



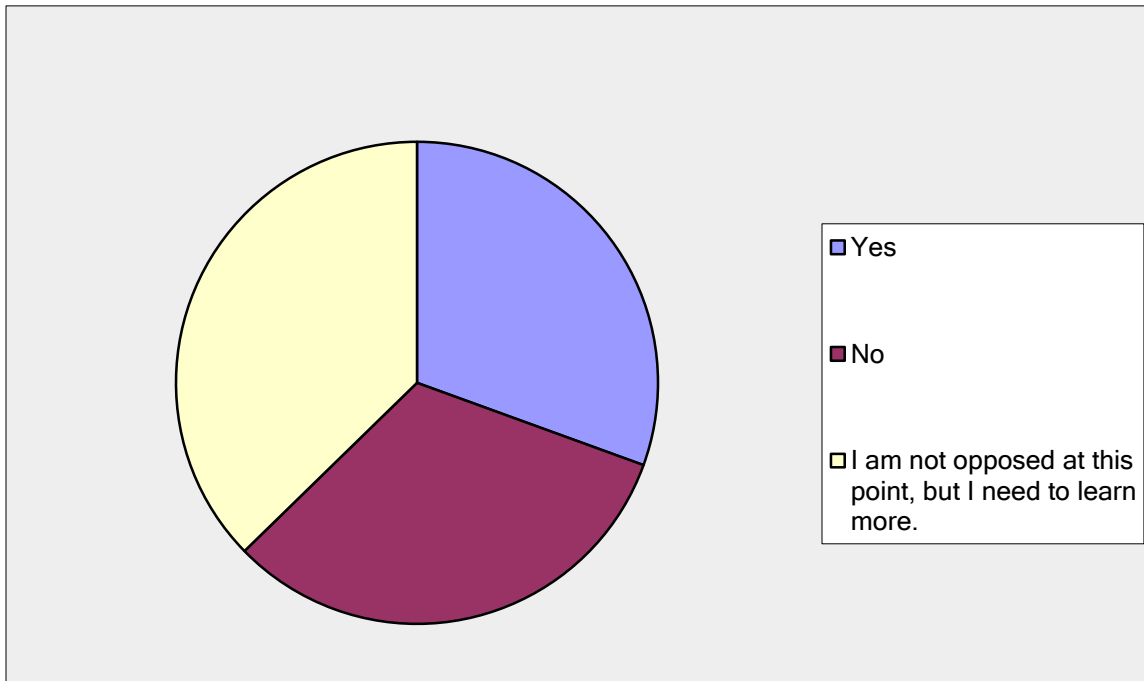
Brookside Redevelopment Community Input Survey 2

