Student Presentation, Irving Elementary School

Irving Elementary School's student presentation was postponed to the April 13, 2020 Board Meeting.

#### KHS Student Representative Report, Shahayla Luna

Shahayla reported that Kalapuya's winter formal was a success. A trip to Santa Cruz, California, is being planned for March 16<sup>th</sup> – 20<sup>th</sup>. Students who participate in the trip will be planting, harvesting, and selling vegetables near Santa Cruz. A new session of night school recently began and student led conferences are currently taking place. Seniors will be observing classes at LCC soon, received their CPR certifications this term, and are working on their FAFSA and Oregon Promise Grant applications.

#### WHS Student Representative Report, Elizabeth Ortiz

Elizabeth shared that Willamette's winter formal will be a sock hop and will be held on February 22<sup>nd</sup>. First semester academic and attendance achievements will be recognized at the second semester kickoff which will take place February 18<sup>th</sup>. Sources of Strength's focus for this month is healthy relationships. Julissa Garcia Perez is Rotary Student of the Month. Last week was counselor appreciation week. Willamette hosted a robotics tournament on Saturday. Wolverine Pageant's staff/contestant basketball game fundraiser will be held tomorrow at 6:30pm. Elizabeth distributed flyers for another Wolverine Pageant fundraiser at Mucho Gusto and Dickie Jo's, and presented her Wolverine Pageant jar for donations.

Superintendent Parra congratulated Elizabeth for being selected by Eugene Area Chamber of Commerce as the 2020 Future First Citizen. Elizabeth shared her experiences so far as the winner of the award.

#### Budget Committee Interview and Appointment, Position 7

This agenda item was postponed to the February 24, 2020 Board meeting due to candidate unavailability.

#### Indian Education, Tina Gutierez-Schmich

Native Education parent group members Rocky Mercurio, Kim Mercurio, and Norma Trefren introduced themselves. Equity Directory Tina Gutierez-Schmich, Mr. Mercurio, Ms. Mercurio, and Ms. Trefren shared highlights from events and activities the group has participated in and shared goals for the parent group and the District's Indian Education Grant, including offering cultural events for students, connecting with families, and building additional supports for elementary and middle school students. A monthly Native Education newsletter and a Facebook page have been created for outreach and to increase community involvement. SB 13 Tribal History/Shared History curriculum is being implemented. The District's annual Indian Education grant application will be submitted within the next few months and bylaws for the parent group are being updated.

#### African American Student Success Act, Tina Gutierez-Schmich

Equity Director Tina Gutierez-Schmich provided an update on the African American Student Success Plan, a statewide education plan for African American/Black students overseen by Lane ESD for Lane County school districts. Ms. Gutierez-Schmich distributed copies of the "Lane African American Black Student Success Program" and a flyer summarizing the goals of the program: "African American/ Black Student Success Plan Program Goals 2019-2020." Ms. Gutierez-Schmich shared resources for students and partnerships the District is involved with, including Mentoring Day at LCC, Eugene 4J's town hall symposium, and weekly tutoring with NAACP. Copies of a flyer, "UOTeach Equity & Anti-Oppressive Pedagogy TeachIN," which will be held March 14<sup>th</sup>, were distributed to Board members.
