Chair Nelson called the March 8, 2021 meeting of the Board of Directors to order at 6:01 p.m.

ACTION ON MINUTES

Chair Nelson presented the Minutes from the February 22, 2021 Board Meeting and the February 25, 2021 Special Board Meeting and asked for additions or corrections. Hearing none, the Board approved the Minutes as submitted.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

PERS Bond Information, Simon Levear and Carol Samuels

Superintendent Parra introduced Carol Samuels and Brendan Watkins from Piper Sandler. Business Services Director Simon Levear reviewed the history of the District's PERS rates, which have generally increased over the past several years, reviewed recent methods utilized by the District to decrease its PERS rates, and summarized how a PERS bond (or POBs) could potentially further reduce the District's PERS rates. Piper Sandler Managing Director Carol Samuels provided a detailed overview of pension obligation bonds (POBs) and described the concept of POBs which is to borrow at a low interest rate to fund the unfunded portion of PERS liabilities and potentially earn higher returns on the borrowed money. Ms. Samuels reviewed current interest rates, Oregon history with POBs, PERS rates of return on investments (1970-2018), and risks involved with POBs. Ms. Samuels also shared results of ECONorthwest's assessment of POBs using three different interest rates, discussed other districts' results with issuing POBs, presented potential results for Bethel using three different scenarios, and shared next steps for the process if the Board is interested in pursuing POBs. Superintendent Parra, Mr. Levear, and Ms. Samuels answered questions from the Board throughout the presentation. The Board agreed to pursue POBs to the next step. A resolution will be presented at the next regular Board meeting which is scheduled for April 12, 2021.

Director Cunningham left the virtual meeting at approximately 6:20 p.m.

Bethel Health Center Update, Brooke Cottle

Bethel Health Center Director Brooke Cottle provided an overview of Bethel Health Center operations. The medical team is currently providing services via telehealth and in-person visits. Mental health visits are exclusively via telehealth. CDC guidance for safety measures is being followed for all appointments. Bethel

Health Center will continue using telehealth appointments in the future because of accessibility, convenience and the ability to better connect with students and families. Ms. Cottle also answered questions from the Board and reported on UO and Bushnell interns providing mental health services, the partnership with the drug and alcohol counselor expanding to include services to middle school students, methods being used to promote the Bethel Health Center, the impact of the Board's approval to serve students' families, suicide prevention training, Sources of Strength, COVID-19 testing, and the flu shot and vaccination clinics. Bethel's vaccination clinics have been very successful. They involve a team effort with several community partnerships and have supported the entire community, including smaller and larger local districts.

Financial Statement, Simon Levear

Business Services Director Simon Levear reviewed the February 2021 financial statement showing an estimated Ending Fund Balance of \$11,651,369.

Legislative & School Finance Update

Superintendent Parra reported on the recent March economic forecast report which is positive with revenues up slightly. No further reductions are expected in the State School Fund, Measure 98/High School Success, or Student Success Act/Student Investment Account during the current biennium. Superintendent Parra reviewed projections for the 2021-23 biennium, shared key points from the March economic forecast, provided an update on the COVID-19 relief package, summarized a \$250 million Oregon initiative for summer learning and childcare, and reported that the Joint Ways and Means Committee co-chairs' budget framework is expected to be released later this month. In addition, Superintendent Parra referred to Governor Brown's executive order to reopen schools for in-person learning expected later this week and reviewed dates Bethel's hybrid instruction will begin:

- March 15, 2021 Kindergarten
- March 29, 2021 K-5
- April 5, 2021 6 8 (Cascade and Shasta) and 9 12
- April 12, 2021 6 8 (Meadow View and Prairie Mountain)

POLICY

FUNCTIONS OF THE SCHOOL BOARD

The School Board is responsible for the establishment and operation of the local public schools. It derives its powers legally from the State of Oregon (ORS 332.072-332.107). It is an agent of the state and also of the people of the District it serves. Its powers and duties are described in and limited to the provisions of Oregon law, Oregon Board of Education rules and regulations, and the will of the patrons of the District as represented by the School Board.

The functions of the School Board as it carries out these policies are:

- 1. <u>Policy Making</u> The School Board determines what policies are necessary, delegates to the Superintendent the responsibility for putting policies and plans into operation, and provides for financial means for their successful achievement.
- Executive The School Board shall name a Superintendent or administrator as the executive officer
 and authorize the administration to establish administrative rules and procedures as necessary to
 implement School Board policies and pertinent state laws and to ensure the orderly operation of the
 District in carrying out its mission.
- Appraisal or Evaluation The School Board, through careful consideration of staff input, seeks to
 determine the effectiveness of school and system operations and the quality of the educational
 program.
- 4. <u>Judicial</u> The School Board has the responsibility for making judgments regarding the protection of the rights of individuals and for the proper administration of the policies and programs of the District.

