How did we get here?

2013-2014

Full-Day K Studied

BOE accepts recommendation to plan for implementation

Committee recommends exploring Brookside as an option

2014-2015

"Apples to Apples" feasibility study completed

CRPS cost would be app. \$49.9

Brookside cost would be app. \$63.1

2015-2016

BOE accepts superintendent recommendation to begin prereferendum work for Brookside Redevelopment

Community engagement and planning process begins



What Will Happen Next and What Are The Options?

Early March

Building Condition Survey will be completed and the district will revisit Facility Master Planning K-12

Community Input from surveys and sessions throughout the year will be reviewed

Mid March

BOE will review all material and discuss resolution authorizing referendum

Options:

Do nothing

Authorize vote on Brookside Redevelopment Explore other possibilities based on community feedback

How Will This Benefit Other Students?

- CRPS is currently very congested and spaces intended for specific programs have been taken for classroom space
- Current configuration limits the ability of teachers to work with small groups, for students to work together and for classrooms to partner
- The library space is not sufficient and limits opportunities for student engagement in this important program
- Large motor instructional spaces and extended studies spaces are not sufficient
- Pull out services are not being provided in spaces specially designed for this type of instruction
- Redevelopment would allow for a building design that solves the problems



Important Considerations

- Community input is essential. No decisions have been made. We need to know how you feel and will only pursue projects that you, the community, are interested in.
- The program is already excellent. We have never meant to imply that children are receiving a substandard experience. We are committed to looking for opportunities to continuously build upon success.
- This is very costly. We know it and we wish it was less expensive. We are committed to exploring any and all options for reducing cost as much as possible while maintaining value.
- We haven't forgotten about the rest of the District. We will continue our Facility Master Planning projects and feel as though we can continue making improvements that will benefit all levels of the District.
