## **Building Our Schools**

Construction documents and permitting are well underway for the BHS addition and modernization project. This project has been awarded \$447,243 through grants that honor designs featuring low impact development and state *High Performance School Building Program* protocols.

The 2006 school construction and renovation bond included funds to upgrade the district's phone system. The technology staff completed this system upgrade over winter break, improving our schools' communications and emergency response capabilities. District staff members also are working with the community and O'Connor Architects to build a new BISD maintenance facility. Schematic designs for this new building were presented to the School Board on January 11th.



## Budget Corner

Bainbridge Island public schools receive funding from state, federal and local sources. Approximately 19% of the school district's annual budget comes from local levies. A Renewal Educational Programs & Operations Levy is on the February 6 ballot. This is a replacement of the levy that will expire in December 2007.

**THANKS TO** a partnership between the Bainbridge Island School District and the Naval Undersea Museum Foundation - Science Education Alliance (NUMF-SEA), our students have access to cutting edge technology, local experts, and engaging hands-on science projects.

NUMF-SEA builds relationships with the region's corporate and naval resources to create a menu of opportunities for local students. The goal is to foster a deeper interest in applied math and science fields by creating real-world connections to classroom learning.

Bainbridge Island public schools take advantage of several of NUMF-SEA's programs, including the SEA Marine Outreach Program (grades K-6), the Boat-Museum Field Experience (grades 3-6), the NavOps Deep Submergence Program (6th grade), and the high school's ROV Program (grades 11-12).

At Bainbridge High School, two-student teams design, build, and test an underwater Remotely Operated Vehicle (ROV), then use their ROV to search for and bring up items from the bottom of a full-sized swimming pool, using only their vehicle's on-board camera for visibility.

Knowledge Master Open is a timed, computerized challenge, in which national and international teams of students compete. In December, two hundred challenging questions that require higher level thinking skills and cover 14 curricular areas arrived at Woodward Middle School. In a two-hour period after school, the Woodward KMO team answered 190 of those questions correctly and attained first place in Washington State. Out of 720 middle schools that participated, Woodward ranked #24.
