| CHARACTERISTICS        | AB Lower End: Do You Want to be my Friend? Higher End: Have You Seen my Cat?             | Lower End: <i>I Went Walking</i> Higher End: <i>Goodnight, Gorilla</i>  |

| STRUCTURE/PLOT         | Stories carried by pictures  | Similar episodes or repetitive  |
| SETTING                | Familiar settings close to children's experiences  | Familiar settings close to children's experiences   |
| CHARACTERS             | Mostly nameless characters   | Amusing, simple characters  |
| THEME/LESSON           | Focus on a single topic (family, pets, play, school)                                     | Familiar theme and ideas  |
| WORDS/PHRASES          | Repeating patterns with 3-6 words/page   | Many sentences with prepositional phrases and/or adjectives   |
| LANGUAGE/<br>STRUCTURE | Simple sentences where the subject (person or thing) comes before the predicate (action) | <ul> <li>Repeating patterns</li> <li>Simple dialogue using "said"</li> <li>Sentences that are questions</li> <li>Some longer sentences with more than 6 words</li> <li>Some words in bold print</li> <li>Periods, question marks, exclamation points, quotation marks, and commas in most text</li> </ul> |
