CALL TO ORDER

Chair Farr called the February 11, 2019 meeting of the Board of Directors to order at 6:31 p.m.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Vice Chair Jorgensen led the Pledge of Allegiance.

ACTION ON MINUTES

Chair Farr presented the Minutes from the January 28, 2019 Board Meeting and asked for additions or corrections. Hearing none, the Board approved the Minutes as submitted.

Dawnja Johnson arrived at approximately 6:33 p.m.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Student Presentation, Prairie Mountain School

Prairie Mountain School Principal Jill Robinson-Wolgamott introduced Prairie Mountain School Assistant Principal Christy Gill and Prairie Mountain 1st grade teachers Robin Hanson and Meryni Hall. Ms. Robinson-Wolgamott and Ms. Hanson shared that students would be demonstrating various math games that engage students and differentiate math levels. Ms. Hanson and Ms. Hall coordinated students with Board members and District Office staff. 1st grade students Tyler, Erika, Ally, Jasmine, Caden, Korbin, Keenan, Layah, Michael, Jason, and Mathis introduced themselves to the person they were paired with and worked with them as they demonstrated and played math games. Ms. Hanson, Ms. Hall, and the students answered questions from the Board.

Oath of Office, KHS Student Representative to the Board: Nate Tena

Superintendent Parra gave the Oath of Office to Nate Tena who was officially sworn in as Student Representative to the Board of Directors for the 2018-19 school year.

KHS Student Representative Report, Nate Tena

Nate reported that Mr. Dambrov's cohort is learning about native plants and their importance to pollinators, and visited Doak Creek Native Plant Nursery today. Doak Creek Native Plant Nursery donated 160 native trees and shrubs, a total value of \$1,600, to the Bethel Farm. To prepare for the upcoming plant sale, Ms. Nussbaum's cohort recently planted all of the hanging baskets. Ms. Nussbaum's cohort is also studying possible future differences with 100 women now in congress. All KHS students are preparing portfolios for student led conferences this week. Each student in Mr. Zydycrn's cohort is learning a lesson to teach to the class. Mr. Seymour's cohort recently finished the novel *Exit West* and visited the Museum of Natural History. International students from UO will be doing cultural presentations to Mr. Seymour's cohort. Ms. Stroup and Ms. Zimmer's senior cohort is studying budget finances, employability skills, first aid, and college life. Ms. Olsen's cohort is studying obstacles of upward mobility and root causes of homelessness in Eugene, and is reading *The Glass Castle*. Ms. Olsen's cohort toured the Eugene Mission today and will be touring Emerald Village Eugene soon. Mr. Larson's cohort has been breaking news articles using their news value system and is visiting non-profits for Community 101. School Counselor Lezlee Craven would like to see more mental health advocacy available on-site at all times.

WHS Student Representative Report, Cynthia Lopez

Cynthia shared that the new semester at WHS has begun and freshmen students are adjusting to the transition and enjoying their new classes. Wolverine Pageant participants toured the NICU recently. It was very impactful for participants to see the infants in the NICU and realize what the program supports. The Wolverine Pageant will be held March 16th. In the upcoming weeks, pageant participants will be visiting elementary and middle schools to promote the Wolverine Pageant. The staff vs. contestant basketball game will be held February 28th. *The Register Guard* recently reported on a Bethel Sources of Strength training in an article titled "Building strength through community." A copy of the article was distributed for the Board to review. The "I heart" campaign was held today. Recycle Round-Up was held February 2nd and saw an increase in donations. The Snow Ball, a winter formal, will be held February 23rd. Basketball season is coming to an end; the boys record is 15-4 and the girls record is 7-12. The Wrestling team went to Districts last week and is heading to State next week. Swim team had a District meet last week.

Superintendent Parra shared that she observed student peers introducing Sources of Strength to a class at Kalapuya and that the comments from the students in the class were very positive.

2019-2021 Lane ESD Local Service Plan, Superintendent Scurto

Lane Education Service District (ESD) Superintendent Scurto introduced Lane ESD Board Member Sharon Martin. Superintendent Scurto discussed several Lane ESD services provided to districts such as technology, school improvement, special education, and school administration, and reviewed differences from previous years in the Local Service Plan 2019-21 Year One. All component districts are required to approve the Local Service Plan annually. A student behavior sub-committee has been formed and Lane ESD is working on implementing a plan to assist with escalating student behavior. Superintendent Scurto thanked Superintendent Parra for being part of the student behavior sub-committee and responded to questions from Board members.

Indian Education, Tina Gutierez-Schmich

Equity Director Tina Gutierez-Schmich provided an overview of Bethel's Indian Education program, which is in its second year, and summarized plans to continue with the program. Student test scores and graduation rates identify the critical need to address academic culture and social needs of Native students not only in Bethel and Oregon, but also across the nation. Bethel's Indian Education parent committee identified goals for the 2018-19 school year, which included increasing students' knowledge of their cultural identity, increasing parent participation in the program, and professional development for teachers to work with Native students. Ms. Gutierez-Schmich shared photos of Bethel's Indian Education program activities and events and discussed how Bethel is collaborating with other districts on additional activities for students and families. Ms. Gutierez-Schmich also discussed Senate Bill 13 which will mandate Tribal History: Shared History curriculum starting in 4th, 8th, and 10th grades, and will eventually require this curriculum at all K-12 grade levels.

Legislative and School Finance Update

Superintendent Parra distributed a sample poster identifying three possible school funding levels: Governor's Base Budget, K-12 Investment Budget, and Full Funding for Quality Schools. A poster specific to Bethel will be created once additional budget determinations are made. The Board discussed the different funding levels and possibilities for districts identified on the poster. Superintendent Parra reported that the ODE instructional time work group met for the final time and will be sending their report to the Governor.