INTERNAL ORGANIZATION

Officers

The officers of the School Board shall be a chairperson and a vice chairperson.

Methods of Election

<u>Chairperson</u> - The members of the School Board shall elect a chairperson from members at the organizational meeting. No member shall serve as a chairperson for more than two years in succession.

<u>Vice Chairperson</u> - The vice chairperson shall be elected by the members of the School Board at its organizational meeting.

Duties

The chairperson shall preside at all meetings of the School Board, decide questions of order, and appoint all committees unless otherwise directed by the School Board. The chairperson shall have the same right as other members to offer resolutions, to make motions, or second motions, to discuss questions and to vote thereon.

The chairperson shall call special meetings of the School Board.

The chairperson shall sign official District documents that require the signature of this office.

The vice chairperson shall act in the chairperson's capacity when the chairperson is absent.

Student Representative to the Board of Directors

Representatives from the Willamette High School and Kalapuya High School student body will attend all regular sessions of the Board to provide advice to the Board on matters being considered and to report on activities and issues at Willamette High School and Kalapuya High School.

Annual Organizational Meeting

The organizational meeting of a new fiscal year shall be conducted at the first meeting in July. At the organizational meeting, the School Board shall act on the following:

- a. Election of officers
- b. Appoint and set the retainer fee for the school attorney
- c. Select a depository for the District's funds
- d. Appoint a school clerk, a deputy clerk, and a secretary
- e. Establish the day, time, and place for the regular School Board meetings.

Agenda

The agenda shall be prepared by the Superintendent of Schools and mailed or delivered to Board members at least three (3) days prior to the meeting. Any staff member or patron of the District may, by request, place items on the agenda. The order of business, unless altered by the consent of the School Board members, shall be as follows:

Rules of Order

Parliamentary procedures not provided by these rules and regulations shall be determined by Roberts Rules of Order, Newly Revised. A majority of the Board shall constitute a quorum to transact business.

Voting Method

All voting shall be by voice roll call vote. The order of roll call shall be changed at each Board meeting by rotating the first name to the last at each succeeding meeting.

Minutes

Minutes of the School Board meeting shall be mailed or delivered to members along with the agenda of the next regular meeting. The minutes of the preceding meeting shall be approved by the School Board and signed by the chairperson and clerk as the first act of the regular meetings. A copy of all motions shall be carefully recorded. The names of those who make motions and those who second motions shall be recorded. The official minutes shall be kept in an appropriate binder and stored in the Administration Building.

Attendance at Conferences

In order to be better informed about local, state, and national educational practices, problems, and issues, the School Board members are urged to attend and participate actively in meetings of the Oregon School Boards Association and other educational meetings of general interest. In order to be able to make decisions concerning attendance, the Superintendent shall inform the School Board of important School Board Association meetings to be held during the school year.

The attendance areas shall be decided as the need dictates.

POLICY

The Board is committed to providing an educational program for all students living in the district. The Board believes all students living in the district who have not completed 12 years of education should regularly attend a public full-time school and be included in the available educational programs.

Students, who are five years old on or before September 1, will be admitted to Bethel's kindergarten program.

A child is considered to be six years of age if the sixth birthday of the child occurred on or before September 1 immediately preceding the beginning of the current school term.

All new students must register in the office. Students enrolled in the district shall comply with Oregon laws related to age, residence, health, attendance, and immunization.

Students located in the District shall not be excluded from admission solely because the student does not have a regular and adequate nighttime place of residence or solely because the student is not under the supervision of a parent/guardian.

Students located in the District shall not be excluded from admission where they are otherwise eligible, and they have not yet attained the age of 19 prior to the beginning of the current school year.

The District may admit an otherwise eligible person who is not receiving special education and who has not yet attained 21 years of age prior to the beginning of the current school year if the person is shown to be in need of additional education to receive a high school diploma or a modified diploma.

Students who attend a District school on an inter-district transfer, or were admitted prior to 2019 through open enrollment, are considered residents of the District.

Students living in the District who have attained the age of majority are considered residents of the District unless the student has transferred to another district via inter-district transfer or open enrollment.

Minor students living with a parent or guardian who resides in the District are considered residents of the District unless the student has transferred to another district via inter-district transfer or open enrollment.

Students who are in foster care¹ and who are placed in the District are residents of the district of origin, unless the court determines that attending in the district of residence is in the best interest of the student.

Students who are military children² are considered resident of the District, if the District is the district of military residence³ for the military child. Parents of military students must provide proof of residency

¹ "Foster care" does not mean care for children whose parent or guardian voluntarily placed the child outside the child's home with a public or private agency and for whom the child's parent or guardian retains legal guardianship.

within 10 days after the date of military transfer or pending transfer indicated on the official military orders.

Students whose parent or guardian voluntarily placed the child outside the child's home with a public or private agency and who is living in a licensed, certified or approved substitute care program, and whose residency is established pursuant to Oregon Revised Statute (ORS) 339.134.
