Transition Planning for 5 go 6 students with IEPs

- Mrs. Mantell, Ms. Charlton & Mrs. Edmunds begin meeting with FRES administrators, psychologist, special education teachers & related service providers to get information about students and begin planning for staffing needs (this has already started)
- FRES CSE Meetings: TBD- typically in mid-May
- Individual tours and meetings can be arranged with TCMS over the summer as needed
- 6th grade orientation at the end of August before school starts
- Letters from case managers sent by end of 1st week of school

General Education Classes with RR

ICT Classes

- Special Ed. & General Ed. Teachers
- May be combined with RR support
- Available in 4 content area classes (English, math, science, social studies)

PATH: Specially designed with intensity of services determined by individual needs**

15:1 Special Class

- Intensive academic program, adapted curriculum based on prioritized NYS standards
- Pace of instruction, presentation of materials may be different
- Available for 4 content area classes (English, math, science, social studies)
- May be combined with ICT classes and/or RR support

12:1:4

- Follows NYSAA
 Curriculum
 Outline
- Combination of academic & functional skills

General Education Setting Programs



Consultant Teacher Services (CTS)

✓ A Spec. Ed. Teacher provides <u>indirect</u> support for Gen. Ed. classes

Integrated Co-Teaching (ICT)

- ✓ Class is co-taught by General Ed. & a Special Ed. Teacher
- ✓ The special education teacher facilitates learning by providing strategies and insights about special education learners
- ✓ Many models may be used



PATH

- Specially designed program for students who have social-emotional and/or behavioral needs that interfere with successfully accessing the curriculum
- Services provided by a special education teacher, social worker and/or teaching assistant
- May include Resource Room, Consultant Teacher Services, Social Work/ Counseling Services and/or other Behavior & Mental Health Support
- Least restrictive in terms of setting; Intensity of service is more restrictive. Can be combined with other programs if significant academic needs also exist.

Resource Room (RR)

- ✓ Taught by Spec. Ed. Teacher
- ✓ Meets daily or every other day as part of a student's schedule (not pulled from a class)
- ✓ Up to 5 Spec. Ed. Students.
- To provide specialized instruction toward IEP goals and/or address program modifications
- ✓ May be paired with other programs

Develop executive functioning & study skills

Special Class Programs

15:1

- ✓Up to 15 students
- ✓ 1 Special Ed. Teacher
- May have TA (depending on enrollment)
- ✓ General education curriculum with prioritized standards
- ✓ Pace, materials & breakdown of concepts may be different than a general ed. class



12:1:4- Most Restrictive Setting Students have significant cognitive and/or developmental disabilities

- **√**Up to 12 students (multi-grade)
- ✓1 Spec. Ed. Teacher
- ✓ Up to 4 class TAs (depending on enrollment)
- **✓ Follows the NYSAA Curriculum**
- ✓Incorporates functional skills with a focus on the development of language, social, behavioral and adaptive abilities
- **✓** Adaptive Health Class Component
- ✓ Adaptive PE may be included

Declassification Support Services (DSS)

- ✓Implemented after CSE determines the student no longer requires Special Education services
- ✓ Student is monitored for one year by a Special Ed. case manager
- Testing accommodations continue through high school



- ✓ Speech & Language- Carol Dennis
- **✓**Occupational Therapy- Rachel Mattern or Jennifer Rader
- **✓**Physical Therapy- Barb Flender
- ▼Counseling- The student's school counselor, social worker and/or school psychologist
- **✓** Reading*- A reading teacher at TCMS

Services may be integrated or non-integrated

Within classroom setting
In a separate location, small group, or 1:1

Case Managers

Case Managers assigned to students with IEPs

✓ Oversee accommodations & modifications within the curriculum

✓ Implement testing accommodations

✓ Goal development & progress monitoring

Special Transportation per IEP:

Pick up and Drop off Monroe Avenue side of building



Parent Conferences

Scheduled as Needed

Available to ALL families at any time & do not need to be included in the IEP
