
Grading Policies

FORMATIVES

This includes classwork. homework, warm-ups, exit tickets, discussions, independent reading assignments, and more.

COMMON TERM ASSESSMENTS

Common term assessments (CTAs/exams) account for 10% of the term average.



SUMMATIVES

This includes guizzes, tests. essays, projects, presentations, and more.

Three cumulative (covering all previously taught standards) tests will be administered per term.

ALL tests will be timed. Students will also be expected to complete one timed writing assessment each term.

additional Policies

Reteach & Retest

Students will be provided the opportunity to attend reteach and retest sessions on Tuesday and Thursday afternoons from 3:15-4:00 pm. Late buses will be provided after the Tuesday/Thursday sessions. Students may also be picked up by a parent or guardian at 4:00 p.m. (A signed after-school permission form is required for ALL modes of pickup/transportation.)

If students need to stay on these days, students must have an after school form signed and returned to the school <u>one day prior</u> to the school effect after school session. An after school form is available in all ELA classrooms; they are also available on the school website.

According to the student handbook, students will only be allowed to <u>retest 1 time per a nine weeks</u>, and they must retest <u>within 10 school days</u> of receiving his/her test grade. An ELA schedule for reteach/retest days will be attached to the Weekly Assignment Sheet which is emailed to parents/guardians every week. *Further information on the retest policy is provided in the student handbook under "Retesting."

Course Requirements

Students are expected to attend class daily and to come prepared to work with all needed supplies. Most work will be completed at school; hence, it is very important that students stay organized with their ELA assignments and due dates. Students are expected to write homework, assignments, projects, and test dates in their planners. Also, a copy of the Weekly Assignment Sheet will be emailed to parents/guardians weekly.

If a student is absent from school and misses an assignment, test, etc., the teacher will place a score of "1" in the gradebook to indicate to the student/parents that the work must be completed. Once completed, the work will be graded and entered into the gradebook. Per school policy, students will be allowed 10 school days to complete all make-up work.

A score of a "0" in the gradebook indicates that the student was present for that assignment, test, etc.; however, the student never turned in the assignment to the teacher in class.

Please note that students are required to complete all daily class work, assignments, projects, assigned readings, tests, etc. Students must master all standards with 65% mastery to be promoted to 8th grade.

In the event of an absence, it is the <u>student's responsibility</u> to check the daily presentation for ELA to see what he/she missed. The daily presentations are uploaded to the ELA Google Classroom for student/parent access.

*Further information on absences/make-up work is provided in the student handbook under "Attendance."
