniture, allowing maximum space for students and staff.
- Student desks will be arranged to reduce contact.
- Routes will be designated for entry and exit to lunch, recess, and other transition times, as feasible.
- Staff will be asked to practice physical distancing, including but not limited to, the following:
 - When working indoors or outdoor areas
 - Before and after the work shift
 - Coming and going from vehicles
 - Entering, working, and exiting physical buildings or other structures
 - During breaks and lunch periods



Students will have access to playground equipment during recess, but will be encouraged to maintain physical distancing where possible.




School meals will be served in individually plated or boxed meals. Students will eat lunch in designated lunch areas.

The guide below is an overview of the most important daily protocols to be followed by all staff, students, and community members.





Learning Models



The following models are designed to provide in-person instruction to the greatest extent possible while adhering to local health and safety guidelines. The models correspond to California's Resilience Roadmap. For students who are medically fragile, at risk, or self-quarantining due to COVID-19 exposure, an at-home learning option will be available for the 2020-2021 school year.

All Enrichment Offered



Home-based Learning Option

Definition: The ASA Home-based Learning program provides digital/virtual live academic daily instruction. This learning program is an option where students are enrolled by parent choice at each trimester. (At the trimester, students who are enrolled in this program have the option of transitioning to the Hybrid Learning model or the Traditional model, if available.) Students virtually attend daily face-to-face instruction with a certificated grade-level appropriate teacher. Fridays are reserved for intervention and small group instruction, as well as some enrichment classes. All ASA enrichment courses will be offered.

Available by parent choice during Hybrid or Traditional models.

Instruction is aligned to grade level standards at a level of quality and intellectual challenge substantially equivalent to in-person instruction.

All students will be provided **connectivity and/or devices** in an effort to provide adequate participation in the educational program.

All students will be **required to complete assigned work** as provided by the certificated classroom teacher and attend class daily through a virtual learning platform.

Students will be graded with accuracy and integrity.

Instruction includes **academic and other supports** for all of the following: students not performing at grade level; special education students and related services required per IEPs with necessary accommodations; English Language Learner education; students in foster care/homeless; and students requiring mental health support.

Daily participation and **attendance** will be documented.



Social Emotional Support

ASA is committed to supporting the social and emotional well-being of all students. Support shall include daily or weekly lessons incorporating building relationships, community building, and increased access to mental health/wellness resources. Social Emotional Lessons are organized using ASA's Wolves' Ways.

Appendix

Students that present symptoms while at school:

- Students will go to a designated isolation area until they can be picked up by a parent or guardian.
- ASA will coordinate with CVUSD and SBCDPH regarding suspected and confirmed cases.
 SBCDPH will be responsible for working directly with the individual and families for notification and contact tracing.
- SBCDPH will assist ASA to determine a course of action should a student or staff member test positive for COVID-19 on a case-by-case basis. This may include dismissal of students and most staff for a short period of 1-3 days.
- Note: Parents should be prepared to pick up their student(s) immediately in the instance they develop COVID-19 symptoms while at school. Please be sure to provide ASA updated emergency contact information.

COVID-19 Protocol & Notification


Should a positive COVID-19 case occur at school, the following protocols will be followed:

- In accordance with state and local laws and regulations, school administrators will notify
 local health officials, staff, and families immediately of any case of COVID-19 while
 maintaining confidentiality in accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and
 Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA).
- Inform those who have had close contact with a person diagnosed with COVID-19 to self
 monitor for symptoms, and follow state and local guidance if symptoms develop. ASA
 students, staff, and families who have been potentially exposed to a positive COVID19 case
 will be notified. These notifications will be completed by administration, in consultation with
 the school health technician (for students), by phone with follow-up written correspondence
 which will include:
 - o If known, date of potential exposure
 - Information on incubation period and safety protocols that help to limit exposure (hand washing, face coverings, physical distancing)
 - Phone numbers to schedule an appointment at a local testing site
- Students:
 - Return to school protocols when applicable



In addition, positive COVID-19 cases may lead to the closure of a classroom, multiple classrooms, or even the entire school. This will be determined by ASA administration with direction from CVUSD and the SBCDPH (see below).

Resolution 2020/2021:1 - COVID-19 Emergency Response

Background

In December 2019 an outbreak of respiratory illness due to a novel coronavirus (a disease now known as COVID-19) was identified and has impacted more than 100 countries including the United States. As of July 10, 2020, there are over 3,000,000 confirmed cases of COVID-19 in the United States, including 300,000 in California. Dating back to March 4, 2020, Governor Gavin Newsom declared a State of Emergency to enable State and local agencies to more effectively respond to the threat of the spread of COVID-19. On March 10, 2020, the San Bernardino County Public Health Officer and the Board of Supervisors declared a local health emergency due to COVID-19. On March 11, 2020, the World Health Organization officially declared COVID-19 a global pandemic.

As such, it is recommended the Board of Directors take the following actions related to the emergency conditions related to the novel coronavirus (COVID-19):

- 1. Authorize the CEO and/or designee to take any and all actions necessary to ensure the continuation of public education, and the health and safety of the students and staff at the school, including, but not limited to: provision of alternative educational program options; limiting visitors and volunteers to the school.
- 2. Adopt this Resolution declaring emergency conditions exist at ASA Thrive community as a result of the threat of COVID-19 virus.
- 3. Authorize the CEO and/or designee(s):
- a. in consultation with the local public health department, to consider if school closure is warranted and length of time based on the risk level within the specific community as determined by the local public health officer.
- b. align with the COVID-19 plans of Chino Valley Unified School District, including school closures.

Staff anticipates that the Board of Directors will adopt this resolution declaring that emergency conditions exist at ASA Thrive. It is further anticipated that the Board of Directors will authorize the CEO to take any and all actions necessary to ensure the health and safety of students and staff and to ensure public education continues to be provided to the students.

<u>Recommendation</u> It is recommended the Board of Education adopt this resolution needed to take any and all necessary actions to prepare and respond effectively to COVID-19.

<u>Fiscal Impact</u> Unknown at this	time.
