How to Create a Brochure

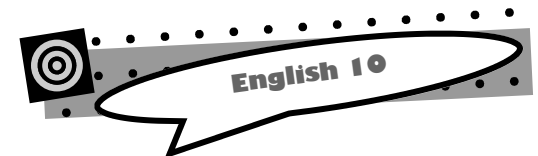


You can use any desktop publishing program that you wish, but you'll want to choose a program that is compatible with the computers here at school. Microsoft Publisher is programmed onto the school computers.
