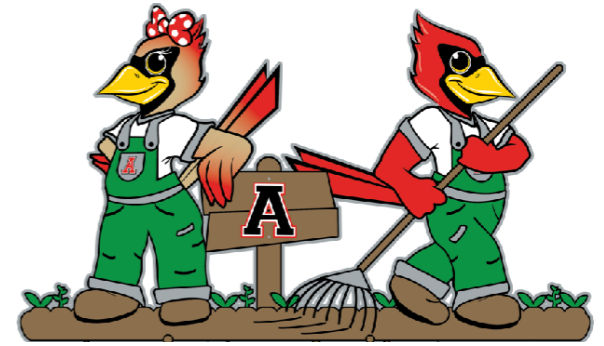
seed

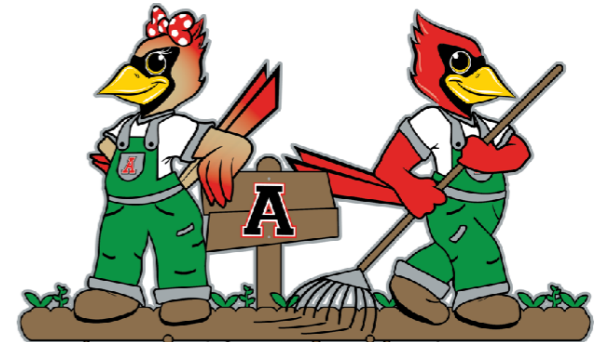

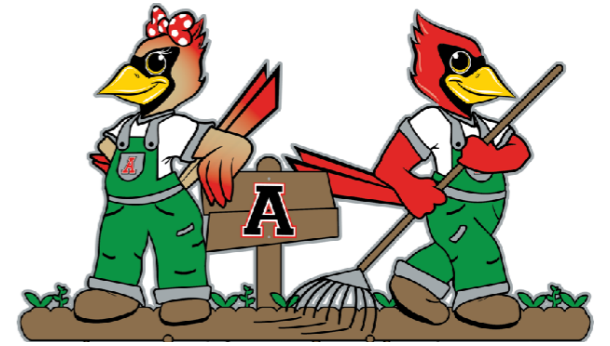
