
- Handbooks online Cabarrus Tech, CCS, RCCC

- Have made a year commitment







SENIOR SEMINAR


- It is an online class designed to help students be successful in their Senior year.

- Will meet regularly with Senior Advisor






ATTENDANCE



POLICIES – DROPPING CLASSES


- Students are not allowed to drop a class after the first day of classes
- Dropping a class is only allowed for administrative reasons & with permission
- If a student drops a class or is dropped from a class by the college:
 - Receive an "F" for a high school grade and will have to pay for the book for that class.
 - If the class is taken out of sequence, must wait for sequenced time to retake class
 - Failed classes can result in loss of Driver's License.





POLICIES – GRADE REPLACEMENT


- Can only attempt to replace the grade in classes currently passed with a "C" better 4 times during high school.
- The grade earned in the 2nd attempt will be the grade on the transcript, even if it is lower.







- Not Feeling Connected to the School




WHAT CAN YOU DO

They are only as strong as they think they are. It's our job to make them believe they are GIANTS.


APPLYING TO COLLEGE
