SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Student Council Delegates reported that BHS Presents was held on April 17-18, 2015. They also reported on events in the Art, Science Theater/Fine Arts, Music, DECA, English and Panther Tales/Visions Departments. Mr. D'Amico reviewed the work of the Curriculum Committee and also reviewed the new Regents pathways for graduation.
