Creativity  $\rightarrow$  exploring and extending ideas leading up to an original or interpretive product or performance.

Activity  $\rightarrow$  physical exertion contributing to a healthy lifestyle.

Service  $\rightarrow$  collaborative and reciprocal engagement with the community in response to an authentic need

# Creativity

• Talents, interests, passions, emotional responses, and imagination.

Examples: visual and performing arts, digital design, writing, film, culinary arts, crafts, and composition

# Activity

- Individual and team sports, aerobic exercise, dance, outdoor recreation, fitness training, or another form of physical exertion
  Service
  - Making a meaningful contribution to their community and society

Examples: direct, indirect, advocacy, and research

#### **CAS** Aims


- Enjoy and find significance in a range of CAS experiences
- Purposefully reflect on experiences
- Identify goals, develop strategies, and determine further actions for personal growth
- Explore new possibilities, embrace new challenges, and adapt to new roles
- Actively participate in planned, sustained, and collaborative CAS projects
- Understand they are members of local and global communities with responsibilities towards each other and the environment

## **Expectations**

- **CAS Portfolio** (collected in Managebac)
- Evidence of the *stages of CAS*
- **18 month** time period (may not start until junior year begins)
- Address the *seven CAS Learning outcomes*
- Engage in **CAS experiences**
- Undertake a **CAS project**
- Complete *three interview sessions* with the CAS coordinator/adviser.
- Continually *reflect*

# **CAS Stages**

- 1. Investigation
- 2. Preparation
- 3. Action
- 4. Reflection
- 5. Demonstration



## **CAS Project**

- Must be at least one month
- Can address one strand or all strands
- Must address at least one or more learning outcome
- Incorporate a group of students or with members of the wider community

### Examples...

- Creativity: A student group plans, designs and creates a mural
- Activity: Student organize and participate in a sports team including training sessions and matches against other teams
- Service and creativity: students identify that children at a local school need backpacks and subsequently design and make the backpacks out of recycled materials.

## **CAS experience**

"A CAS experience is a specific event in which the student engages with one or more of the three CAS strands. A CAS experience can be a single event or may be an extended series of events."
