Application Process

Thank you for your interest in Eagle Harbor High School. EHHS is a public school of choice within the Bainbridge Island School District. EHHS offers students a tight-knit, personalized, non-traditional learning environment where students have a voice in determining what and how they learn. This is a different environment than other district schools and, as such, EHHS may not be the right fit for all students.

- Upon notification of acceptance, registration online with the Bainbridge Island School District will be required for anyone not already currently enrolled with BISD.
- If Eagle Harbor High receives more applications than is able to admit during the priority enrollment period, a lottery may be conducted.

*Out of District Families —All Out of District applications are processed later in the school year. Out of District applications that are received before the March 18th deadline will have priority consideration over the Out of District applications that are received after March 18th. Out of District families also need to complete the Choice Transfer Request online through the Choice Transfer Portal - https://eds.ospi.k12.wa.us/ChoiceTransferRequest The Choice Transfer request takes time to process and needs to be completed and approved by your district before we can process it. If you submit an application by March 18th but do not complete the Choice Transfer soon enough you may lose your priority consideration. We need both to enroll your student.

Frequently Asked Questions:

Why do students choose to attend Eagle Harbor High School?

We are a school of choice, and believe that there is not one model of school that meets all student learning styles. Just as when students look at colleges, some select large universities and some select small colleges. Students select our programs because they flourish in the small schools model of learning.

How is EHHS different from Bainbridge High School?

EHHS has a smaller learning environment that allows students and staff to work closely together to develop a more individualized academic program. For example, a student may have the same teacher more than once during their high school years. The smaller learning environment, however, does not translate into smaller class sizes. Class size is generally equal to a BHS class size. EHHS provides opportunities for more self-directed learning through the independent contract study program.

What type of student attends?

Our students select Commodore because of our diverse learning opportunities and strong teaching team. We are not the traditionally viewed "alternative school" but a model with academic flexibility and academic options. Our best testimony is in our graduates, who are now attending in a broad range of higher education schools ranging from Emery-Riddle Aeronautical University, California Institute of the Arts, Hamline U., U. of Washington and Evergreen to Seattle & Olympic Community Colleges, art schools, and apprenticeships.

Are students with individualized education programs (IEPs) served at choice schools?

Yes. Choice schools are open to all students. As a public school within Bainbridge Island School District, Eagle Harbor does not discriminate against students based on race, creed, color, national origin, religion, sex, sexual orientation including gender expression or identity, the presence of any sensory, mental, or physical disability, or the use of a trained dog guide or service animal by a student with a disability.

Choice schools will ask parents/students if a student has an IEP. The IEP describes the services that are needed to support the student. Not all services are available at all schools within the Bainbridge Island School District. The IEP team, which includes the parents, will make any location or change of service decisions. All decisions are made in accordance with federal and state laws, and district procedures.

After attending a small school, how does a student transition into a larger school community?

We find our students are very successful transitioning into larger schools. Our graduates regularly tell us how well prepared they are for college. Because our program emphasizes the self-directed learner, our students are capable learners in any setting.

Can students attend classes at Bainbridge High School while enrolled at EHHS?

Yes. One of the advantages of enrollment is that students have access to classes at BHS with one exception. If the seat-based course is offered at EHHS, the class must be taken at EHHS.

Can students attend classes at Eagle Harbor and still participate in extra curricular activities at other schools?

Yes. We have students who participate in sports at Bainbridge High School as well as a number of club activities.

Do the school buses transport students to Commodore?

Yes. Students utilize the same bus routes as Woodward and BHS.

Do the programs at Commodore charge tuition?

No. We are a public school program of the Bainbridge Island School District.

BHS ELECTIVES

A BHS elective will only be scheduled if it does not conflict with Math, English, Social Studies, or Science at EHHS. BHS Choir and Band only have a single section and can conflict with the EHHS schedule. We try our best to make it work but there are no guarantees.



P.E. - Lifetime Fitness

Length/Credit - Semester/0.5 credit

Good old-fashioned PE! We get together and play games and sports. We also explore fitness concepts involved with sports. Students need 1.5 credits (3 semesters) of PE to graduate.

Production Arts

Length/Credit - Semester/0.5 credit (CTE or Fine Art Credit)

Production Arts or Ceramics is a pre-requisite for Independent Studies in Art

Production Arts is a hands-on studio art class where students become visually literate thinkers and creators as they examine, produce, and present original work. They use aesthetic criteria to analyze and respond to art and make connections across disciplines, cultures, place, and time. They study career paths related to the visual arts, learn to put together an art portfolio, and participate in a student art show. This class is designed to allow students to explore a variety of art making techniques, learn technical art skills, and expand their knowledge of the working arts. Lessons include drawing, printmaking, painting, ceramic arts, art to wear (textiles & jewelry), career exploration and community engagement. Class

Ceramics I

Length/Credit - Semester/0.5 credit (CTE or Fine Art Credit)

Production Arts or Ceramics is a pre-requisite for Independent Studies in Art

This class is an introduction to ceramics. You will learn basic skills necessary to produce sculptural and functional pottery. Hand building techniques such as slab, coil, pinch and hand modeling, will be emphasized. Basic throwing on the potter's wheel will also be introduced. Students will study historical and contemporary ceramic artists and apply their work to projects created in class. Glazing techniques and surface design will also be emphasized in the finished pieces. Creativity and student involvement and use of media is important to this class. All projects are created in a studio environment where students will also learn basic safety of tools and machinery.

American Sign Language I - This is a possible new class for 2022-2023 Length/Credit – Year Long/1.0 credit

American Sign Language 1 (ASL) introduces students to this visual/gestural language and the community of people that use it. You will learn the basic vocabulary, grammar, and culturally appropriate uses of ASL through natural, everyday conversational situations. In order to progress, it is important that students become comfortable using their bodies and "listening" with their eyes. To encourage and foster the development of these skills, voicing in the classroom will be minimal. The overall goals of ASL I are for students to understand basic dialogues on a variety of everyday topics of conversation and feel comfortable being able to converse in the language, as well as being aware of Deaf culture and the general rules within the community.

Length/Credit - Semester/0.5 credit

This is a student-centered course, which addresses both individual academic support needs of each student within the collective learning environment of the classroom as well as preparing students for independent study contracts.
