

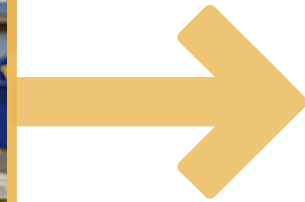

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS:

### What is the birthday cutoff to be a kindergartner?

Children must be five years old by August 31st.

### What is the kindergarten schedule?

Except for the first three days of the school year, kindergartners follow the same school calendar and schedule as other elementary students. They ride the bus and eat lunch at school, just like the older grades.

The first three days of the school year are different. Instead of regular school days, kindergartners and parents/guardians participate in kindergarten readiness activities and a get-to-know-you conference.

Elementary schools start at 7:50 a.m. and dismiss at 12:50 p.m. on Mondays and dismiss at 2:20 p.m. Tuesday-Friday.

### How many students are in a kindergarten classroom?

Our goal is to have kindergarten classrooms with 20 or fewer students. This may vary slightly due to enrollment.

### How are kindergarten classrooms staffed?

All kindergarten classrooms are staffed with one certificated classroom teacher. Teachers are supported by instructional specialists, the school counselor and their kindergarten teaching team.

### Do kindergartners require special arrangements for transportation or food?

Kindergartners are included in their schools' regular bus routes and food service plans.

- Kindergartners are greeted at buses in the morning and are walked to buses in the afternoon.
- Students with food allergies and dietary restrictions are closely monitored by staff.