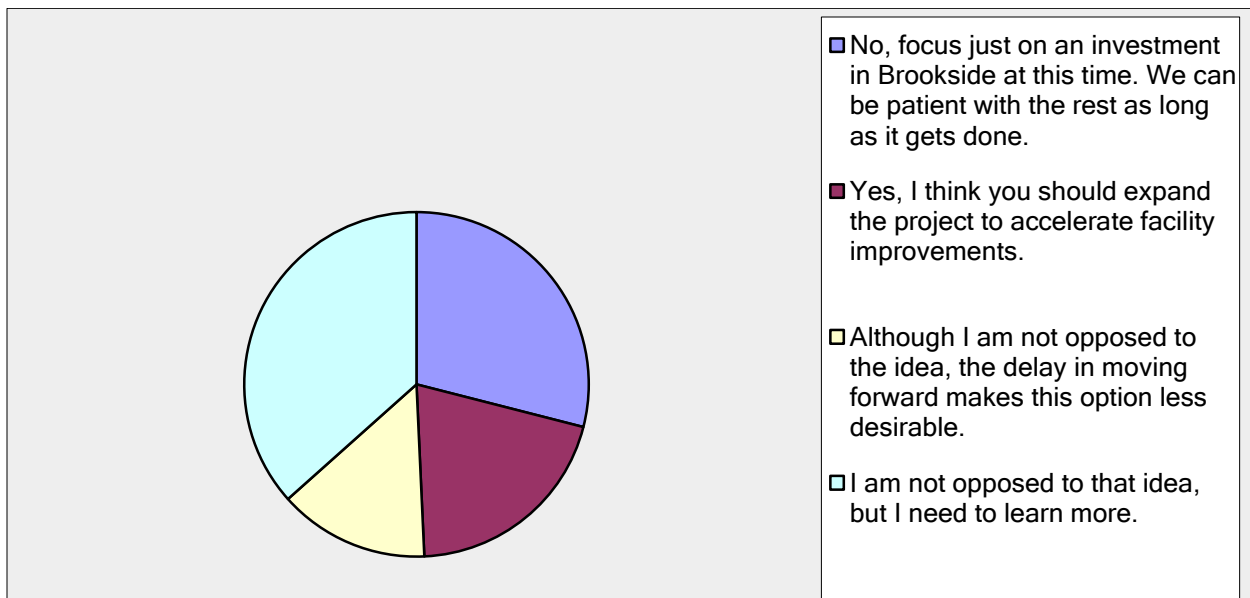

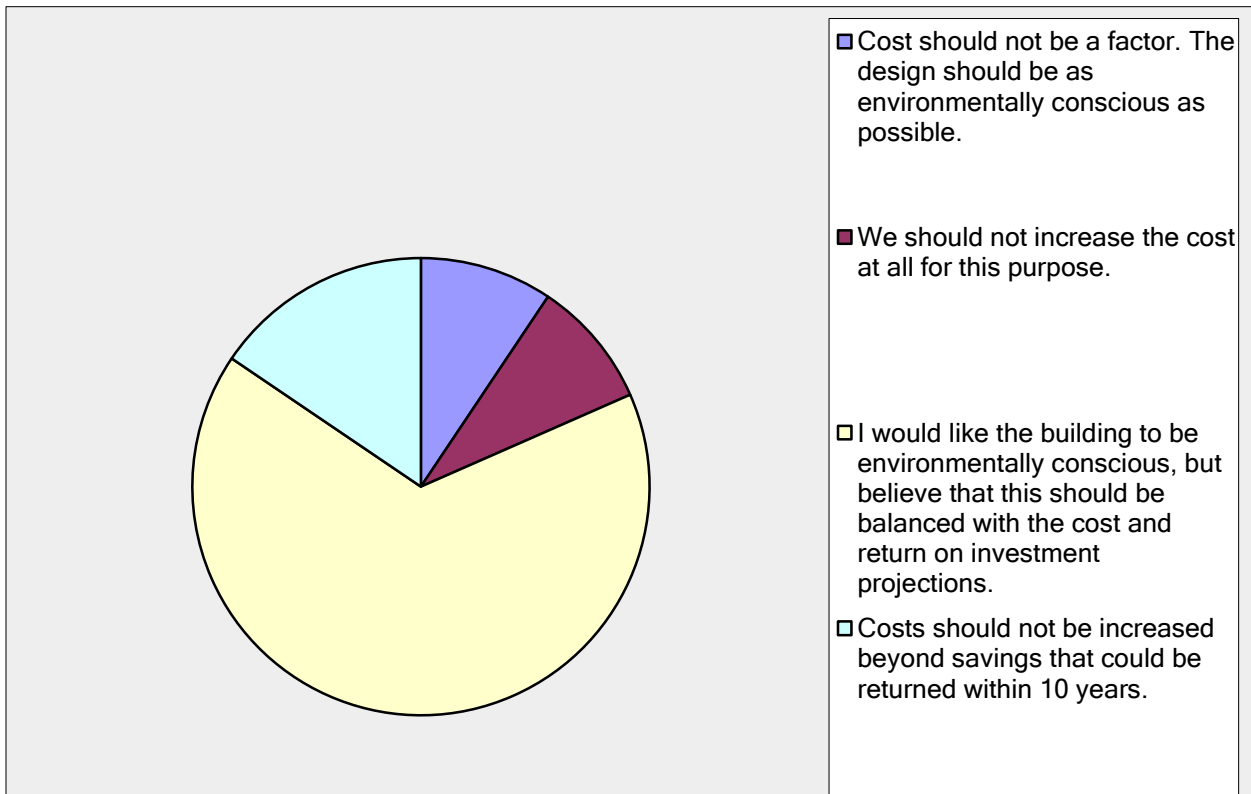

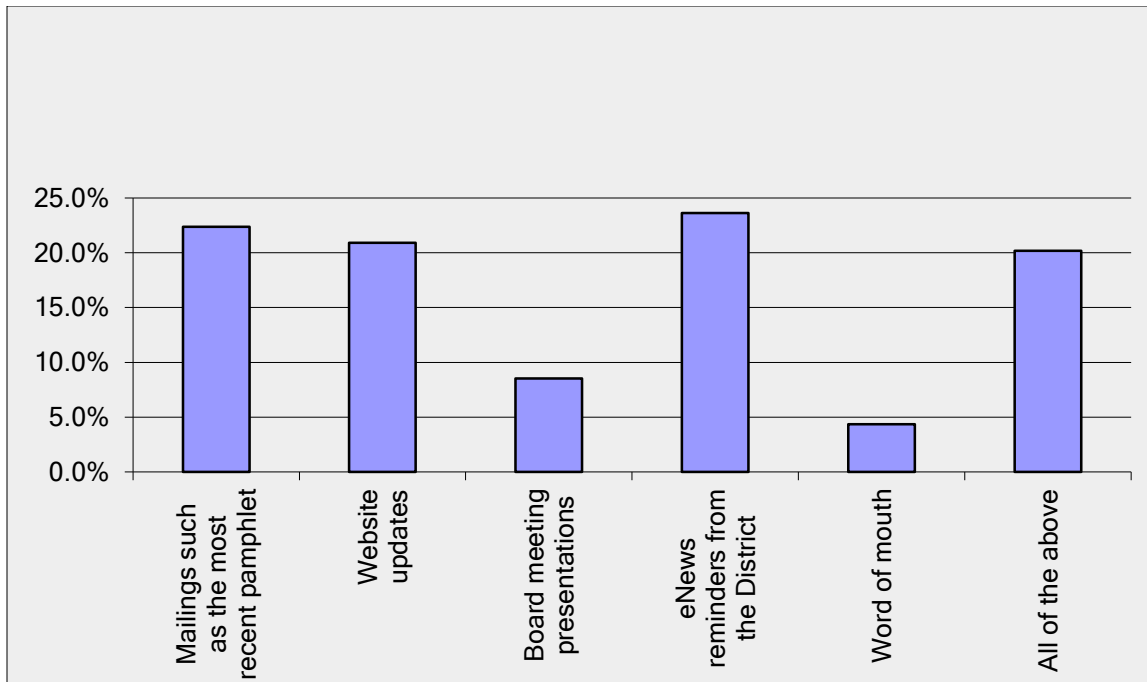

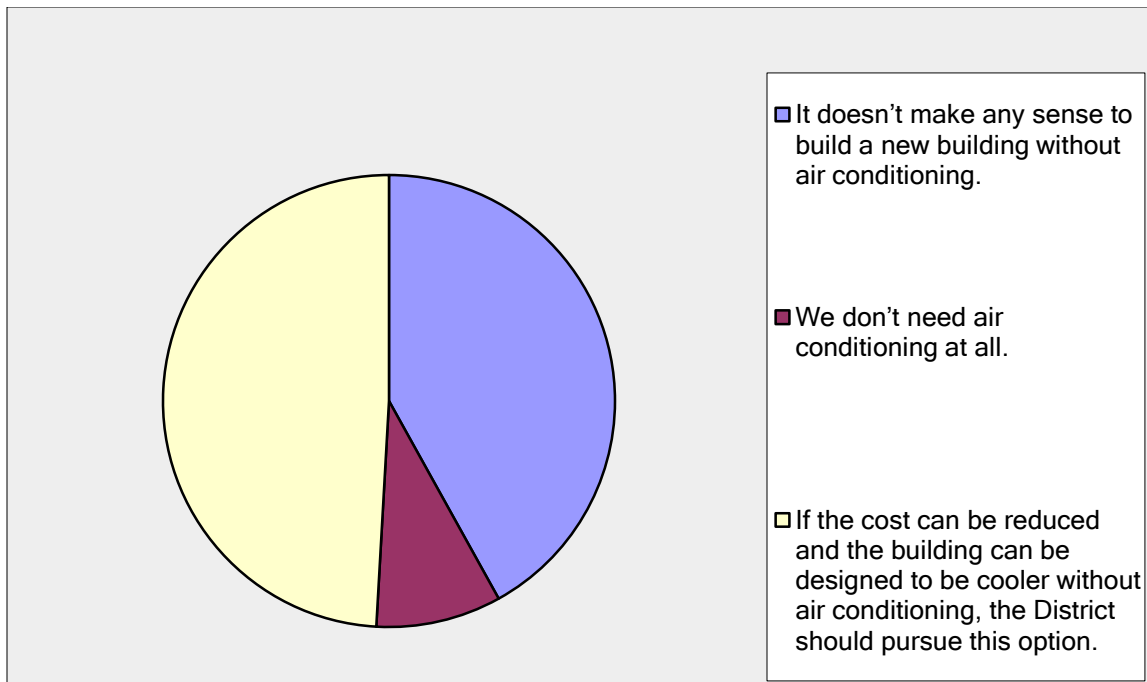
We are very eager to communicate clearly and to receive community input. What strategies are working best for this purpose? (vote for more than one option)
