

PRE-K PROGRAM INFORMATION

- Participation in the program is voluntary.
 Once enrolled, students must adhere to all Biloxi Public Schools District policies.
- Child must be age 4 before or on September 1st of the upcoming school year.
- Child must reside in the Biloxi Public Schools District.
- Every classroom teacher has a minimum of a bachelor's degree in early childhood education, child development, or an equivalent field.
- Every assistant teacher possess an associate's degree and early childhood training.
- All instructional staff receives at least fifteen (15) hours of annual professional development in early childhood.
- Mississippi Beginnings (ELA) & Building Blocks (Math) curriculums are used to address each child's social, emotional, physical and cognitive development.
- Teacher-to-child ratio are 1:10.
- All staff work with families to facilitate meaningful communication with a minimum of 3 face-to-face conferences per year.
- Systems of student assessment and ongoing program evaluation are implemented to ensure the highest quality standards are met.
- All classrooms will follow the Early Learning Guidelines for Classrooms Serving Three-and Four-Year-Old Children.
